Given under my hand and seal, at Government House, Sydney, this thirtieth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and in the fifty-eighth year of her Majesty's reign.

APPROPRIATION ACT (58 VIC. No. 13)—

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the period from the 1st day of January to the 30th day of June, 1895, inclusive of both dates, and for the year 1894 and previous years; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Reid, 20 December, 1894. Assented to, 22 December, 1894.]

ARMIDALE WATER SUPPLY WORKS ACT 1894 AMENDMENT ACT (58 VIC. No. 15)—

An Act to amend the Armidale Water Supply Works Act 1894. [Initiated by Mr. Young, 20 December, 1894. Assented to, 21 March, 1895.]

CENTENNIAL PARK RESERVOIR CONSTRUCTION ACT (58 VIC. No. 12)—

An Act to sanction the construction of a Reservoir at the Centennial Park in connection with the Sydney Water Supply; and to transfer the said work to and vest it in the Board of Water Supply and Sewerage. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Young, 20 December, 1894. Assented to, 22 December, 1894.]

CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND ACT (58 VIC. No. 3)—

An Act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales for services to be hereafter provided for by loan. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Reid, 20 September, 1894. Assented to, 9 October, 1894.]

CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND ACT No. 2 (59 VIC. No. 3)—

An Act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales towards the services of the year 1895-6. Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Reid, 25 June, 1895. Assented to, 1 July, 1895.]

COTTAGE CREEK SEWERAGE WORKS ACT (59 VIC., No. 2)—

An Act to sanction the construction of sewerage works at Cottage Creek, within the municipalities of Newcastle and Wickham, in the county of Northumberland. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Young, 18 April, 1895. Assented to, 25 June, 1895.]

CROWN LANDS ACT (58 VIC., No. 18)—

An Act to further regulate the sale, letting, disposal, occupation, and management of Crown lands; for the protection of certain homesteads; to enable the Crown, by purchase, resumption, exchange, and surrender, to acquire alienated lands; to amend the law relating to conditional purchasers in certain respects; to provide for forfeitures and validations in certain cases; to prevent impoundings and actions for trespass upon unfenced holdings; to amend the law as to local land boards and the Land Appeal Court; and to affect amendments in such statutes as may be necessary to give full force and effect to the aforesaid provisions; and for other purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Carruthers, 13 September, 1894. Assented to, 3 May, 1895.]

FISHERIES ACT AMENDMENT ACT (58 VIC., No. 4)—

An Act to amend the Fisheries Act of 1881 in certain respects. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Edden, 30 August, 1894. Assented to, 17 October, 1894.]

HAY IRRIGATION ACT AMENDMENT ACT (58 VIC. No. 19)—

An Act to amend the schedule to the Hay Irrigation Act. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Carruthers, 21 November, 1894. Assented to, 6 June, 1895.]

HOSPITAL ACTS FURTHER AMENDMENT ACT (58 VIC. No. 6)—

An Act to further amend the law relating to the Management of Hospitals. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Waddell, 29 August, 1894. Assented to, 31 October, 1894.]

JERILDERIE TO BERRIGAN RAILWAY ACT (59 VIC. No. 1)—

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Jerilderie to Berrigan; to amend the provisions of the Public Works Act of 1888, so far as they relate to the duty of the constructing authority to make and maintain fences along the said line of railway; to authorise the construction of the said line on certain public roads; to provide that such works shall not be commenced unless the private lands required for the construction of the line be contracted by instrument in writing to be conveyed by deed of gift, transfer, or exchange from the owners to the Crown, save and except in the case of town allotments, and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Young, 18 April, 1895. Assented to, 25 June, 1895.]

KENMORE HOSPITAL FOR INSANE ACT (58 VIC. No. 7)—

An Act to sanction the erection of a Hospital for the Insane at Kenmore, near Goulburn. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Young, 20 September, 1894. Assented to, 13 November, 1894.]

LOAN ACT (58 VIC. No. 14)—

An Act to authorise the raising of a loan for the public service of the colony, and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Reid, 20 December, 1894. Assented to, 22 December, 1894.]

LUNACY CONVENTION ACT (58 VIC. No. 5)—

An Act to further amend the law relating to the insane ; to authorise the making of conventions with adjacent colonies in connection therewith ; and for the better administration and management of the property of persons incapable of managing their affairs. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Bruncker, 12 September, 1894. Assented to, 23 October, 1894.]

MUNICIPALITIES ACT OF 1867 AMENDMENT ACT (58 VIC. No. 9)—

An Act to declare valid certain proclamations issued under the Municipalities Act of 1867, and to make further provision for the constitution of municipalities under the said Act ; and for other purposes in connection therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Bruncker, 1 November, 1894. Assented to, 4 December, 1894.]

MUNICIPALITIES ACT OF 1867 AMENDMENT ACT No. 2 (58 VIC. No. 20)—

An Act to declare and enact that certain contracts and agreements shall be and be deemed to have been excepted from the provisions of sections thirty-three and thirty-eight of the Municipalities Act of 1867 ; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Bruncker, 4 June, 1895. Assented to, 11 June, 1895.]

NARRABRI TO MOREE RAILWAY ACT (58 VIC. No. 17)—

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of Railway from Narrabri to Moree. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Young, 6 December, 1894. Assented to 23 April, 1895.]

NET-FISHING IN PORT HACKING PROHIBITION ACT AMENDMENT ACT (58 VIC. No. 8)—

An Act to amend the Net-fishing in Port Hacking Prohibition Act of 1886. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Frank Farnell, 4 September, 1894. Assented to 13 November, 1894.]

PARKES TO CONDOBOLIN RAILWAY ACT (59 VIC. No.)—
