The Under Secretary for Lands may deal with certain matters on behalf of the Minister.

6A. The Under Secretary for Lands shall have power on behalf of the Minister to deal with such formal matters as may from time to time be prescribed; and, where in pursuance of this section a decision is given by the Under Secretary on behalf of the Minister, it shall have the same effect as if given by the Minister in person. Under Secretary may deal with matters.

Clauses 1 to 6 having been dealt with,—

Clause 7. (1) The office of a member shall be deemed to be vacant—

Vacancies.

- (a) if he becomes bankrupt or compounds with his creditors; or
- (b) if he is absent without leave of the board from three consecutive meetings of which due notice has been given to him either personally or by post; or
- (c) if he resigns his office by writing under his own hand addressed to the Governor;
- or
- (d) if he is removed from office by the Governor.

(2) The validity of any act or resolution of the board shall not be affected by any informality or irregularity in its constitution, and the fact that the office of any or every member is vacant shall not of itself operate to dissolve the corporation. ^{Validity of acts.} [Read.]

VETERINARY SURGEONS BILL (*continued*):—

Clauses 8 to 12 having been dealt with,—

Qualifications
for registration.

Clause 13. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, a person shall be entitled to be registered as a veterinary surgeon if he—

- (a) holds a degree in veterinary science, or a diploma or license of competency in veterinary surgery and medicine from the University of Sydney or the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons of Great Britain, or such other university, college, or school as may from time to time be prescribed, provided that the courses of instruction in veterinary science of such other university, college, or school extend over at least four academic years, and are of a standard equivalent to that of the University of Sydney; or
- (b) has practised veterinary science in New South Wales for a period of not less than one year during the five years immediately preceding the commencement of this Act and holds a degree, diploma or license granted by some veterinary college or school which required attendance throughout a veterinary curriculum extending over at least two academic years, and satisfies the board that he possesses the requisite knowledge and skill for the efficient practice of veterinary science.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this Act, a person who does not hold the requisite academic qualifications for registration as a veterinary surgeon shall be entitled to be registered if he satisfies the board that he—

- (a) has for five years immediately preceding the commencement of this Act, and subsequent to his attaining the age of twenty-one years, attended and treated animals for disease or injury in New South Wales, as a sole or "main" partial source of livelihood; or
- (b) has for not less than seven years immediately preceding the commencement of this Act, and subsequent to his attaining the age of twenty-one years, publicly and continuously attended and treated animals for disease or injury in New South Wales for fee or reward, on his own account, in a competent manner;
- (c) has for not less than four years immediately preceding the commencement of this Act, and subsequent to his attaining the age of twenty-one years, publicly and continuously attended and treated animals for disease or injury in New South Wales for fee or reward, and passes within one year from the commencement of this Act a written and practical examination in elementary veterinary science as prescribed;
- (d) was, at or prior to the commencement of this Act, an articled pupil or an assistant to a person qualified to be registered as a veterinary surgeon under this Act, and has completed a term of not less than five years as such pupil or assistant whether to one or more such persons, and passes the prescribed examination; or
- (e) is at the time of the passing of this Act employed as an inspector of stock in the Department of Agriculture, or as a dairy inspector in the Department of Public Health of this State, and holds the certificate of the Stock Board of Examiners issued under the provisions of the regulations made under the Pastures Protection Act, 1912;
- (e) at the time of the passing of this Act holds the certificate of the Stock Board of Examiners issued under the provisions of the Pastures Protection Act, 1912;
- (f) is registered as a veterinary surgeon under the provisions of any Act regulating the practice of veterinary surgeons in any other State or Territory of the Commonwealth:

Provided that the board is of the opinion that the qualification in respect of which such registration was granted under such other Act is of a standard substantially equivalent to the qualifications prescribed under this Act and that a person registered under this Act is by virtue of such registration and without further examination entitled to be registered under the Act regulating the practice of veterinary surgeons in such State or Territory.

(3) No person shall be entitled to be registered under the provisions of paragraph (b), subsection one, or paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), or (e) of subsection two of this section unless he applies to have his name recorded as a person entitled to the benefits of this section within six months from the commencement of this Act: Provided that the board, if satisfied that for some sufficient reason such person was unable to make such application within the said six months, may permit such application to be made at a later date.

(4) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, all absences on active military or naval service by a British subject may be accounted as part of the periods of practice mentioned in this section: Provided that such British subject prior to enlistment practised veterinary science in this State. [*Read.*]

Clause 25. (1) The board may for the purposes of this Act examine any person on oath or take a statutory declaration from any person, Power of board to examine on oath.

(2) If any such person wilfully makes any false statement or declaration, or utters or attempts to utter or put off as true before the board any false, forged, or counterfeit certificate, diploma, license, letter, testimonial, or other document, he shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months. 2. The Local Government Act, 1919, as amended by subsequent Acts, is amended as follows:—

- (1) By omitting section five hundred and ten, and by omitting paragraph (q) of section five hundred and thirteen;
- (2) by inserting the following Part next after Part XI:—

PART XIa.

ADVERTISEMENT HOARDINGS.

* * * * *

319j. An illuminated advertisement shall not be displayed by any person in any area, at a place which is within view of the navigable waters of the Port of Sydney or of the rivers falling into such Port or of any of their tributaries, unless and until the written consent of the Sydney Harbour Trust Commissioners has been obtained.

319k. Ordinances may be made for carrying out the provisions of this Part of this Act, and in particular for and with respect to—

- (a) regulating hoardings, advertisements and the display of advertisements;
- (b) excluding certain classes of signs and notices wholly and partially from the operation of this Part of this Act, and regulating such classes of signs and notices;
- (c) defining "billposters," and requiring billposters to be licensed (within the metropolitan police district by the Inspector-General of Police, and outside the metropolitan police district by the councils of shires and municipalities); and regulating and controlling billposters.

Any penalty imposed under any such ordinance relating to any sign or advertisement may be recovered from the person by or in consequence of whose order ~~in whose interest directly or indirectly~~ the sign or advertisement has been exhibited, as well as from the person by whom it has been exhibited.

POLICE REGULATION (APPEALS) BILL:—

Clause 6. (1) Any person who at the time of the decision of the Inspector-General hereinafter in this subsection referred to, is a member of the police force, if dissatisfied with any decision of the Inspector-General, made or given after the commencement of this Act, first day of January, 1920, in regard to the granting or refusal of promotion to him or the imposition upon him of any punishment where such punishment consists of the infliction of a fine, suspension, or reduction, whether in rank or pay, dismissal, "discharge," or transfer, may give notice of appeal from such decision in the prescribed manner: Such notice of appeal shall be given within thirty days after such decision becomes known to him or in respect of a decision given before the commencement of this Act, within three calendar months from the commencement of this Act.

(2) The secretary shall refer any such appeal to the board, and the board shall hear and consider any appeal so referred to it.

(3) Upon any such appeal being referred to the board the chairman shall fix a date and place for the hearing thereof, and shall give at least seven days notice to the parties of the date and place of such hearing.

(4) The board may, upon the application of either party, by summons under the hand of the secretary require any person to appear before the board and give evidence or require any person to produce to the board any books, documents, or writings in his possession or under his control.

(5) Upon the hearing of any appeal the board may take evidence upon oath and the chairman may admit in evidence any statement or document which, in his opinion, is relevant whether or not such statement or document is legal evidence.

(6) Any person summoned as aforesaid who fails to appear before the board or to produce to the board any books, documents, or writings, or refuses to give evidence, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

(7) The Inspector-General shall be entitled to be represented before the board upon the hearing of any appeal.

(8) The appellant may appear before the board in person, or may nominate a member of the police force any person to appear on his behalf, and any person appearing before the board may call and examine witnesses.

"(9) No barrister or solicitor shall be entitled to appear before the board."

Lieut.-Colonel Rutledge brought up a new Clause to follow Clause 28.

28a. The Liquor (Amendment) Act, 1919, as amended by subsequent Acts is further amended by omitting subsections 1 and 2 of section 22 and by inserting the following subsections:—

- (1) The compensation payable to the licensee shall in respect of each year or part of a year of the unexpired term of his tenancy (not exceeding three years) remaining at the date of the determination of the Board that his licensed premises shall be deprived of its license be—
 - (a) Where the licensee has been the licensee for a period of three years or more immediately before the said date a sum which is equal to the average annual net profits made by him during the three years immediately preceding the said date.
 - (b) Where the licensee has been the licensee for a period of less than three years but more than one year immediately before the said date *the sum which is equal to the net profits made by him during the year immediately before the said date.*
 - (c) Where the licensee has been the licensee for a period of less than a year before the said date a sum which is assessed by the Court as being the sum which the licensee would have made as net profits from his business had he been carrying on the same for the period of one year immediately before the said date regard being had in the assessment of such sum to all relevant circumstances, and so far as relevant to the actual net profits made by the licensee in the periods during which he so carried on the said business.
- (2) In determining the amount of such net profit the Board shall take into consideration the income earned by the licensee during the said period of three years or less, and for such purpose the licensee shall as and when required by the Board furnish to the Board a duplicate copy of any income-tax return made by him verified by a Statutory Declaration of such licensee, and it shall not be lawful for him to question or deny at any time the accuracy or truth of any statement in such verified copy. Any such licensee on applying to the Commissioner of Income Tax may inspect his own returns and make a copy thereof.

Provided further that if upon application made for the purpose to the said quarterly meeting of the Licensing Court as prescribed by regulations made under the Principal Act, the applicant can satisfy the Court that the public interest would be served to a greater degree by the grant of the license to some premises other than those in respect of which the petition was granted, but situated in the same area, the Licensing Court may so determine; and in that case the application for the license for such other premises shall be made to the quarterly meeting of the Licensing Court next following the meeting at which such determination was made.

Clause 4. The following additional provisions shall apply in the case of an indenture which is made in the United Kingdom:—

- (1) The indenture shall be executed on behalf of the Minister by the "Agent-General for New South Wales," or by an officer appointed by the Minister for the purpose.
- (2) It shall "not" be necessary to name in the indenture the employer of the juvenile.
