Adjournment: An hon. member, on the motion for the adjournment of the House, may refer only to matters of concern to his constituency, 1160, 1716, 1720, 2738, 2739, 2740, 2741; may not refer to matters that would provoke a general debate, 2934.

An hon. member who moves a motion for the adjournment of a debate is precluded, if the motion is defeated, from participating in the debate on the substantive motion (Standing Order 173), 39.

The debate closes when the Minister who moves the motion has replied, 5772.

Debate on a motion moved under Standing Order 49 is confined to the specific matter referred to, 5172, 5173.

A motion for the adjournment of the House, moved under Standing Order 49, may not be proceeded with unless it has the support of at least five members, 1576.

When speaking to the motion for the adjournment an hon. member may not anticipate debate on the Supply Bill, 3041.

Address-in-Reply: An amendment to the motion for the adoption of the Address-in-Reply that could be construed as a criticism of His Majesty's representative may, with the consent of the House, be amended, 188.

The speech of His Excellency having been laid on the table an address-in-reply thereto may be immediately moved and seconded, 225, 228.

When a motion for the Previous Question, "That that question be now put" has been negatived and another motion for the adoption of the Address-in-reply is before the House, hon. members who spoke on the original motion may speak to the second one, but may not debate amendments to the original motion that were negatived (Standing Order 146), 241, 242, 243, 257.

On a motion for the adoption of the Address-in-Reply an hon. member may not move an amendment that reflects upon a previous vote of the Chamber. The appropriate course is to move a rescission motion (Standing Order 149), 451.

Behaviour of Hon. Members: Hon. members must behave with decorum and observe the decencies of parliamentary procedure, 4270, 5195.

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Interjections: An hon. member must be heard in silence, 384, 390, 531, 2536, 2693, 2833, 2949, 3962, 4092, 4094, 4214, 5458, 5460, 5574.

Leader and Deputy-leader of the Opposition, reported change, q., 675.

Motion of Dissent: Discussion confined to the ruling in dispute and whether it was in accordance with established practice, 3296, 3299, 3302, 3304.

Motion of Urgency: The substantive motion may not be discussed on a motion of urgency, 2352, 2353, 2895, 2948, 2949, 5499; the Premier, however, may reply to statements made by the leader of the Opposition, 5501, 5672, 5673.

The motion must be concerned with a question of urgency, 5578, 5669.

After a motion of urgency has been agreed to, it is necessary for the mover of the motion to move for the suspension of Standing and Sessional Orders before proceeding with the substantive motion, 2684.

A motion of urgency may be moved during question time, 3910.

The fact that a matter may be discussed on the Estimates does not preclude an hon. member from moving a motion of urgency so that the House may record its vote on the specific question, 4215.

Newspaper Reports: An hon. member quoting newspaper reports must accept responsibility for their authenticity, 4382.
