ADULTERATION OF LIQUORS ACT (63 VIC. No. 22)—

An Act to consolidate certain Acts relating to the adulteration of liquors. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. J. Hughes, 10 August, 1899. Assented to, 20 November, 1899.]

APPROPRIATION ACT (63 VIC. No. 43)—

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1899, to the 30th day of June, 1900, inclusive of both dates, and to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1898-9," for supplementary charges during the period from the 1st day of July, 1898, to the 30th day of June, 1899, inclusive of both dates; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. CROWN LANDS AMENDMENT ACT (63 VIC. No. 51)—

An Act to amend the law relating to the sale and leasing, disposal, and management of Crown lands; to provide for the determination of the capital value of land under conditional purchase, conditional lease, homestead selection or settlement lease, and for regulating payments in respect of such land on the basis of such value; and for the reappraisal of the rents of conditional leases; to provide for the enclosure of roads and water-courses; and in certain respects to amend the Crown Lands Acts. DUBBO TO COONAMBLE RAILWAY ACT (63 VIC. No. 35)—

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Dubbo to Coonamble, provided that before commencing the said work certain land required is contracted to be conveyed to the Crown, or an indemnity is given for the cost of resuming the same; to amend the provisions of the Public Works Act of 1888, so far as they relate to the duty of the constructing authority to make and maintain fences along the said line of railway; to authorise the construction of the said line on certain public roads; and for other purposes. EARLY-CLOSING ACT (63 VIC. No. 38)—

An Act for the early closing of shops and to regulate the hours of employment in shops. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Lyne, 26 October, 1899. Assented to, 22 December, 1899.]

FACTORS ACT (63 VIC. No. 28)—

GOULBURN TO CROOKWELL RAILWAY ACT (63 VIC. No. 37)—

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Goulburn to Crookwell, provided that before commencing the said work certain land required is contracted to be conveyed to the Crown; to amend the provisions of the Public Works Act of 1888, so far as they relate to the duty of the constructing authority to make and maintain fences along the said line of railway; to authorise the construction of the said line on public roads; and for other purposes.
