*(Resolution.)*

£15,000 for Secretary for Lands—Miscellaneous Services—Towards the Purchase, Acquisition, or Resumption of sites for Public Parks, Resumption of Foreshores, and other Public purposes, and expenses in connection therewith, £13,000; For Construction of Roads, Water Conservation, and otherwise improving lands for settlement, £2,000;

## SAME BILL.

*Acquisition of wheat.*Notification  
that wheat is  
acquired by  
Crown.

Clause 3. (1) The Governor, by notification published in the Gazette, may declare that any wheat therein described or referred to is acquired by His Majesty.

Wheat to vest in  
His Majesty.

In such notification it shall be sufficient to describe the wheat so acquired as wheat in a certain locality or "place" or owned by or in control or disposal of a certain person, or in any other manner by which the wheat may be identified.

Evidence.

(2) Upon such publication the wheat shall become the absolute property of "His Majesty," freed from all mortgages, charges, liens, pledges, interests and trusts affecting the same, and the rights and interests of every person in the wheat at the date of such publication shall be taken to be converted into a claim for compensation in pursuance of the provisions of this "Act."

Notice to board  
and owners.

(3) The production of a copy of the Gazette containing any such notification shall be conclusive evidence that on the date appearing on such copy the wheat therein described or referred to was the absolute property of His Majesty.

The compensation to be paid for any wheat acquired by the Government under this Act shall "be" "five shillings" per bushel for wheat of fair average quality delivered by the owner or person having the disposal of the wheat at the nearest railway station or at a place determined by the person authorised as aforesaid by the Minister: Provided that such place shall not be more than one mile further than such railway station from the place from which the wheat is to be carried.

Provided that only half such amount shall be payable on any motor vehicle proved, to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Traffic, to be—

a motor car used by a legally qualified medical practitioner principally for the purposes of his profession; or  
a public motor car, except a taxi-cab; or  
a trade motor vehicle.

For the purposes of this resolution:—

"Motor car" means motor vehicle constructed to be used principally for the carriage of persons, and having not less than four wheels.

"Motor cycle" means motor vehicle having less than four wheels.

"Motor vehicle" means motor car, motor cycle, or other vehicle under five tons unladen propelled wholly or partly by any volatile spirit, or by electricity, but does not include a vehicle used on a railway or tramway.

"Public motor car" means motor car used for the conveyance of passengers each of whom pays a separate fare.

"Taxi-cab" means motor car plying or standing in a public street for hire, not being a public motor car.

"Trade motor vehicle" means motor vehicle constructed to be used principally for the carriage of goods.

And the horse-power of a motor vehicle propelled by volatile spirit shall be determined by squaring the measurement in inches of the internal diameter of the cylinder of the engine, multiplying the number so found by the number of cylinders, and dividing the product by 2.5.

(2) The Board may, after due inquiry, cancel the indentures of any child so apprenticed at the request of the employer or if it is of opinion that the moral or physical well-being of such child is likely to be impaired by continuance in such apprenticeship, and may thereupon arrange that such child be removed to a home or institution for the purpose of being trained.

11B. Any child absconding from any home or institution wherein he has been placed under order of the Board, may be dealt with as a "neglected child" under the provisions of the Neglected Children and Juvenile Offenders Act, 1905: Provided that child in this section means any person under eighteen years of age. Children absconding from homes or institutions. [Read.]

“Board” means the State Provident Fund Management Board constituted by this Act.
