NEW AND AMENDED STANDING ORDERS:—

Certain Standing Orders having been agreed to as amended.—

CLOSURE—RIGHT OF REPLY.

Standing Order 175. At any time during the proceedings of the House, or during the proceedings of a Committee of the Whole, any Member may move, without notice or debate, "That the Question be now put"; "and" such motion shall then be put without debate, but shall not be decided in the affirmative unless **no division is called for** or by a vote of at least thirty Members in favour thereof, and if such motion be carried, the Speaker or Chairman of Committees, as the case may be, shall forthwith put the Question to the vote: Provided that, whenever it is decided that any Question shall be put, the mover of the matter pending shall be permitted to speak in reply (where any reply is allowed) for thirty minutes, **except as provided in Rule 49c**, before the Question be put. (*Proposed.*)

Motion made (*Mr. McTiernan*) to insert in line 3 after the word "and" the words "unless it shall appear to the Speaker or Chairman of Committees, as the case may be, that such motion is an abuse of the rules of the House or an infringement of the rights of the minority."

Point of Order.—*Mr. J. C. L. Fitzpatrick* submitted that the amendment was out of order as the Committee could only deal with the amendments as submitted by the House.

The Chairman upheld the Point of Order and ruled the amendment out of order.

Mr. McTiernan moved, That the Chairman leave the Chair to report a Point of Order, and ask leave to sit again, so soon as the Point of Order has been decided by the House—

The Point of Order is,—

(1.) That the Chairman was in error in ruling that the Honorable Member *Mr. McTiernan's* amendment could not be proposed to Standing Order 175.

(2.) That the Chairman was in error in ruling that amendments must be confined to proposed amendments as outlined in Notice of Motion No. 2 of Government business.—

(c) In all other industries—

Subject to the provisions of this section the ordinary working hours shall not exceed—

- (1) eight hours per day on six consecutive days;
- (2) forty-eight hours per week; or
- (3) ninety-six hours in fourteen consecutive days,

as may be determined by award or industrial agreement or agreement filed under section forty-one of the Principal Act.

(d) "Overtime" may be permitted by the terms of any award or industrial agreement or agreement filed under section forty-one of the Principal Act, and shall be paid at a rate to be fixed by the court or a board or by industrial agreement or agreement filed as aforesaid.

(e) The ordinary working hours in any industry and the number of days upon which they are to be worked may be "increased" beyond those limited in this section if the court or a board is of opinion that the public interest requires that such increase should be allowed.

Provided, however, that no such increase shall be allowed by the court unless the court is satisfied that the health or well-being of the employees will not be injured thereby.

(f) The court or a board may reduce the ordinary working hours below the number of hours specified in this section if the court or board is of opinion that the health, comfort, or well-being of employees in an industry require, justify a reduction of the ordinary working hours in that industry, or in the case of any industry in which prior to the twenty-ninth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, the ordinary working hours had been fixed by award or industrial agreement or well-established practice below the number of hours specified in this section.

(2) None of the provisions of the third section of this Act shall be deemed or construed to extend or relate to any such lottery or raffle at a bazaar or fancy fair as is authorised by this section. [Read].

 - (d) one-third of the cost of the maintenance of the main bridge, exclusive of the railway tracks,—

(2) The cost of the maintenance of the railway approaches to the main bridge and of maintenance of the railway tracks on such approaches and bridge, together with two-thirds of the cost of maintenance of the main bridge other than the cost of the maintenance and lighting of the roadways and footway on such bridge, shall be paid by the Railway Commissioners for New South Wales. Exemptions :—Every affidavit or statutory declaration—

- (a) Filed, read, or used in any Court, or before any Judge, Master, Registrar, Clerk, or Officer of any Court ;
- (b) Required for the assessment of duty or otherwise under this Act, or under the Income Tax Acts ;
- (c) Required by law ;
- (d) Made for the purpose of the celebration of a marriage or the registration of a birth, death, or marriage ;
- (e) Required to be made by any officer of the Government in respect of any matters relating to the duties of his office ;
- (f) Required by the Public Trustee in proof of the claim by any person to be a beneficiary under the will, or one of the next of kin of a deceased person whose estate is being administered by the Public Trustee ;
- (g) Required to be made in proof of the loss of any property of a value not exceeding £2, or of the ticket or receipt given in respect of the bailment for valuable consideration of any property of a value not exceeding £2 ;
- (h) Required by an insurance company in proof of the death of the holder of a policy of insurance on life ;
- (i) Made by an officer of a public hospital for any purpose connected with the administration of the hospital ;
- (j) Comprised in a form of application to be registered as proprietor by transmission, or to bring land under the Real Property Act, "1900" ;
- (k) Made for the purpose of obtaining payment of a pension or retiring allowance ;
- (l) Made in connection with applications for relief or payments or other matters under the State Children Relief Act, 1901. [*Read.*]

The Board of Trade shall at such times as the Board may think fit, but at intervals of not less than three months, after public inquiry as to the increase or decrease in the average cost of living declare what shall for the purpose of this Act be the living wages for adult male and adult female employees in the State or any defined area thereof.

(2.) No industrial agreement shall be entered into and no award made for wages lower than such living wages.

(3.) If it is proved to the Court—

(a) by the production of books used in connection with the carrying on of an industry and by other evidence produced or tendered subject *mutatis mutandis* to the provisions and restrictions contained in section thirty-four (c) that serious unemployment in an industry has resulted or will result from the operation of an award or industrial agreement; or

(b) that the employees in an industry or the employees of any employer therein are or may become entitled to any benefit or payment under any profit sharing or co-partnership scheme,

the court upon being satisfied that it is in the best interests of the employees so to do, may, either absolutely or upon terms—

(a) refrain from making any award; or

(b) rescind or cancel any award or industrial agreement; or

(c) exempt from the provisions of an award or industrial agreement any employers who are or may be entitled to any benefit or payment under any profit sharing or co-partnership scheme and their employer. [*Read.*]

(d) by inserting in subsection two of section 14A after the word "shall" the words "prior to the thirtieth day of June in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and thereafter before the same date in each second year"; [Read.]

(1) The provisions of section twelve of the Principal Act shall apply to any workman who was in the employment of a mine-owner for any time during the period of twelve months preceding the thirty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and who, prior to that date, had been employed for not less than one thousand two hundred and fifty shifts in or upon Broken Hill mines, notwithstanding that he may not have been employed in any such mine within twelve months previous to the date of his disablement if the board certifies that,—

- (i) the said workman is suffering from lead poisoning, and is thereby disabled from earning full wages at the work at which he was employed; or
- (ii) the death of such workman has been caused by lead poisoning:

Provided that—

- (a) the compensation shall be recoverable from and notice of death or disablement shall be given to the mine-owner who last employed the workman during the said one thousand two hundred and fifty shifts; and the notice may be given notwithstanding that the workman has voluntarily left his employment;
- (b) in the case of death or disablement occurring before the commencement of this Act, any such notice shall be valid if given within six months after such commencement.

(2) In determining the amount of compensation to be paid to any workman entitled to claim under this section—

- (i) subparagraph (a) of paragraph one of Schedule One of the Principal Act shall be read as if the words "prior to the thirty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen" were inserted in lieu of "next preceding the injury"; and
- (ii) subparagraph (b) of paragraph one of Schedule One shall be read as if the words "twelve months prior to the thirty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen" were inserted in lieu of the words "previous twelve months."

Clause 8. (1) If the board, after examination, certifies that a workman who has been employed in or upon a Broken Hill mine, and who has been disabled by lead poisoning, is physically fit to return to employment in or upon a Broken Hill mine his right to compensation shall cease unless the mine-owner who last employed him before the commencement of the disablement refuses to re-employ or continue to employ or dismisses the said workman for the reason that the workman has been disabled by lead poisoning.

(2) Any mine-owner who for the reason that a workman has been disabled by lead poisoning—

(a) refuses to employ or continue to employ a workman who has been disabled by lead poisoning, and subsequently certified as fit to return to employment in or upon a Broken Hill mine; or

(b) dismisses a workman who has been employed or continued in employment after disablement and subsequent certification of fitness as aforesaid,

shall, unless compensation is paid as prescribed by section nine, be guilty of an offence against this Act and be liable to a penalty not exceeding “one” hundred pounds.

(3) In every case under this section it shall lie on the mine-owner to satisfy the arbitrator or the court that such workman was refused re-employment or continuance of employment or was dismissed from his employment for some reasonable cause other than that he had been disabled by lead poisoning. [*Read.*]

Clause 9. (1.) A workman who is withdrawn or excluded from employment in or upon the Broken Hill mines either— Withdrawal or exclusion from employment in B. H. mines.

(a) consequent upon the issue of a certificate by the board under subsection three of section four; or

(b) by the unlawful refusal of a mine-owner to re-employ or to continue to employ or by the unlawful dismissal of such a workman who has been disabled by lead poisoning and subsequently certified as fit to return to employment in or upon a Broken Hill mine, Refusal to re-employ workman after certified fit.

shall be entitled to compensation not exceeding an amount according to the length of his service in or upon such mines as prescribed in the following scale:—

Not more than "ten" years' service, a sum not "exceeding" fifty pounds.

Over ten years and not more than twenty years, a sum not exceeding two hundred pounds, Compensation scale on withdrawal.

Over twenty years and not more than thirty years, a sum not exceeding three hundred pounds.

Over thirty years, a sum not exceeding four hundred pounds.

Any year in which a workman has worked not less than one hundred and seventy-five shifts in or upon a Broken Hill mine shall be deemed to be a year's service by such workman for the purpose of this section.

(2.) The amount payable under this section shall in default of agreement be settled by arbitration under the Principal Act as reasonable compensation for his withdrawal from the industry, and to enable him to proceed elsewhere and obtain a new occupation. Determination of amount. 1916, No. 71, s. 5 (2).

(3.) Upon payment of compensation to a workman under this section any claim which he may have to compensation under section eight shall cease.

(4.) A workman—

(a) who has been excluded or withdrawn from employment in or upon the Broken Hill mines consequent upon the issue of a certificate by the board under subsection three of section four; and Penalty for working in mines after withdrawal.

(b) who has not subsequently thereto been certified as fit to return to work in or upon a Broken Hill mine,

shall, if he returns to employment in or upon any such mine,—

(i) forfeit any right to compensation for any subsequent disablement by lead poisoning; and

(ii) be guilty of an offence against this Act and be liable to a penalty not exceeding *twenty-five* pounds, and a further penalty not exceeding *one* pound for every day on which he works in or upon any such mine. [*Read*].

(1) There shall be paid to the trust out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund as a grant in aid of the purposes for which the trust is constituted within six months after the trust has borrowed any sum under this Act, the sum of three thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds, and in every six months thereafter for a period of fifteen years a like sum, amounting in all to the sum of one hundred and twelve thousand five hundred pounds, which sum shall in each instance be applied by the trust towards payment of the amount borrowed and interest thereon.

(2) The aforesaid amounts may be paid by the Colonial Treasurer out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund under the authority of this Act, upon the certificate of the Minister, and without further appropriation.

(3) The Minister may withhold his certificate unless and until he is satisfied that the work for which the trust is constituted is being properly carried out in accordance with the approved plans and specifications, and that the duties imposed upon the trust by this Act are being efficiently performed.

(4) If the total amount expended for reconstruction is less than the amount authorised to be borrowed by this Act the total amount of Government contributions shall be reduced "proportionately." [*Read.*]
