## **ABORIGINAL AFFAIRS AND TREATY**

### **Aboriginal Land Claims**

1. How much is budgeted for the operation of the Office of the Registrar (Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983 NSW) in 2023-24 and in the forward estimates?

### **Budget**

**ANSWER:**

10. Why weren't Aboriginal people referenced in the Regional NSW Budget Papers, given that the majority of Aboriginal people in NSW live outside of greater Sydney, including the top five communities with the greatest proportion of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people residing exclusively in regional NSW?

**ANSWER:**

11. What operations have been cut within Aboriginal Affairs to fund the \$5m treaty consultation process, given the money came was taken from the existing budget?

12. Minister did you get a charter letter from the Premier when you were appointed as a Minister?

**ANSWER:**

The charter letter makes reference to our election commitments as a government and expectations around Ministerial responsibilities.

15. Minister, will you be contributing to the NSW Treasury's review of the NSW Aboriginal Procurement Policy?

**ANSWER:**

Aboriginal Affairs NSW works closely with NSW Treasury on initiatives under the NSW Closing the Gap Implementation Plan, including the review of the NSW Aboriginal Procurement Policy.

16. Minister, will you be contributing to Investment NSW's Aboriginal Employment and Enterprise Strategy?

**ANSWER:**

Aboriginal Affairs NSW works closely with the NSW Department of Enterprise, Investment and Trade on initiatives under the NSW Closing the Gap Implementation Plan.

**GAMING AND RACING**

**Declaring restricted alcohol areas**

17. What is the process for declaring restricted alcohol areas in recognised Aboriginal communities under clause 116(b)(iii) of the Liquor Act 2007 No 90, given your dual responsibilities as Minister for Gaming and Racing and Minister for Aboriginal Affairs and Treaty?

**ANSWER:**

The process relating to making of regulations declaring restricted alcohol areas are outlined in Sections 115 and 116 of the *Liquor Act 2007*.

**Cashless Gaming**

18. What was the process for appointing the three-person executive to that panel?

**ANSWER:**

All members of the Panel were appointed by the Secretary, Department of Enterprise Investment and Trade.

19. How many times have you met with the panel?

**ANSWER:**

As of 23 November 2023 - once, at the first meeting on 14 August 2023.

20. How many times have you met with chair Michael Foggo?

**ANSWER:**

As of 23 November 2023, three times in person and once on the phone.

21. What actions have you taken to prevent money laundering in pubs and clubs while we await the findings of the 16-member panel?

**ANSWER:**

The NSW Government is committed to minimising money laundering via Electronic Gaming Machines (EGMs) and has established the Independent Panel on Gaming Reform to trial cashless gaming and provide a roadmap for gaming reform. The Government has committed to implementing the recommendations from Project Islington and has already introduced a reduced cash load up limits of \$500 for new machines. Preliminary work is underway to implement the remaining recommendations. There is an existing regulatory and law enforcement regime in place to combat money laundering. The investigation and prosecution of alleged money laundering in NSW is the responsibility of police, working with partner agencies including the NSW Crime Commission and AUSTRAC.

22. Are you abdicating your responsibility as the Minister responsible for preventing money laundering in pubs and clubs?

**ANSWER:**

There is an existing regulatory and law enforcement regime in place to combat money laundering. The investigation and prosecution of alleged money laundering in NSW is the responsibility of police,

working with partner agencies including the NSW Crime Commission and AUSTRAC.

23. On the 4th of April, you attended a cashless gaming demonstration at Club York. What about this demonstration left unanswered questions about the implementation of cashless gaming?

**ANSWER:**

The Club York trial was a limited trial that focused on the effectiveness of the technology and is being independently evaluated. The findings from that trial will be published and provided to the Independent Panel.

24. If the demonstration was successful, why can't you implement a cashless gaming trial today, or better yet, back in May?

- (a) When can the people of NSW expect to know the findings of a trial?
- (b) What is the timeline?
- (c) When will the trial commence and finish?
- (d) How long after receiving a report will your government respond?
- (e) Will your government make the full findings of the trial public?
- (f) And the government response?

**ANSWER:**

The findings from that trial will be published and provided to the Independent Panel. The Panel is due to report to the NSW Government by November 2024. The NSW Government will consider the Panel's report when it is received.

25. Wesley Mission have said that they are not convinced that this process is genuine- Minister what do you say to that and why would they say that?

**ANSWER:**

Wesley Mission has a representative on the Panel and is proactively participating in the Panel's deliberations.

26. Minister, Section 37A of the Gaming Machine Act allows the Regulator to approve up to 150 machines for a club being established in a "new development area", with no community benefit fund payment required.

- (a) In the last 5 years, how many clubs have received gaming machine entitlements under this provision, and how many entitlements were given to each club?
- (b) Assuming that some entitlements have been approved under s37A, what is the foregone community benefit fund payment, given this special provision which requires no contribution by the successful club, even if it is a subsidiary of another existing club.

**Greyhound Racing NSW**

27. What are you doing for greyhound racing participants at Wauchope and Kempsey since those tracked have been closed?

**ANSWER:**

29. Given the Tamworth track is in poor condition - why has the new proposed \$5m Tamworth Greyhound track been delayed again after countless promises to the community and the so-called partnership with Harness Racing NSW cancelled.

**ANSWER:**

30. Why hasn't the \$6m Goulburn greyhound track upgrade commenced after being announced in August 2022?

**ANSWER:**

This is a matter for Greyhound Racing NSW.

31. Is this another example of the industry promising but not delivering?

**ANSWER:**

This is a matter for Greyhound Racing NSW.

32. There are so called plans to move greyhounds off Wentworth Park – there have been significant delays and no one seems to know what's going on – do you know what is going on Minister?

**ANSWER:**

This is a matter for Greyhound Racing NSW and the Greyhound, Breeders, Owners and Trainers Association (GBOTA).

**Point of Consumption Tax**

33. Taxes from wagering operators make a big contribution to the industry in NSW, and rightly so as these operators are making big dollars from the racing industry – do you know how much from the Point of Consumption tax went to industry last financial year?

**ANSWER:**

The long term decline in race injuries that result in euthanasia or sudden death at the track is a significant trend, reflecting important welfare improvements in the greyhound racing industry since the establishment of the Greyhound Welfare & Integrity Commission (GWIC). The Commission's *Rehoming Policy* has also resulted in a significant reduction in unnecessary euthanasia within the sport.

### Breeding

186. As part of the National Greyhound Welfare Strategy (GA), national breeding rules were introduced in July 2015, which have been adopted by all states:

- (b) registration of all dams,
- (c) breeding females over the age of eight years must obtain a veterinary certificate of breeding soundness, and obtain permission from the relevant authority to breed the dog,



- (d) a maximum of three litters can be bred from any one bitch and permission to breed a fourth litter must be obtained from the state racing authority. A certificate of breeding soundness must be obtained before the fourth breeding can occur,
- (e) no breeding females may have more than two litters in any 18 month period,
- (f) all pups have a compulsory C3 and C5 vaccinations,
- (g) all dogs must receive C5 vaccination prior to being named or commencing racing
  - i. Please explain how:
    - (i) these rules are enforced,
    - (ii) where the racing industry's local rules impose higher standards, please list the relevant standard and then explain how this is enforced.
  - ii. Please advise of:
    - (i) any breaches detected,
    - (ii) what the penalties were,
    - (iii) if fines were levied,
    - (iv) whether these were paid.

**ANSWER:**

I am advised by the Greyhound Welfare & Integrity Commission:

(a-e) Section 44 (1) of the *Greyhound Racing Act 2017* requires greyhound breeders to register with the Commission; this is also required by Local Rule 55 of the Greyhound Racing Rules.

Rule 56 (6) of the Greyhound Racing Rules prohibits use of a female greyhound for breeding purposes unless that greyhound is registered with the controlling body as a breeding female.

Rule 57 (1) (**R57**) of the Greyhound Racing Rules prohibits use of a female greyhound over the age of eight years for breeding purposes without a) veterinary certification of appropriate health and fitness and b) the written approval of the controlling body.

Similarly, Rule 58 (1) (**R58**) prohibits use of a female greyhound for breeding purposes where the greyhound has already whelped three litters without a) veterinary certification of appropriate health and fitness and b) the written approval of the controlling body.

The Commission administers an exemption scheme, through which participants may apply for an exemption from R57 or R58.

Local Rule 58A makes it an offence for a participant to cause or allow a breeding female aged 10 years or over, or which has had five previous litters, to be serviced.

Rule 59 provides that the owner of a breeding female, or another person, must not cause the breeding female to whelp more than two litters in any 18-month period.

(f-g) Rule 25 details minimum vaccination requirements for greyhounds, including:

- C3 vaccination between six and eight weeks of age prior to the registration of a litter
- C5 vaccination between 10 and 16 weeks of age and prior to the registration of a litter, and
- C5 vaccination at between 12 and 16 months of age and prior to naming.

These requirements must be met before a greyhound can be registered or named. Registration is a requirement for any transfer of a greyhound, and a greyhound must be named prior to being nominated to race; hence compliance with these requirements is extremely high.

The Commission has taken disciplinary action in respect of breaches of rules relating to greyhound

breeding and/or vaccination on 13 occasions. Disciplinary decisions are published on the Commission website: <https://www.gwic.nsw.gov.au/integrity/disciplinary-decisions>

In addition, for a breeding female greyhound, for the fourth and fifth litter, the breeder must obtain permission from the Commission prior to service.

Exports of greyhounds are regulated through the Rules of Racing and an export of a greyhound for breeding or training purposes without a Greyhounds Australasia passport is a breach of the Rules of Racing.

202. Has GWIC undertaken investigation for each NSW greyhound found to have been exported to China?

I am advised by the Greyhound Welfare & Integrity Commission that it is currently investigating reports of two NSW greyhounds exported to China; however as it is an ongoing investigation it is inappropriate to comment further.

Once a greyhound is placed on the CAR it falls outside the Commission's jurisdiction. Rehomed greyhounds that are placed on the CAR are the responsibility of local council rangers, the RSPCA and NSW Animal Welfare League officers who track and locate all pets, including greyhounds.
