J. D. BOOTH, ESQ.: Appointment 25.

Documents: Passing reference to a document is permissible, but a member should not quote whole tracts, 1553.

Points of Order: Points of order upheld, 1553.

F. D. C. CATERSON, ESQ.: Appointment, 25

CHAIRMAN OF COMMITTEES (R. J. WEBSTER, ESQ.):

Divisions: A question was put again by the Chair, as no call for a division had been heard, 869, 1581; a member should signify that he seeks a division by calling loudly to the Chair, 1581, not by waving an arm in the air.

Interjections, Interruptions and Disorder: Interjections are disorderly, 850, 1109; and a member would have the opportunity to respond, if he chose to do so, 1238, 2293.

The following members were called to order by name: Mr Ferguson, 1109; Mr Lovelee, 868; Mr Martin, 851; Mr J. H. Murray, 850; Mr Unsworth, 2283, 2293.

Assembly, Legislative: Rulings, Observations and Opinions of the Chair (continued):**CHAIRMAN OF COMMITTEES (R. J. WEBSTER, ESQ.) (continued):**

Members were asked to reduce the level of conversation, 850; and reminded of the convention that silence is extended to members making maiden speeches only if they have not been called to order for interjecting, 868. A member who has contributed to debate in Committee may do so again by seeking the call, 1109.

Points of Order: No point of order was involved, 850.

Points of order upheld, or upheld in part, 2301.

Procedure: The Chair would determine whether it was necessary to rule on a point of order, 1108; and unless a member demonstrated the relevance of the philosophy being developed, he would be asked to resume his seat.

In Committee a member may speak on more than one occasion, 1580. A member was asked to resume debate on an amendment, 869. A member was asked whether he sought to withdraw a proposed amendment, 1413.

Relevance: Considerable flexibility would be allowed in Committee, 1107, but a member had strayed from debate. Remarks should be confined to the schedule being debated, 1198.

DEPUTY-SPEAKER (R. J. WEBSTER, ESQ.):

Debate: Only passing reference may be made to matters not relevant to a bill, 203.

Interjections, Interruptions and Disorder: The following member was called to order by name: Mr Kerr, 1165.

A member wishing to participate in debate should seek the call, 1165.

Points of Order: A member was asked to address the point of order, 247, and when he failed to do so was told to resume his seat.

The Chair would not stifle debate by narrowing its parameters, 248.

Points of order not involved, 203.

Relevance: A member was asked to return to the scope of the bill, 248, 899. The debate on a bill had been broad, but a member was asked to limit her remarks, 250.

A member should speak to amendments to a bill and not irrelevancies, 2283; though the Chair acknowledged that it was not always

easy to confine debate to the precise substance of Legislative Council amendments to a bill, 2285. Nevertheless, a member should not give a lengthy background to the amendments under consideration, 2285.

The Chair had allowed a member some latitude, but he should bring to a close any lengthy explanation, 2301.

SPEAKER, MR (THE HON. K. R. ROZZOLI):

Adjournment (S.O. 49): The Chair would hear submissions on whether a subject was of sufficiently wide public importance to attract the provisions of S.O. 49 before hearing the motion for adjournment to enable a determination to be made on whether the motion was in acceptable form, 2267. Though it was conceded that the motion met all other requirements, a member must establish that the matter was of sufficient public importance to warrant its being debated under S.O. 49, 2269. In doing so, a member must not deal with the substantive motion, but address the point of order, and link his submission to the wider public spectrum, 2269. If he failed to do so, he would be asked to resume his seat, 2270.

The matters raised to support a member's contention that the motion was of sufficient public importance to be debated under S.O. 49 were not pertinent, though the Chair had allowed more references than it should have to the substantive matter in an attempt to fairly appraise the merits of the motion, which related to a local matter and was thus out of order, 2271.

Assembly, Legislative: For the purpose of proceedings and in divisions the entire backbench of the Chamber was deemed to be assigned to Government supporters, 126.

The Chair had approved the televising of part of the proceedings of the House, 126, 1375.

Chair (See also Procedure): A member had not reflected on the Chair, but was directed to make his remarks relevant, 159.

The phrasing of a point of order was dangerously close to breaching standing orders, 305, and a member was warned not to reflect on the Chair.

A member who had reflected on the Chair was directed to come to his point of order or resume his seat immediately, 305.

Ministers' second reading speeches were statements of government policy and in a different category, as the Interpretation Act required accuracy in them. A member should be able to speak to a bill using copious notes, 1215.

The Chair accepted that a member would make only passing reference to a subject outside the scope of debate, 219. A member may not speak to a bill that is not before the House, 1064. A rhetorical question during debate did not require an answer, 1212.

Disclosures by Members: The Crown Solicitor had advised that it was impossible to establish whether a member had been guilty of wilful contravention of the Constitution (Disclosures by Members) Regulation 1983; and it was agreed the matter should not be pursued, 63.

Distinguished Visitors: Minister for planning and environment for each of the States of Australia, and New Zealand, and departmental staffs, 790.

Divisions: The House was acting under standing orders and not sessional orders, 60; therefore those voting for the ayes should pass to the right of the Chair and those voting for the noes to the left of the Chair.

As there was confusion about the manner of voting on an amendment to a motion, the Chair put the question again, 2260.

Members seated in the entire backbench were deemed to be supporting the Government, 287.

Documents (See also Debate): Leave was not granted to incorporate a document in *Hansard*, 1551. Material incorporated in *Hansard* should be submitted for approval of the Chair prior to debate, and should be necessarily brief.

Remarks should be addressed to the Chair, 144, 284, 331, 577, 800, 916, 918, 1384; and not to members on the Government benches, 144. Members should not carry on conversations across the Chamber, 151, 565, 577, 2288.

A member was asked to resume his seat, 133, 229, 825.

A member should conduct himself with decorum so as not to invite interjections, 23; and was on dangerous ground, 1147.

Members should reduce the level of audible conversation, 144, 147, 288, 302, 526, 664, 666, 796, 798, 802, 872, 905, 1047, 1064, 1120, 1154, 1377, 1392, 1530, 2217, 2218, 2261, 2262; if it continued, the Chair would call individual members to order at random, 301. At the beginning of a busy working week it was necessary for members to remain orderly if they did not wish to be removed from the Chamber for the remainder of the week, 790. Visitors to the public gallery, Hansard, and members were entitled to hear what was said, 1377. Because of the noise in the Chamber the Chair was unable to hear a remark to which exception was taken, 1384. The Chair was reluctant to name individual members for conversing, but they were being discourteous to the member speaking in debate, 2263.

Members wishing to conduct conversations should do so outside the Chamber, 212, 231, 288, 1120, 1149, 1394, 1518, 1530, 2218, 2261. If conversations continued, the Chair would name offenders, 1150. Calls to order against members would stand, as the time for asking questions was still running, 2232; and those members who had been called to order several times previously should refrain from interjecting. A member was asked to address the Chair as the volume of interjections had made it difficult to hear what had been said, 1384.

The remarks of a member were outside the ambit of a motion, 170; and he was asked to make his comments relevant.

It being 15 minutes past 4 o'clock p.m., the debate was interrupted. Pursuant to Standing Order 122A, the motion lapsed, 715.

Offensive and Objectionable Remarks, Imputations and Aspersions: Though the Chair intended to widen the scope of language deemed to be unparliamentary, the innovation and ingenuity of members would not be unduly restricted, 142; and a member was not required to withdraw the expression "this mob opposite". The Chair would endeavour to uphold the principles of parliamentary language previously enunciated, but in view of the long history of use of colourful and vibrant language in the Chamber would use discretion and not necessarily preclude terms that have been in common usage, 305. A code of language for the guidance of members would be developed, 306.

Privilege: The Clerk was directed to report to the House on a matter of parliamentary privilege, 62.

A question was ruled out of order, 1058, as it had been directed to the wrong Minister, 139, and a member was told to rephrase his question, 529. A member may not ask a question similar to a question on the *Questions and Answers* paper, 1058.

Though an answer contained a degree of specificity, it was ruled to be in order, 44. An answer should be relevant to the question asked, but a brief preamble was allowed, 134. A Minister was told to answer a question, 2222. In his answer a Minister was responding in part to interjections, but was told to make his reply specific, 660; and cease responding to interjections, 666.

A Minister was directed not to debate a notice of motion but to make his answer relevant, 525.

A Minister's remarks were relevant to the question, 144, 307; but he was warned about the length of his answer, 144.

Question time should not be eroded by lengthy replies, 138; and a Minister was requested to conclude his answer as soon as possible, 138, 307.

Quorum Formed: 337.

Relevance: A Minister was permitted to make brief reference to a matter of limited relevance to the subject of an urgency motion, 52.

The Chair would be strict in deciding matters of relevance, 44; though a member was allowed a degree of latitude to develop his theme, 575, he was directed to remain close to the scope of the bill. Though a member could give some brief historical background information, it must be concise and relevant, 1448.

The framing of the latter part of a question made its ambit broad, but did not give a Minister general licence to traverse a range of matters, 1520; he could make general comments introductory to the specific information sought.

A member was giving preamble and would soon reach the substance of his remarks, 342.

Standing orders did not permit the Chair to restrict a Minister's reply, provided that it was germane to matters raised in debate, 594.

Sub Judice Rule: A ministerial statement was brief, but a member seeking to take a point of order that a matter was *sub judice* should have done so in the course of the statement, 803.

A member was distracted from the debate by interjections, 2016; and was entitled to be heard in silence, 2020, 2021. Constant interjections made it impossible for a member to be heard, 2021, 2023; and placed an intolerable burden on Hansard, 2021, 2023.

A member interjecting should seek the call to contribute to the debate, 2022.

Offensive and Objectionable Remarks, Imputations and Aspersions: No objection was taken at the time to language used by a member, but his attention was drawn subsequently to page 432 of the twentieth edition of May's *Parliamentary Practice*, where it was stated that a member was not allowed to use unparliamentary words by the device of putting them in somebody else's mouth, 1962.

Points of Order: Points of order upheld, or upheld in part, 1921, 1923, 1960.

Council, Legislative: Rulings, Observations and Opinions of the Chair (continued):**DEPUTY-PRESIDENT AND CHAIRMAN OF COMMITTEES (THE HON. SIR ADRIAN SOLOMONS) (continued):**

Point of order not involved, 732.

In speaking to a point of order a member had clarified the issue, 732.

Procedure (See also Debate): The Chair intended to apply strictly Standing Order 116 and require that amendments be in writing and circulated in advance, 470.

A member who did not propose to move foreshadowed amendments did not need leave to withdraw the proposed amendments, 1910.

A member was told to move a proposed amendment, 1960; and speak to that amendment before proceeding to speak to a second amendment. As the Committee was to deal with amendments to a schedule containing columns of tables but no line numbers, it was necessary to follow the columns in alphabetical order, 1362. To test the feeling of the Committee, the Chair put the usual question, "That the words proposed to be omitted stand part of the bill", before putting the amendment, 1366. An amendment could not be explained, 1508, as objection was taken. The wording of an amendment differed from that circulated, which had the consent of a Minister, 777.

The standing orders required that a member speak to the amendment moved, 2019. Though a member had the right to speak more than once at the Committee stage, the Chair had given the call to a Minister, 728; who then deferred to the member, 729.

The Chair would not in future countenance the practice whereby an amendment moved was not in accordance with a written amendment previously circulated, the Chair had not been provided with a written copy of the amendment, in accordance with the rules, and the amendment had been moved after the schedule had been put to the Committee, 2121.

A member who could not hear what was being said by a Minister was invited to move closer to the Minister, 1921.

There being no objection, two amendments were dealt with together, 2027.

A member was out of order in speaking to an amendment that the Government indicated it would accept, 2070.

Council, Legislative: Rulings, Observations and Opinions of the Chair (continued):

DEPUTY-PRESIDENT AND CHAIRMAN OF COMMITTEES (THE HON. SIR ADRIAN SOLOMONS) (continued):

As there had been a lengthy interruption to a long debate, the Chair clarified the issues before the Committee by restating competing amendments and explaining the process by which the votes on them would be taken, 750, 751.

Relevance: A Minister was reminded that words to which he referred had been removed from a proposed amendment, 1962.

A question asked by way of interjection sought to obtain a legal opinion and was out of order, 1865; the courts and not the Minister interpret the law, 1865.

At the Committee stage a member should not deliver a second reading speech, but should confine his remarks to the schedule being considered, 2014.

Speaking to an amendment a member had gone beyond the ambit of the debate and was out of order, 1965, 2123.

A Minister mentioned by a member was not responsible for the administration of the proposed legislation being debated, 2124; and the member's comments should be relevant to the amendment being considered.

As Deputy-President:

Chair (See also *Procedure*): A member was trying the patience of the Chair, 407.

A member should address the Chair, 496, at a rate of delivery that did not cause difficulty for Hansard.

Condolence: Rygate, Hon. Amelia, a former member.

Debate: A member had exhausted his time for speaking, 1794.

The attention of a member speaking to a motion dealing with the sale of X-rated video cassettes was drawn to the presence of school-children in the gallery, 611.

Distinguished Visitors: Consul-General of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, 1808.

Divisions: Casting vote, 1889.

Hansard: A member who sought to have her remarks on the public record had achieved her purpose, 2314.

Interjections, Interruptions and Disorder: A member was entitled to reply to a debate without interjections, 1642, 1789, 1887; and did not need encouragement, 495, or assistance, 1645, 1680.

A Minister had the call, 1042, 1802; was replying to a question, 1804, 1873; and should be heard in silence, 1611.

Members should cease interjecting, 1646, 1775. A member could not be listening and talking at the same time, 1805.

Members were asked to reduce the level of conversation, 1592, as it was difficult to hear.

Motions (See also *Procedure*): Each member speaking to a motion, other than the proposer, may speak for 10 minutes, 1250; and a member had exhausted his time for speaking.

Offensive and Objectionable Remarks, Imputations and Aspersion: An imputation as to the motives for moving that a bill be referred to a select committee had offended a member, 2092; and was withdrawn, 2093.

No imputation of improper motive was involved, as a Minister was dealing properly with matters raised in debate, 2094.

Points of Order: Points of order not involved, 405, 1718, 1776, 1811, 2094.

Points of order upheld, 1608, 1675.

A member's explanation when speaking to a point of order was accepted by another member who had asked that a remark be retracted, 1503.

Privilege: Communication from the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court regarding the issuing of process, 1584.

Procedure (See also *Motions*): The control of the business of the House was in the hands of the Government, 1811.

Legislation not the subject of debate should not be canvassed in contributions to a bill before the House, 1675.

Members at the back of the Chamber could not hear, 1776, and a member was asked to speak louder.

A member making a maiden speech would be extended the traditional courtesies, 1343, 1685, 1747.

A member may not ask questions about legislation at present before the House, 1608.

A question was ruled not to be supplementary, 1477.

It is not for the Chair to control the way in which a Minister replies to a question, 1718.

A Minister should be allowed to answer a question without interjection, 1726; and was told to answer, 1727.

Relevance: The framing of a motion made the debate necessarily wide-ranging, 405.

A member who had referred to the section of an Act was directed to address the bill before the House, 2314.

Though traditionally a member making a maiden speech was extended certain courtesies, the rule of relevance applied to other members, who must confine their remarks to the subject-matter of the debate, 494.

Remarks must be relevant to the question before the Chair, and a member had strayed from the issue, 407.

A member who quoted statistics to support a comparison between two pieces of legislation was close to having his contribution ruled to be not relevant, but had not yet breached the rule, 1776.

Chair: Members must address the Chair, 2002; and not turn their backs on the Chair, 467.

Divisions: Though in debate a member said that if his amendment were unsuccessful he would seek to have the parts of a motion put to the House seriatim under Standing Order 106, he failed to do so when the question was put and therefore was not able to do so once members had taken their stand in division, 1336.

Casting vote, 1336.

Documents: Incorporation of documents added to the cost of publication of *Hansard*, 2003. The source of documents available in the Parliamentary Library or elsewhere should be identified, but such documents should not be incorporated, 2003; though this was a matter for the House to decide, 2004.

Leave was not granted to incorporate material, 2004, and members were discouraged from seeking the incorporation of documents. Leave was not granted to incorporate a letter from the Clerk of the Parliaments, 2163.

Hansard: A member's remarks would be recorded in *Hansard*, 2310.

Interjections, Interruptions and Disorder: A Minister did not require assistance from members interjecting, 1986. Members should refrain from interjecting while a member was speaking to a point of order, 511.

A member was entitled to be heard in silence, 1318, 2011; it was common courtesy to give a Minister the attention due, 1369, as a member was entitled to courtesy. A Minister should be allowed to answer a question, 1257, 1370.

Motions: A motion for the adjournment of debate to a later hour was the property of the House, 2088.

Abortion, 1333.

Council, Legislative: Rulings, Observations and Opinions of the Chair (*continued*):

Offensive and Objectionable Remarks, Imputations and Aspersions: A reference to a vote of the House to establish a select committee as a nonsense was a reflection on the House, 2096; and standing orders provided that no member shall reflect upon any vote of the House except for the purpose of moving that such vote should be rescinded. Therefore, the reflection was withdrawn.

Personal Explanation: The Leader of the Opposition was advised to confine his remarks to the point of explanation, 1991. The primary intent of making a personal explanation was to explain a matter of a personal nature, 1992; it did not extend to refuting allegations of maladministration by a former Minister.

Points of Order: Points of order upheld, or upheld in part, 86, 439, 1992.

Points of order disallowed, 2305, 2321.

If a member had a point of order, he should come to it, 739; there was no basis in the point of order, as nothing in the standing orders required absolute veracity.

No point of order was involved, 512, 642, 739, 743, 2088, 2321.

While a member was speaking to a point of order another member should not seek to ask a supplementary question, 743. The standing orders to which reference had been made were not applicable to the point of order taken by a member, 743.

Presiding Officers: Under Standing Order 71 the Presiding Officer had the right to address the House on a motion for his removal; but lest he be seen not to be impartial, he did not intend to do so, 99.

Privilege: The serving of legal process on a member within the precincts of the Parliament would be investigated by the Chair and a report made to the House based on advice, 778. The established privileges of members would be affected if members were impeded in the pursuit of their parliamentary business within the precincts of the Parliament by being subjected to the service of process, which constituted a serious contempt of their rights and privileges, 953. The Chair reported the receipt of a communication from Mr David Patton, 1851.

As the House had already agreed to a sessional order that a notice of motion to disallow a statutory rule, instrument or document should be considered as business of the House, a notice of motion under general business became business of the House, 108.

A Minister was not replying to debate, as the motion had been moved by another member, 2088.

An amendment referred to in a second reading debate should be discussed at the Committee stage, 2068.

The Leader of the Government, having spoken in the debate, had to seek the leave of the House to speak again, 2088.

Questions Without Notice: A question was redirected when a Minister was not present in the Chamber, 626. A question commencing with an opinion was rephrased to conform with standing orders, 740.

A question seeking detailed amounts should more appropriately be placed on the notice paper, 747.

A Minister was asked whether he wished to respond to a question directed to the Chair, 744; and was capable of answering the question without assistance, 1261.

Relevance: A member was told to discuss the subject-matter of the debate, 86; but had not breached the standing orders on relevance, 943.
