In pursuance of the power and authority vested in me as such Governor as aforesaid, by virtue of the act intituled "*An Act to confer a Constitution on New South Wales and to grant a Civil List to Her Majesty,*" as assented to by her Majesty under the authority of the act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the session of the eighteenth and nineteenth years of the reign of her said Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to enable Her Majesty to assent to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of New South Wales to confer a Constitution on New South Wales and to grant a Civil List to Her Majesty,*"—I do hereby proclaim that a session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly for the colony of New South Wales, for the despatch of business, shall commence and be holden on Wednesday, the twenty-seventh day of February instant, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the buildings known as the Legislative Council Chambers, in Macquarie-street, in the city of Sydney; and the members of the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal, at Government House, Sydney, this fifth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and in the fifty-second year of her Majesty's reign.

# PUBLIC STATUTES OF THE SESSION.

FOURTEENTH PARLIAMENT—FIRST SESSION.

## APPROPRIATION ACT (53 Vic. No. 22)—

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the Year 1889, and for the Year 1888 and previous Years. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. McMillan, 5 October, 1889. Assented to, 10 October, 1889.]

## AUBURN RAILWAY LEVEL CROSSING CLOSING ACT (54 Vic. No. 17)—

An Act to enable the Railway Commissioners of New South Wales to close a certain Level Crossing near Auburn Railway-station. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. McMillan, 18 September, 1889. Assented to 30 September, 1889.]

## BLACKFRIARS AND SHEPHERD'S NURSERY ESTATES ACT (53 Vic. No. 8)—

An Act to remove doubts as to the power of the Municipal Council of the City of Sydney to take over certain Streets and Lanes as formed or laid out under the subdivision of the Blackfriars Estate and on portion of the Shepherd's Nursery Estate. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Edmunds, 13 June, 1889. Assented to, 12 September, 1889.]

## CHURCH AND SCHOOL LANDS MINING ACT (53 Vic. No. 4)—

An Act to provide for the payment of Rent and Royalties, and the imposition of certain conditions in connection therewith, upon the leasing of Church and School Lands; to authorise the renewals of such Leases; to regulate Authorities and Applications for such Leases; and to amend in certain respects the "Church and School Lands Dedication Act, 1880," and the "Church and School Lands Mining Act." [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Carruthers, 11 April, 1889. Assented to, 23 July, 1889.]

## CIRCULAR QUAY IMPROVEMENTS ACT (52 Vic. No. 20)—

An Act to sanction the carrying out of certain Improvements to the Circular Quay, Sydney. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Bruce Smith, 4 April, 1889. Assented to, 30 April, 1889.]

## CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND ACT (52 Vic. No. 21)—

An Act to amend the "Crown Lands Act of 1884," and to make provision in other respects for the management and disposal of the Public Lands, and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Bruncker, 10 April, 1889. Assented to, 1 October, 1889.]

## ESSEX-STREET ALIGNMENT ACT (53 Vic. No. 14)—

An Act to declare valid an amended alignment of Essex-street, in the City of Sydney. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Playfair, 31 May, 1889. Assented to, 30 September, 1889.]

## GENERAL POST OFFICE (APPROACHES IMPROVEMENT) ACT (53 Vic. No. 13)—

An Act to authorise the resumption of certain portions of Land situate between George and Pitt Streets, in the City of Sydney, for the purpose of improving the approaches to the General Post Office, for the disposal of portion of the Land so to be resumed, together with part of the site of the Tank Stream; and for other purposes in connection therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. D. O'Connor, 27 June, 1889. Assented to, 27 September, 1889.]



**INTERCOLONIAL DEBTS ACT (52 Vic. No. 23)—**

An Act to facilitate the Recovery of Judgments against Debtors who have removed into adjacent Colonies, and the enforcement of Judgments obtained in such Colonies against Debtors who have removed therefrom into New South Wales. [Initiated in the Council by Mr. Simpson, 4 April, 1889. Assented to, 30 May, 1889.]

**LOAN ACT (53 Vic. No. 23)—**

An Act to authorise the raising of a Loan for the Public Service of the Colony, and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. McMillan, 9 October, 1889. Assented to, 10 October, 1889.]

**MANLY DRAINAGE WORKS ACT (53 Vic. No. 7)—**

An Act to sanction the carrying out of certain Drainage Works at Manly, in the County of Cumberland. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Bruce Smith, 4 April, 1889. Assented to, 12 September, 1889.]

**METROPOLITAN WATER AND SEWERAGE ACT AMENDMENT ACT, No. 2 (53 Vic. No. 16)—**

An Act to make further provision for carrying out and completing the Approved Scheme of Sewerage authorised by the "Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Act of 1880"; to provide for the valuation and crediting of Sewerage Works constructed by Municipal Councils in certain cases; to make special provision in the case of the Municipality of Redfern; and to amend the said Act in certain respects for the better carrying out of the approved and other schemes of Water Supply, and Sewerage thereby authorised; for the making of fresh assessments, and for providing for appeals therefrom in certain cases; for simplifying the recovery of rates and other moneys by the Board; for increasing the rate of remuneration paid to the Board; and for other purposes.
