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*Accuracy of Statements during Debate:*

It is not the duty of the chair to decide whether a statement made during the course of debate is correct, or incorrect. Nor, if a statement made in good faith by an hon. member happens to be incorrect, is it the Speaker's duty to interrupt the debate to make a correction. If a member makes an incorrect statement other members, from the floor of the House, have the opportunity to challenge it, and to support their action by documentary evidence. However, it is the duty of the Speaker to prevent irrelevance and tedious repetition, 823, 875.

*Australian Manhood: Ideals: Ministerial Statement:* The practice in respect of a ministerial statement is that only the leader of the Opposition has the right to speak to it. A private member may make a personal explanation, 1875.

*"Century" Newspaper Statement:* A motion standing in the name of the hon. member for Yass was withdrawn in a regular and orderly manner, and the withdrawal is recorded in the Parliamentary records, *q.*, 769.

*Constitution (Legislative Council Reform) Bill:* In a second reading debate an hon. member is entitled to use reasonable arguments that are relevant to the subject under discussion, but nothing more. Reference may be made to Acts of Parliament which, however, may not be discussed in detail, 803, 804.

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It is not in order, on the motion for the adjournment of the House, for an hon. member to object to a ruling by the Chairman of Committees, in Committee of the whole. The prescribed procedure is for the hon. member concerned to move dissent from the Chairman's ruling with a view to enabling the House to resume in order that the question may be resolved, 985.
