WAYS AND MEANS—(FINANCE (NEWSPAPERS TAXATION) BILL):—

(Resolution)—(Further considered).

Resolution again proposed:—

That towards raising the Supply to be granted to His Majesty there shall be levied, collected, and paid for the use of His Majesty a tax on newspapers at the scale and subject to the exemption set out hereunder:—

Upon each copy of a newspaper issued a tax of one halfpenny.

Further that no tax shall be payable "where the number of" copies issued at the same publication does not exceed ~~ten~~ fifteen thousand or where the newspaper is published by or behalf of the State or of any department of the Government thereof or where the newspaper is published by or on behalf of any religious association or society and the profits therefrom are devoted to and for the purposes of such association or "society," or where the published price of the paper was threepence per copy or over at 22nd December, 1926.

Further that—

for the purposes of this resolution—

"issued" means issued by the publisher of the newspaper for sale and actually sold;

"newspaper" means any publication known and recognised as a newspaper in the generally accepted sense of the word, and published within the State of New South Wales for sale which—

(a) consists in substantial part of news and articles relating to current topics, or of religious, technical, or practical information; and

(b) is published in numbers at intervals of not more than one month.

A publication printed on paper and issued as a supplement to a newspaper shall be deemed to be part of the newspaper, if—

(a) it consists in substantial part of reading matter other than advertisements, or of engravings, prints, lithographs, or coloured supplements; and

(b) it is issued with each copy of the newspaper; and

(c) it has the title of the newspaper with which it is issued printed on the top of each page of letterpress.

The term newspaper includes any publication which is registered under the Newspaper Act, 1898, or which is published within the said State for sale, and is registered under the Post and Telegraph Act, 1902, for transmission through the post as a newspaper.

Further that the tax referred to in this resolution shall be levied, collected, and paid as from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

Motion made (Captain Chaffey) to leave out from line 6 the words "where the number of" and insert the words "on the first ten thousand" instead thereof.

DENTISTS (AMENDMENT) BILL:—

Clauses 1 to 5 having been dealt with,—

Clause 6. (1) The Principal Act is further amended—

(a) by inserting in section ten after the words “any person who” the words “proves to the satisfaction of the board that he is of good character, and who”;

\* \* \* \* \*

(e) by inserting at the end of the same section the following new paragraphs:—

“After the commencement of the Dentists (Amendment) Act, 1926 1927, no person at such commencement apprenticed to a dentist shall be registered upon the qualification set out in paragraph (b) of this section unless he has passed in the prescribed subjects an examination of a standard equal to that of the examination for the intermediate certificate.”

“After the commencement of the Dentists (Amendment) Act, 1926 1927, no person shall be permitted to be apprenticed to a dentist before passing in the prescribed subjects, the prescribed examination.”

If the Minister, after determination of value by the Land and Valuation Court, elects to continue such resumption, the owner shall be entitled to remain in occupation under conditions to be approved by the Minister for a period of not more than twelve months after the decision of the Minister has been communicated to such owner.

Within fourteen days thereafter the owner shall notify to the Minister the period for which he desires to obtain the use of the land. During such period the owner shall effectively safeguard all improvements, and at the expiration of such period shall give vacant and peaceful possession.

If the Minister before the expiration of such period the aforesaid period of one month, by notification in the Gazette, elects to discontinue such resumption, the proclamation of the resumption and all proceedings thereon or thereafter relating to the resumption shall be treated as a nullity.

The claimant shall be entitled to payment of the proper costs and expenses "incurred" up to the date of the discontinuance, and the amount thereof shall, when necessary, be fixed by the Land and Valuation Court.

Clause 5. The Liquor Act, 1912, is amended—

(a) by inserting next after section fifty-seven—

57A. (1) Where in any licensed premises for which a publican's license has been granted bona fide meals are regularly supplied to the public or in the premises of any registered club supplied to members of the club, the Licensing Court for the district may on the application of the licensee or (as the case may be) the secretary of the club and on payment of the prescribed fee, grant with respect to such licensed premises or club premises a permit to such licensee or secretary for the sale, disposal, or supply of liquor for consumption with bona fide meals in accordance with the provisions of this section and may at any time revoke any such permit if satisfied upon complaint made by the Licensing Inspector that the purposes for which such permit was granted are not being properly observed.

\* \* \* \* \*

(3) Nothing in this section shall be construed to permit the sale or supply of liquor in any licensed premises or registered club on any Sunday, Good Friday, or Christmas Day, or on any day on which there is a General Election.

(4) For the purposes of this section "a meal" shall mean a meal of at least two courses at which the persons partaking thereof are seated at a table and the meal shall include fish or meats, other than in sandwich form, and cooked vegetables. *[Read.]*

- (e) any child in respect of whom an allowance is payable in pursuance of any regulation made under the Commonwealth Public Service Act, 1922-1924, or in pursuance of any award or agreement made under the Arbitration (Public Service) Act, 1920;
- (f) the child of an alien father; **unless the child was born in Australia**;
- (g) the child of an Asiatic father unless the child was born in Australia;
- (h) the child of a father who is an aboriginal native of Africa, the islands of the Pacific, or New Zealand, unless the child was born in Australia.

## FAMILY ENDOWMENT (TAX) BILL—Resolution:—

That towards raising the Supply to be granted to His Majesty there shall be charged, levied, paid, and collected under the Family Endowment Act, 1927, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in each succeeding year, at the times and in the manner prescribed by regulations made under that Act, and subject to the exemptions in that Act contained, from all employers for the use of His Majesty and for credit of the Family Endowment Fund contributions upon the total amount of wages paid by such employers to their employees during the periods prescribed by regulations made under the said Act, at the percentage following, that is to say—six and one-half per centum.

Further, That where an employer is either the Crown in right of the State of New South Wales or a statutory authority representing the Crown in such right there shall be paid to the Family Endowment Fund out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund or out of the funds of the said statutory authority as may be directed by the Governor such sum as is equivalent to

the amount which the employer would have paid if liable to taxation. And any sum so payable may be paid upon the warrant of the Governor and without any further appropriation than the Act founded upon this Resolution.

Further, That the terms used in this Resolution shall have the meanings ascribed thereto in the Family Endowment Act, 1927.

(a) Where the taxable income of a person other than a company does not exceed two hundred and fifty pounds, nine pence in the pound on the amount of such income, and an addition of one-third of nine pence on such of the income as is derived from the produce of property.

(b) When the taxable income of a person other than a company exceeds two hundred and fifty pounds the tax shall be according to the scale set out hereunder:—

Amount of taxable income.

Amount of tax per pound of income.

So much of the income as does not exceed two hundred and fifty pounds.

Nine pence, and an addition of one-third of nine pence on such of the income as is derived from the produce of property

(2.) Further, that towards raising the Supply to be granted to His Majesty there shall be charged, levied, collected, and paid income tax in respect of taxable income which has been received by any company for the year of income ending the 30th day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, at the rate of three shillings in the pound on the amount of such taxable income, and for each subsequent year of income at the rate of two shillings and six pence in the pound on the amount of the taxable income for that year.

(3.) Further, that towards raising the Supply to be granted to His Majesty there shall, notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of these Resolutions, be charged, levied, collected, and paid under the provisions of the Income Tax (Management) Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts and in the manner therein prescribed, income tax in respect of the taxable income referred to in section 18A of the Income Tax (Management) Act, 1912, as inserted by the Income Tax (Management) Amendment Act, 1925, which has been received

during the twelve months ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and in each subsequent year at the rate of five shillings in the pound of such taxable income, or at such less rate in the pound as may for any year of income be fixed by the Governor and notified by proclamation published in the *Gazette*.

- (4.) Further, that terms used in these Resolutions shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms in the Income Tax (Management) Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, and in other regards the Interpretation Act, 1897, shall govern the meaning of the terms so used. [*Read.*]

"Producer" means a person by whom or on whose behalf a product is actually grown, produced, or prepared for sale, and includes a son of eighteen years of age and upwards of a producer working on his father's farm, not for wages but for his keep and pocket money only: where the product is grown, produced, or prepared pursuant to any share-farming agreement, or partnership agreement, the term includes the parties to such agreement: the term does not include a person engaged as an employee on wages or salary or piece-work rates.

"Product" includes any grain, cereal, fruit (fresh, dried, or canned), vegetable, live stock, wool, meat, hay, chaff, eggs, poultry (live or dead), honey, beeswax, or other product of agriculture, grazing, poultry-farming, or bee-keeping in New South Wales, and "any dairy produce (including" fresh milk, "butter and cheese") and any other article of commerce prepared other than by any process of manufacture from the produce of agriculture, grazing, poultry-farming, or bee-keeping in New South Wales, but does not include dried currants, dried sultanas, or dried lexias.

(1) The Governor shall from time to time, when requested so to do by a petition signed by a representative number (not being less than ~~five~~ <sup>Poll of producers.</sup> ~~one hundred or one half the number of producers engaged in producing the commodity where that number does not exceed one hundred and fifty~~) of the producers of any particular product, by proclamation declare that such product or any specified variety or grade thereof shall, within the area or locality described and for such time as is specified in the proclamation, be a commodity under and for the purposes of this Act.

(2) The Governor shall by the same proclamation declare a day (not being less than ~~thirty~~ ~~thirty~~ ~~fifty~~ ~~days~~ after the publication of the said proclamation in the Gazette) for a poll to be taken of the producers of such commodity resident or carrying on the business of production within the area or locality mentioned in such petition on the question whether a Marketing Board shall be constituted in relation to the said commodity.

(3) "If" more than ~~three-fifths~~ ~~two-thirds~~ of the votes polled are in favour of the constitution of a board, the Governor shall by a subsequent proclamation declare that a board shall be constituted in relation to the commodity so declared, and extend the provisions of this Act to the commodity.
