Proclamation by His Excellency the Honorable Sir Frederick Matthew Darley, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of New South Wales and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

In pursuance of the power and authority vested in me as such Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, by virtue of the act intituled "An Act to confer a Constitution on New South Wales and to grant a Civil List to her Majesty," as assented to by her late Majesty under the authority of the Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the Session of the eighteenth and nineteenth years of the reign of her late Majesty, intituled "An Act to enable her Majesty to assent to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of New South Wales to confer a Constitution on New South Wales and grant a Civil List to her Majesty," I do hereby proclaim that a session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly for the State of New South Wales, for the despatch of business, shall commence and be holden on Tuesday, the twenty-third day of July instant, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the buildings known as the Legislative Council Chambers, in Macquarie-street, in the city of Sydney; and the members of the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal, at Sydney, this ninth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and one, and in the first year of his Majesty's reign.


