- APPRENTICES ACT (57 Vic. No. 22)—
 An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to apprentices. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Houghton, 24 January, 1894. Assented to, 5 June, 1894.]
- APPROPRIATION Act (57 Vic. No. 11)—
 An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the year 1894, and for the year 1893 and previous years. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. See, 16 March, 1894.]
 Assented to, 3 April, 1894.]
- ARMIDALE WATER SUPPLY WORKS ACT (57 VIC. No. 29)—
 An Act to sanction the construction of works of water supply for the town of Armidale, county of Sandon, and to apply the provisions of the Country Towns Water and Sewerage Act of 1880, and any act amending the same to the said works. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Lyne, 26 April, 1894.] Assented to, 5 June, 1894.]
- Bank-notes Act (57 Vic. No. 13)—
 An Act to regulate the issue of bank-notes; to make bank-notes a legal tender except at the chief offices of the banks in Sydney; to amend the Stamp Duties Act of 1880; to declare the past operation of section one of the Bank Issue Act of 1893; and to repeal that section and to re-enact it with amendments. [Initiated in the Assembly by Sir George Dibbs, 25 January, 1894. Assented to, 10 April, 1894.]
- CAMELS AND DROMEDARIES IMPOUNDING ACT (57 Vic. No. 31)—
 An Act to further amend the Impounding Act of 1865, and the acts amending the same, and to amend the Public Watering Places Act of 1884. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Slattery, 23 May, 1894. Assented to, 9 June, 1894.]
- Consolidated Revenue Fund Acr, No. 1 (57 Vic. No. 6)—
 An Act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales towards the services of the year 1894, and for services to be hereafter provided for by loan. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. See, 24 January, 1894. Assented to, 31 January, 1894.]
- CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND ACT, No. 2 (57 Vic. No. 8)—
 An Act to apply a certain sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales towards the services of the year 1894. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. See, 2 March, 1894. Assented to, 2 March, 1894.]
- Country Towns and Hunter District Water Supply and Sewerage Acts Amendment Act (57 Vic. No. 19)—
 - An Act to amend such of the provisions of the Country Towns Water and Sewerage Act of 1880, the Country Towns Water and Sewerage Act Extension Act of 1887, and the Hunter District Water Supply and Sewerage Act of 1892, as deal with the repayment of the cost of works of water supply and sewerage, and to extend the period of such repayment; to empower the board established under the said Hunter District Water Supply and Sewerage Act of 1892 to connect premises with the water-mains and the sewers under their control and to recover the expenses of such connections; to provide for the carrying out of such connections by the said board on deferred payments, and to make other provisions subsidiary to or in connection with the objects aforesaid. Crown Lands Purchases and Leases Validation Act (57 Vic. No. 9)-

An Act to legalise certain conditional purchases and conditional leases and auction and other purchases of Crown lands, and to validate certain Crown grants in connection therewith; to confer special powers of reference to the local land board and the Land Appeal Court where necessary; to permit the reversal of forfeiture of certain conditional purchases and conditional leases; to authorise the sale of certain Crown lands and the issue of Crown grants therefor; and to authorise the granting of certain Crown land by way of compensation. An Act to amend the criminal law so far as regards the punishment of persons convicted of first offences, and persons undergoing imprisonment or penal servitude. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Crick, 24 January, 1894. Assented to, 5 June, 1894.]

Johnstone's Bay Storm-water Sewers Act (57 Vic. No. 33)—
An Act to sanction the construction of certain storm-water sewers discharging into Johnstone's
Bay, Port Jackson. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Lyne, 26 April, 1894. Assented to,
9 June, 1894.]

JUNEE WATER SUPPLY WORKS ACT AMENDMENT ACT (57 VIC. No. 14)—
An Act to amend the Junee Water Supply Works Act of 1893. [Initiated in the Assembly by
Mr. Lyne, 21 March, 1894. Assented to, 1 May, 1894.]

LABOUR SETTLEMENTS ACT AMENDMENT ACT (57 Vic. No. 26)—

Loan Act (57 Vic. No. 17)—

An Act to authorise the raising of a loan for the public service of the colony, and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. See, 5 April, 1894.] Assented to, 1 May, 1894.]

METROPOLITAN WATER AND SEWERAGE ACT EXTENSION ACT (57 Vic. No. 12)—
An Act to-make more effectual provision for the recovery of rates, charges, costs, and expenses
payable under the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Acts of 1880, 1889; to provide for vesting
in the board certain storm-water drains and sewers and land and buildings used in connection
therewith; to authorise the board to impose rates and charges in respect to those drains and
sewers within certain areas; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Lyne,
24 January, 1894. Assented to, 3 April, 1894.]
