Interjections, Interruptions and Disorder: Member called to order by name: Mr O'Neill, 2417, 3335; Mr Paciullo, 3335.

Offensive and Objectionable Remarks, Imputations and Aspersions: The following expressions were required to be withdrawn: "You would not even attend your own daughter's wedding, you hypocrite", 2415; and "You are a liar", 2415.

Procedure: A member was asked to resume his seat, 2496.

Relevance: Members must direct their remarks to the question before the Chair, 2496, 4434.

A member was asked to clarify a statement, 2415.

DEPUTY-SPEAKER (T. J. CAHILL, ESQ.):

Chair: A member disregarded a ruling from the Chair and was directed to resume his seat, 4898.

Documents: A member may not quote at length from a newspaper article or editorial but may make brief reference to and give a summary of the contents of such an article, 1593.

A member wishing to quote from a document should identify the author of the document and give the address from which it was sent, 4353.

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Hansard: The Standing Orders contain no provision for expunging material from *Hansard*, 4354.

Interjections, Interruptions and Disorder: Interruptions are disorderly, 1095, 1119, 1483, 1784; and disrupt the debate, 1095.

The following members were called to order by name: Mr Armstrong, 1119; 4603; Mr Boyd, 441, 2093; Mr Brewer, 691; Mr J. H. Brown, 1484; Mr McCarthy, 691; Mr McIlwaine, 5009; Dr Metherell, 4890, 4891; Mr Punch, 4188, 4600; Mr Singleton, 2092, 3186.

Members were asked to cease interjecting, 1483, 1784, 2091, 4899.

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Members were asked to reduce the level of conversation, 3198.

A member was warned that should he continue to interject he would be removed from the Chamber, 4890.

Offensive and Objectionable Remarks, Imputations and Aspersions: A member may not be asked to withdraw a comment that was not heard by the Chair and the interjecting member denies making the statement to which exception is taken, 1867.

Points of Order: Upheld, 440, 1328, 1593, 4354; upheld in part, 4592; disallowed, 440, 1119; not involved, 3032.

Procedure: Members must refer to other members by their correct titles, 440.

A member wishing to contribute to a debate should seek the call, 691, 1095, 1245, 3752, 4448, 4492, 4603, 4747.

A member was asked to identify the author of a letter from which he was quoting, 1009.

A member was asked whether he had concluded his speech, 1867.

A member was directed to resume his seat, 4898.

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Members were asked to consider the possibility of amending the procedure for dealing with the Appropriation Bill, 2188.

Relevance: A member must confine his remarks to the question before the Chair, 1119, 1328, 4592, 5010; keep within the order of leave, 1333, 1337, 1339, 4897; and not dwell on one particular incident, 1328; but may make passing reference to other matters, 1339.

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A member was asked to confine his remarks to the question before the Chair, 2195, 2218, 2299, 2387, 3193; and warned that if he did not do so he would be required to resume his seat, 4897, 5011.

Adjournment: A member speaking to the motion for the adjournment of the House may raise one specific matter of local or general interest to his electorate, 1513, 1514, 2422, 5637.

On the adjournment debate a member who has contributed to the Address-in-Reply debate may raise a matter of strictly local concern, with narrow implications, 597; and may deal with that matter as he sees fit, subject to the normal rules of debate, 598.

When the Minister who moved the adjournment of the House has replied the debate is concluded, 1514.

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Adjournment (S.O. 49): A member may refute a statement made in debating a motion for the adjournment of the House, and may give reasons for so doing, 4221.

A member may reply to matters raised in debate, 4222.

Standing Order 49 is not designed to permit a member who cannot bring a matter before the House by some other means, such as by way of the adjournment debate or urgency, to take control of the House, 4046.

A motion must not include matters of argument, 4220.

A motion must concern a matter not merely of local importance but of such significance that it affects the whole State, 4046.

The subject of the motion must be of overriding urgency to the State and not merely of regional urgency, 2755.

A motion under Standing Order 49 will be disallowed if it is likely that an early opportunity will occur to debate the subject matter of the motion, 2755.

In reply, a member must limit his remarks to answering the contribution made by the Minister, 2099.

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Motion ruled out of order, 2362, 2755, 4046, 4753.

Special Adjournment: A member is limited in the remarks he may make when speaking to the special adjournment, 2610, 3903.

A member speaking to a special adjournment motion cannot attempt to censure another member, 5614.

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Assembly, Legislative: Rulings, Observations and Opinions of Chair (continued):

SPEAKER, MR (THE HON. LAWRENCE BORTHWICK KELLY) (continued):

A member may reply to statements made by the mover of the motion, 5615; and other members, 5616; but may not mount an attack upon another member, 5615; or speak to a debate already concluded, 5624.

A matter debated the previous day cannot be debated on a special adjournment motion, 3904, 3905, 3906, 3907.

It has been the practice to allow a member addressing himself to a special adjournment motion to raise matters he believes warrant special mention, but he may not debate them, 3903, 3907, 3929.

Chair: A member may not reflect upon the Chair, 705, 5623; question the Chair, 1984; defy a ruling from the Chair, 3907, 5615; or canvass a ruling from the Chair, 3991.

A member who disobeys a direction of the Chair is disorderly and may be named, 1984, 5553.

The Chair does not need instruction from members on the Opposition benches, 3663.

Condolence: Dwyer, Kevin Edward, a former member of the Legislative Assembly, 601.

Debate: A member must expect to be subjected to forthright criticism, 165, 2757.

A member may defend himself and a person outside the House against accusations levelled at them, 165, 5619.

A member may refer to copious notes to assist him in his speech, 775, 1576.

A member may comment upon remarks made by a Minister in moving a motion, 1980; and may make passing reference to actions of the Government, 1983.

The Standing Orders provide that the Speaker may direct the attention of the House to tedious repetition by a member and may direct him to discontinue, provided the member has the right to require the Speaker to put the question that that member be not further heard, 4968.

A member was asked whether he had contributed to a debate, 1971.

Distinguished Visitors: The Hon. Mr Gangadhar, Minister for Youth and Community Services, Indian State of Karnataka, 1640.

Divisions: The Standing Orders apply with the same force during divisions as at other times, 5608.

Documents: A private member may not table documents, 1244, 3657.

Assembly, Legislative: Rulings, Observations and Opinions of Chair (continued):

SPEAKER, MR (THE HON. LAWRENCE BORTHWICK KELLY) (continued):

It is not necessary for a Minister who quotes from confidential documents to make them available to members, 1700; or to table official documents, 4171.

Hansard: In special cases with the approval of the Speaker and provided there is no objection from any member, relevant material of a statistical nature may be incorporated in *Hansard*; but before being tendered, the material should be produced to the Speaker in his room for examination, 1599.

Hansard reporters would be assisted in recording the proceedings if members desisted from making undue noise, 2098.

A high level of audible conversation in the Chamber makes it extremely difficult for *Hansard* reporters to hear the proceedings, 5600.

Interjections, Interruptions and Disorder: A member is entitled to be heard in silence, 161, 165, 865, 1246, 1259, 1309, 1391, 2098, 2099, 2295, 2523, 2751, 2961, 3659, 3987, 3988, 4326, 4452.

The House would proceed more expeditiously with its business if members were to stop interjecting, 3661.

A lively and robust Parliament is a natural consequence of a living, vibrant democracy, but it is essential that a fair hearing be guaranteed to every member, 754.

Interjections are disorderly, 542, 605, 1245, 2351, 2757, 2961, 3224; and a member who continually interjects is guilty of disorderly conduct, 1246, 1658, 2113, 3141; and may be removed from the Chamber, 616, 1329, 2351, 2352, 4642.

Standing Order 166 provides that no member shall converse aloud, or make any noise or disturbance whilst any member is debating, or whilst any bill, order, or other matter is being read or opened; and in case of such noise or disturbance being persisted in after the Speaker has called to order, such member shall be deemed guilty of disorderly conduct, 5604.

All members must expect to be the target of rugged and forthright criticism, especially when another member is replying to statements made by them. This is to be expected in the thrust and parry of debate, 3663, 4453; and members should be able to feel at the end of the day that something has been achieved, but that will not be possible if interjections continue from both sides of the House, 3663.

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Assembly, Legislative: Rulings, Observations and Opinions of Chair (*continued*):

SPEAKER, MR (THE HON. LAWRENCE BORTHWICK KELLY) (*continued*):

A general exhortation to order is directed to all members, and a member who offends subsequently may be dealt with without further warning, and the Serjeant-at-Arms directed to remove him from the Chamber, 4642.

It is not incumbent on the Chair to call a member to order by name, 144, 385; and when the Chair has delivered a general exhortation to order, subsequent disorder may result in the offending member being removed without further warning, 144, 385, 2099, 2961, 3141.

The Chair will not tolerate inane interjections, 1329.

Visitors to Parliament would wish to see members conduct themselves in a proper manner, 754.

Government supporters were warned that should they continue to interject the provisions of Standing Order 387 would be applied, 5352.

Members on the Government benches were asked to allow the Leader of the Opposition to be heard in silence, 3661.

Members were warned that if they interjected again they would be named, 3650, 3663.

Interjectors were removed from the public gallery, 43.

Grievance Debate: A member may raise only one matter of particular concern to him or his electorate, 2001.

A member may raise a matter that is the subject of a notice of motion, 5125.

A member was ruled out of order, 5125.

Judiciary: A member may in good faith criticize any member of the judiciary provided no imputations of improper motives are made and the criticism is not malicious or an attempt to impair the administration of justice, 2645.

A member may not make an attack upon judges, except by way of substantive motion, 2645; but their judgments may be discussed and criticized, 2645.

Judges are immune from attack in respect of their non-judicial acts, but members are allowed latitude in debate to criticize judgments, decisions and public acts, 2645.

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Assembly, Legislative: Rulings, Observations and Opinions of Chair (continued):

SPEAKER, MR (THE HON. LAWRENCE BORTHWICK KELLY) (continued):

Ministerial Statements: The Chair declined to follow a previous ruling, 2954.

Motions: A motion cannot be moved twice during the same debate, 5606.

Leave not granted to move motion, 3664, 4966.

Offensive and Objectionable Remarks, Imputations and Aspersions: A member shall not use offensive or unbecoming words in reference to another member, 3932, 5616; reflect upon another member, 1694, 3660, 3932; or make imputations of improper conduct against another member, 2761, 3932; except by way of substantive motion, 5614.

The terms or expressions, "You are a liar", or "You are telling lies", are unparliamentary and will be required to be withdrawn, 164; but if a member claims that statements are filthy lies, or a pack of lies, or lies, that is not considered unparliamentary, 5610.

A member was asked to withdraw a reference to a Minister as a liar, 164; the expression "You are a liar", 758, 3141, 3469; and the expression "hiding behind Mr Speaker's Chair", 1694.

A member was asked whether he had made a particular comment, and his denial was accepted, 164.

A member was asked to withdraw a remark made about another member, 3662.

Parliament: Parliament is the supreme inquest of the State, 1984.

Personal Explanations: Personal explanations must be brief, 3662, 4965; and must state how the member's character has been impugned or his position as a member of Parliament has been in some way interfered with, 5610.

A member must take the first opportunity to make a personal explanation, 249, 5610.

A member may make a personal explanation only at the appropriate time, 3657, 4961, 5610.

A member must seek and obtain the indulgence of the House to make a personal explanation, 705, 2614, 3663, 5607, 5612.

A member may not seek to introduce matter not raised in the statement upon which he is making a personal explanation, 3662.

A member may not, under the guise of making a personal explanation, ask for a withdrawal of remarks made earlier, 5610; or debate other issues, 5612.

A member was ruled out of order, 5611.

The House was asked to listen to a personal explanation, 3660.

Leave to make a personal explanation not granted, 2280, 2540, 2614, 2763, 3663.

Points of Order: A motion that a member be not further heard, may not be directed at a member speaking to a point of order, 2758.

A member was asked whether he was speaking to a point of order, 1257, 4453; to speak to the point of order, 2168, 2758, 3991, 4753, 4967, 5603, 5604; and to clarify a point of order, 2422, 5308.

Privilege: Freedom of speech under privilege is the right of every member and it is subject only to observance of the forms and practices of the House. A member who abuses that right does so at his own risk and at the risk of incurring not only the displeasure of the public but also the censure of the House itself. It is not for the Chair to take action against him, 1261.

A member wishing to speak to privilege must satisfy the Chair that the matter complained of could, fairly and reasonably, be capable of interfering with the member in

the performance of his duties, 3465; and must raise the matter at the time of the incident, 5614, 5615.

A member was denied the opportunity to speak to privilege, 3465.

Procedure: A member contributing to a second reading debate must speak to the bill or debate matters raised in the Minister's speech, 257, 856, 948; and he may quote from the bill, 257; or deal generally with the principles of the bill, 856, 949; but may not deal with it clause by clause, 257, 949.

A member speaking after an amendment is proposed is held to have spoken to the main question as well as to the amendment, and he may not, after such amendment has been disposed of, speak to the main question again or second another amendment, 263.

A member wishing to contribute to a debate or the address the Speaker should seek the call, 691, 705, 1095, 1245, 3657, 3841, 4179, 4271, 4448, 4492, 4566, 4603, 4747.

A member may provide information but may not table documents, 1244.

Members should always endeavour to debate matters that are factual, 4220.

Certain matters cannot be debated, save upon a substantive motion which admits of a distinct vote of the House, 3932.

The House will interfere to prevent the prosecution of any quarrel between members, arising out of debates or proceedings of the House, or any committee thereof, 3932.

Matters concerning members personally may be raised only by way of substantive motion, 3932, 3998.

Parliamentary practice makes no provision for members to decline nomination to or resign from, membership of a select committee, 5529.

The main reason a Minister usually occupies the chair at the table of the House is to move that the services of a member who has been named should be dispensed with for the rest of the day, 1087.

A motion that a member be not further heard, may not be directed at a member speaking to a point of order, 2758.

A member was ruled out of order, 3662; and asked to resume his seat, 1189, 2045, 2099, 2113, 3662, 3905.

A ballot for election of members of a select committee will be conducted, 5530, 5609.

Assembly, Legislative: Rulings, Observations and Opinions of Chair (*continued*):

SPEAKER, MR (THE HON. LAWRENCE BORTHWICK KELLY) (*continued*):

Members were asked to stand in tribute to those who made the supreme sacrifice in war, 2597.

A Minister was requested to follow the correct procedure in relation to a bill under discussion, 1449.

A member had exhausted his time, 160, 207, 451, 620, 633, 779, 817, 842, 1137, 1218, 1368, 1579, 1694, 1910, 2424, 2759, 2762, 3036, 3043, 3759, 4222, 4595, 5227.

Debate interrupted pursuant to Standing Order 122A, 2012, 4317, 5126.

Leave not granted, 386, 706, 762, 845, 1448, 2516, 3664.

Questions upon Notice: At the conclusion of question time, a Minister may answer a question upon notice, 930.

Questions without Notice: So long as a Minister's remarks are relevant the Chair has no control over the manner in which he answers a question, 145; or the length of his answer, 2168.

A Minister may bring information or material into the House in anticipation of a question, 2955; and to assist him in answering a question, 378.

A Minister may use written material in answering a question, 5234.

Standing Order 78 requires a Minister to be relevant when answering a question, 378; though he may not debate the question, 2169.

A Minister when answering a question does not need assistance from other members, 239, 605; but should not debate interjections, 2956.

A Minister must be heard in silence when answering a question, 136, 1309, 2961, 4326.

A question should be brief, 1075, 4327, 4404, 4954; and should press for information, 613, 4327.

Members of the Select Committee on Parliamentary Questions of Session 1971-72 expressed their concern that the cumulative effect of previous decisions relating to the orderliness of questions should not be allowed to become unduly restrictive. They therefore recommended that, while the Speaker should continue to have regard to the basic rules concerning the form and content of questions he should not consider himself bound, when interpreting those rules, to disallow a question solely on the ground that it conflicts with any previous individual ruling, 3651.

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Assembly, Legislative: Rulings, Observations and Opinions of Chair (*continued*):SPEAKER, MR (THE HON. LAWRENCE BORTHWICK KELLY) (*continued*):

The content of a question must comply with the general rules which apply to the content of speeches and is subject to detailed limitations, 3651.

The purpose of a question is to obtain information; it should not be limited to giving information, or framed so as to suggest its own answer or convey a particular point of view, and it should not be in effect a short speech. Questions of excessive length have not been permitted, 3651.

The Chair is not bound by previous rulings concerning the answering of questions, 3648.

It does not follow that a simple question requires a brief answer, 615.

A member may not ask a series of questions, 4327, 4499.

A member may not cross-examine a Minister, 1309.

A member who asks a question should listen to the answer in silence, 1655, 4565.

A member may not ask a question similar to one already on the *Questions and Answers* paper, 5500.

Questions should not provide too much information, 4404.

Questions asked of Ministers must not be of a personal nature, 3932.

Questions about matters connected with Mr Speaker in his private capacity as a member of Parliament, should be discussed with him in his Chambers, 3839.

Questions addressed to the Chair should be concerned with the proceedings of the House, 3839.

More members would be able to ask questions if there were fewer interjections, 610.

It has always been accepted that Parliament will respect the *sub judice* rule and will not allow to be canvassed matters that might have the effect of influencing a jury, 1960.

When the question of *sub judice* arises debate may be allowed to proceed until it becomes clear that a member is seeking to discuss a specific matter that is before a court, 1984, 2360; though a member is not precluded from mentioning a particular case, 1984.

Whenever damage may be occasioned by reason of debate on a matter before a court, the Chair may intercede, even though a point of order has not been taken, 2361.

A matter may be discussed to a point where it would cause damage or mischief in a case before the court, 2759.

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SPEAKER, MR (THE HON. LAWRENCE BORTHWICK KELLY) (*continued*):
