## MINERS' ACCIDENT RELIEF (SUPPLEMENTAL) BILL:—

Clause 2. (1) Subject to this section, there may be granted under the provisions of the Miners' Accident Relief (Repeal) Act, 1916—

(2) Such additional allowance shall not be paid—

- (a) to any person during residence outside the Commonwealth of Australia;
- (b) to any person who is in receipt of such a pension or allowance under any Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia or any Act of the Legislature of New South Wales or from the National Relief Fund of New South Wales as when taken with the allowance payable under the Miners' Accident Relief (Repeal) Act, 1916, equals or exceeds in respect of himself alone the sum of—
- (i) one pound per week in the case of a male person;
- (ii) fifteen shillings per week in the case of a female person;
- (c) to any person in receipt of an allowance only in respect of a child.
