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PRESIDENT, MR. (THE HON. SIR JOHN BEVERLEY REDEN, K.C.M.G., K.C.), RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF:

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Meat Industry: A motion for the second reading of the Meat Industry Bill having been amended to refer the bill to a select committee, and put in that form to the House, it was only then that there could be said to be before the House a motion for the appointment of a select committee, and it was therefore competent at that stage for the House to require a ballot for the appointment of the members of such select committee in accordance with standing order 236, 3118.

Reform of the Legislative Council: The ruling of the Chairman, namely, that upon clause 2 of the Constitution Amendment (Legislative Council) Bill, which provided for submission to a referendum of the question of the re-constitution of the Legislative Council, an amendment to submit also the question of the abolition of the Council was out of order as infringing standing order 175, in that it introduced a matter incompatible with the principle of the bill—must stand, in that, first, the amendment was not relevant; second, that it reversed the principle of a bill as affirmed upon its second reading; and third, that the title of the bill could not be so amended as to introduce a matter subversive of the principle adopted at the second reading, 517.

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
