Proclamation by his Excellency The Right Honorable Frederic John Napier Baron Chelmsford, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the State of New South Wales and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

Whereas the Parliament of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the fifteenth day of June instant: Now I, Frederic John Napier Baron Chelmsford, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said State, do hereby further prorogue the said Parliament to Tuesday, the twenty-ninth day of June instant; and I do hereby further announce and proclaim that the said Parliament shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid twenty-ninth day of June instant, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the buildings known as the Legislative Council Chambers, situate in Macquarie-street, in the city of Sydney; and the Members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, respectively, are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal, at Sydney, this tenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine, and in the ninth year of his Majesty's reign.

# PUBLIC STATUTES OF THE SESSION.

TWENTY-FIRST PARLIAMENT-FOURTH SESSION.

Aborigines Protection Act (9 Ed. vii No. 25)-

An act to provide for the protection and care of aborigines; to repeal the Supply of Liquers to Aborigines Prevention Act; to amend the Vagrancy Act, 1902, and the Police Offences (Amendment) Act, 1908; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Wood, 18 November, 1909. Assented to, 20 December, 1909.]

APPROPRIATION ACT (9 ED. VII No. 17)-

An act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1909, to the 30th day of June, 1910, inclusive of both dates; to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, Consolidated Revenue Fund, 1908-1909," for supplementary charges during the period from 1st July, 1908, to 30th June, 1909, inclusive of both dates; to cover payments "Unauthorised in Suspense, Consolidated Revenue Fund," for urgent claims on account of services of the year 1908-9; to provide for public works and other services out of the Public Works Fund; and to provide for services out of the Closer Settlement Fund; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Waddell, 8 December, 1909. Assented to, 17 December, 1909.]

CLOSER SETTLEMENT AMENDMENT ACT (9 ED. VII No. 21)-

An act to regulate the sale of private land for closer settlement; to amend the Closer Settlement Act, 1904; the Closer Settlement (Amendment) Act, 1906; the Closer Settlement (Amendment) Act, 1907; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Moore, 27 August, 1909. Assented to, 20 December, 1909.]

CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND AND PUBLIC WORKS FUND ACT (9 Ed. VII No. 1)-

An act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund towards the services of the year 1909-1910, and out of the Public Works Fund; and for services to be hereafter provided for by loan [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Waddell, 16 July, 1909. Assented to, 23 July, 1909.]

Consolidated Revenue Fund and Public Works Fund Act No. 2 (9 Ed. vii No. 4)-

An act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund towards the services of the year 1909-1910; and out of the Public Works Fund; and for services to be hereafter provided for by loan. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Waddell, 30 September, 1909. Assented to, 1 October, 1909.]

CREMORNE TRAMWAY ACT (9 Ed. VII No. 12)-

An act to sanction the construction of an electric tramway from the Military-road, North Sydney, to Cremorne Point; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Lee, 18 November, 1909.] Assented to, 7 December, 1909.]

CROWN LANDS (IMPROVEMENT PURCHASE) ACT (9 Ed. VII No. 8)-

An Act to amend the Crown Lands Act of 1884, the Mining Act, 1906; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Moore, 11 November, 1909. Assented to, 26th November, 1909.]

DEFAMATION AMENDMENT ACT (9 ED. VII No. 22)-

An Act to amend the law of Defamation. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Wade, 29 July, 1909. Assented to, 20 December, 1909]

DENTISTS AMENDMENT ACT (9 ED. VII No. 27)-

An Act to amend the Dentists Act, 1900; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Wood, 23 November, 1909. Assented to, 23 December, 1909.]

FACTORIES AND SHOPS (AMENDMENT) ACT (9 ED. VII No. 20)-

An Act to amend the Factories and Shops Act of 1896; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Wade, 12 August, 1909. Assented to, 29 December, 1909.]

FIRE BRIGADES ACT (9 ED. VII No. 9)-

An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the prevention and extinguishing of fires; for the protection of life and property from fire; to constitute a Fire Brigades Board, and define its powers and duties; to provide that certain damage to property shall be damage by fire within the meaning of any fire insurance policy; to repeal the Fire Brigades Act, 1902, and to amend the Sydney Corporation Act, 1902, the City of Sydney Improvement Act, the Local Government Act, 1906, and other Acts; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initated in the Assembly by Mr. Wood, 28 July, 1909. Assented to, 1 December, 1909.]

FORESTRY ACT (9 ED. VII No. 6)-

An Act to provide for the dedication, reservation, and management of State forests and timber reserves; for regulating the obtaining and removing of timber and other products; for regulating saw-mills; for imposing fees, rents, and royalties; to regulate ringbarking; to amend the Crown Lands Act of 1884, the Crown Lands Amendment Act of 1905, the Crown Lands (Amendment) Act, 1908, the Mining Act, 1906, the Public Works Act, 1900, and the Impounding Act of 1898; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Perry, 29 July, 1909. Assented to, 11 November, 1909.]

IMPROVEMENT LEASES CANCELLATION (DECLARATORY) ACT (9 Ed. VII No. 3)-

An act to declare the law with respect to the revocation of reservations and with respect to preferential occupation licenses under the Improvement Leases Cancellation Act, 1906; to validate the setting apart of and applications for certain land under the Crown Lands Acts, and the confirmation of the same; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Moore, 1 September, 1909. Assented to, 1 October, 1909.]

INDUSTRIAL DISPUTES AMENDMENT ACT (9 ED. VII No. 26)-

An act to amend the Industrial Disputes Act, 1903; to prohibit certain monopolies, and certain contracts, agreements, and combinations in restraint of trade; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Wood, 17 December, 1909. Assented to, 20 December, 1909.]

INEBRIATES (AMENDMENT) ACT (9 Ed. VII No. 2)-

An act to amend the Inebriates Act, 1900; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Wade, 21 July, 1909. Assented to, 9 September, 1909.]

JUSTICES (AMENDMENT) ACT (9 ED. VII No. 24)-

An act to make further provision for the appointment of stipendiary magistrates and their deputies and of police magistrates; to amend the Liquor Act, 1898, the Small Debts Recovery Act, 1899, the Government Railways Act, 1901, the Justices Act, 1902, and the Public Service Act, 1902; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Wade, 29 September, 1909. Assented to, 20 December, 1909.]

LITHGOW SEWERAGE ACT (9 ED. VII No. 19)-

An act to sanction the construction of a system of sewerage for the Municipality of Lithgow; and for purposes consequent thereupon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Lee, 8 December, 1909. Assented to, 16 December, 1909.]

LOAN ACT (9 ED. VII No. 16)-

An act to authorise the raising of a Loan for Public Works and Services, and for other purposes.
[Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Waddell, 2 December, 1909. Assented to, 14 December, 1909.]

MOTOR TRAFFIC ACT (9 ED. VII No. 5)-

An act to provide for the regulation of motor vehicles and their drivers; to amend the Government Motor Omnibus Act, 1905; and for purposes incidental thereto or consequent thereon. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. J. Hughes, 29 June, 1909. Assented to, 12 October, 1909.]

Moree to Mungindi Railway Act (9 Ed. vii No. 10)-

An act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Moree to Mungindi; to authorise the construction of the said line on public roads; to amend the Public Works Act, 1900, so far as it relates to the making and maintaining of fences along the said line; to provide for the use of the said line by the constructing authority or by persons authorised by him; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Lee, 18 November, 1909. Assented to, 7 December, 1909.]

Morisser Hospital for the Insane Act (9 Ed. vii No 20)-

An act to sanction the erection of a hospital for the insane at Moriss t; and for purposes consequent thereupon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Lee, 10 December, 1909. Assented to, 16 December, 1909.]

Newcastle Northern Breakwater Extension Act (9 Ed. vii No. 11)-

An act to sanction the extension of Newcastle Northern Breakwater; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Lee, 18 November, 1909. Assented to, 7 December, 1909.]

PADDINGTON STREETS EXTENSION ACT (9 ED. VII No. 23)-

An act to divest the Metropolitan Board of Water Supply and Sewerage of certain lands, to vest them in the borough of Paddington for the purpose of constructing and opening certain public ways; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Oakes, 8 December, 1909. Assented to, 20 December, 1909.]

RAILWAY CROSSINGS ACT (9 ED. VII No. 13)-

An act to provide for the closing of certain level-crossings on the Government Railways, and the substitution therefor of bridges, subways, and other works; to declare certain portions of such bridges, subways, and works to be public thoroughfares; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Waddell, 11 November, 1909. Assented to, 14 December, 1909.]

SEAT OF GOVERNMENT SURRENDER ACT (9 Ed. vii No. 14)-

An act to provide for the surrender of territory in connection with the Seat of Government of the Commonwealth, and to ratify and confirm an agreement for that and other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Wade, 22 October, 1909. Assented to, 14 December, 1909.]

SYDNEY HARBOUR TRUST LAND TITLES ACT (9 Ed. VII No. 7)-

An act to provide for the issue of certificates of title to land vested in the Sydney Harbour Trust Commissioners; to amend the Real Property Act, 1900; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. J. Hughes, 28 July, 1909. Assented to, 11 November, 1909.]

TRUSTEES OF SHOW-GROUNDS ENABLING ACT (9 ED. VII No. 15)-

An act to enable trustees of show grounds to sell, lease, or mortgage certain lands; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Perry, 6 October, 1909. Assented to, 14 December, 1909.]

WESTERN LANDS ACT (AMENDMENT ACT) (9 ED. VII No. 18)-

An act to extend the term of office of the Commissioners of the Western Land Board of New South Wales. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Moore, 9 December, 1909. Assented to, 16 December, 1909.]



Defamation (Amendment) Bill: An amendment inconsistent with words just added to a clause could not be received, 3425.

Factories and Shops (Amendment) Bill: On the motion in Committee for the introduction of the bill, it was not competent to discuss details of the measure, 1198; a member could not discuss anything outside the scope of the measure, 3092; an amendment providing for the stamping of furniture was beyond the scope of the bill, 3408.

Financial Statement: It had always been the practice to allow members to debate almost any subject pertaining to any department in Committee of Ways and Means, 2758.

Fire Brigades Bill: If a vote were objected to on the ground of personal interest, the Committee could decide whether the vote should or should not be allowed, and that must be done by motion, 2227; a vote could only be challenged on the ground that a member had a private pecuniary interest, and a member could not possibly have any such interest in a board not yet established, therefore a motion to disallow certain votes was out of order, 2228; a member could not debate a whole clause in discussing an amendment, 2233; the Committee could only deal with matters referred to it by the House, and a point of order against an amendment made by the Council, and referred to the Committee for consideration on the ground that it was against the constitution and outside the scope of the bill, could not be upheld, 3223; it was not competent to discuss the doings of a previous Committee, 3224.

Forestry Bill: An amendment to omit all but the first word of a clause, with a view to substituting other words, was out of order, as it was tantamount to negativing the clause, 1312, 1327; an amendment adding to the clause dealing with the establishment of a forestry department, words defining the duties of director of forests was out of order and must be moved as a new clause, 1319; an amendment providing for classification as well as resumption of forest lands was in order, 1322; an amendment to prohibit the cutting of certain timber for export was out of order, 1575; a question of privilege could not be raised in Committee, 1308.

Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Bill: It was competent, on a motion of expediency, to show expediency, but not to impute motives to members, 4571, 4579; it was out of order to comment on matters sub judize, 4572; but it was permissible to refer to matters which could not be put in evidence, 4577; it was not in order to more than incidentally refer to the nationalisation of coal-mines, a matter beyond the scope of the bill, 4597; strangers in the galleries who made audible remarks must be removed, 4600.


