1 Clause 8. (1) The governing authority of the University shall be the Council and the Council shall have and may exercise and discharge the powers, authorities, duties and functions conferred and imposed upon it by or under this Act. The Council.

10 (5) The elected members of the Council shall be qualified and elected as in each case or for each class may be prescribed by this subsection and the by-laws and shall comprise—

(a) one person so elected by the undergraduates within the University;

15 (c) one person so elected by the professors and such other persons, being persons giving instruction within the University and superior officers within the University, as may be prescribed by the by-laws; and

20 (d) four persons, of whom one has been so elected by each faculty that the Council has, not less than one month before the closing of nominations for the election of those persons, determined to be one of the four principal faculties within the University.

25 For the purposes of this subsection "graduate" means person whose name appears on the list, prepared in accordance with the by-laws, of graduate electors.
