Rest riction on methods of shooting birds and animals.

Clause 21. (1) Any person who uses or carries for other than naval or military purposes a firearm having a greater length of barrel than ~~forty-two~~ **thirty-six** inches, or having a bore exceeding eight ten gauge (~~835 inch~~), or having more than two barrels, or being of a weight exceeding sixteen pounds avoirdupois, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

(2) Any person who, for the purpose of shooting any protected bird or animal,—

- (a) affixes to any boat, punt, or floating vessel of any kind a firearm of any description; or
- (b) loads with a charge exceeding four drachms of black gunpowder, or its equivalent in smokeless powder, or two ounces of shot, a firearm of any description; or
- (c) uses any gun or fowling-piece of a kind other than the kind which are habitually raised at arms' length and fired from the shoulder without other support,

shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

Forfeiture of firearms.

(3) Any firearm used in contravention of this section shall, on the conviction of the person so using it, be liable to be forfeited by the court, and to be disposed of as such court may direct. [*Read.*]

No. 1.

SEDITION BILL.

Clause 2. (1) Any person convicted of any offence mentioned in Part I of the Schedule hereto, committed after the commencement of this Act, shall, subject to the qualification therein contained, be disqualified for a period of five years from the date of such conviction, from being appointed to the Legislative Council, and from being nominated as a candidate at, and from voting at, any election of a member of the Legislative Assembly, or of the council of any municipality, including the city of Sydney, or of any shire.

Persons convicted of sedition or other offences disenfranchised.

The judge before whom any person is convicted of such an offence shall, as soon as practicable, issue a certificate of such conviction and the Chief Electoral Officer, who shall thereupon cause the name of such person to be struck off any roll of electors upon which it appears.

(2) If any person is convicted of an offence mentioned in Part II of the Schedule hereto, the Attorney General shall apply to the Supreme Court (sitting in Banco) for a declaration that such conviction was on evidence which would have supported an indictment for an offence mentioned in Part I of the Schedule as therein qualified.

(3) Upon the hearing of any such application the person so convicted may, if he has not already appealed from the conviction, apply to the court to have such conviction reviewed, and the court may thereupon either deal with the matter as an appeal from such conviction or both, and confirm, quash, or set aside the conviction, or may refer the matter to a Court of Quarter Sessions to be dealt with involving questions of fact or of law or justices under the Justices Act, conviction or order of a justice or quashed or set aside, either by the event of such conviction being such reference, the application by the Court of Quarter Sessions on shall be deemed to have been and shall be dismissed.

The Supreme Court, if it deals with the matter as an appeal as aforesaid, and decides that the conviction should be confirmed, or if it has referred the matter to a Court of Quarter Sessions, and has received a report from such court that it has determined that the conviction should be confirmed, shall thereupon deal with the application of the Attorney-General.

(4) If the Supreme Court makes the declaration applied for the person convicted shall be subject to the disqualification above set out in subsection one, and the court shall issue a certificate of such conviction and cause a copy thereof to be sent to the Chief Electoral Officer, who shall thereupon take the steps prescribed in subsection one.

(2) If any person is convicted, otherwise than on indictment, of an offence mentioned in Part II of the Schedule hereto, he may, within fourteen days after such conviction, apply in the prescribed manner to a judge of the Supreme Court for a declaration that the evidence upon which he was convicted would not have supported a conviction of an offence mentioned in Part I of such Schedule.

If the judge makes such a declaration the applicant shall not be subject to the disqualifications set out in subsection one hereof.

If the judge declines to make such a declaration the applicant shall, subject to the following provisions, suffer such disqualifications:

Provided that if the judge is satisfied that the applicant has not been previously convicted of any offence mentioned in the Schedule, or that there were extenuating circumstances, he may suspend the imposition of any such disqualification, and postpone the hearing of such application upon the applicant entering into a recognisance, with or without sureties, in such amount as the judge directs, such recognisance being conditioned that the applicant be of good behaviour for a period of twelve months from the date of such application. If at the expiration of such period the judge, on such postponed hearing, is satisfied that the conditions of such recognisance have been observed, he may declare the applicant freed from any such disqualifications. If he is not so satisfied, the applicant shall be subject to such disqualifications.

Upon the hearing or postponed hearing of any such application, the judge may allow any party to the application to call further evidence.

(3) An applicant shall give the Attorney-General notice in writing of his intention to make such application at least seven days before the hearing of such application.

Any person convicted on indictment of an offence mentioned in Part II of the Schedule hereto, and any person who, being entitled to apply under the above provisions, fails to so apply within the prescribed time, shall be subject to the disqualifications set out in subsection one.

(4) Where any person is convicted of any offence mentioned in the Schedule hereto, the clerk of the court before which he is convicted shall forthwith forward a certificate of such conviction to the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court, and when any person so convicted is or becomes subject to any disqualification by virtue of the provisions of this Act, the Prothonotary shall, as soon as practicable, cause a certificate to that effect to be sent to the Chief Electoral Officer, who shall upon receipt thereof take all such measures as are necessary to cause the name of such person to be struck off any roll of electors upon which it appears.

(5) The fact that a copy of the certificate hereinbefore prescribed is not sent to the Chief Electoral Officer, or that the name of the person convicted is not struck off any roll shall in no way affect the imposition of any disqualification hereunder.

(6) If any person so disqualified is, at the time such disqualification is imposed, a member of the Legislative Council or Legislative Assembly, or of the council of any municipality, including the city of Sydney, or of any shire, his seat shall thereupon become vacant. [*Read.*]

STAMP DUTIES (AMENDMENT), 1918.

Duties on Instruments.(8.) *Resolved*,—

There shall be charged, levied, collected, and paid for the use of His Majesty, under the provisions of the Stamp Duties Act, 1898, the Companies (Death Duties) Act, 1901, the Stamp Duties (Amendment) Act, 1904, the Stamp Duties (Amendment) Act, 1914, and this Resolution, and to form part of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for and in respect of the instruments and matters hereinafter mentioned, duties of the several amounts, and at the several rates therein specified.

- (a) *Bank Notes*.—There shall be payable quarterly to the Commissioner of Stamp Duties by every Bank an annual composition at the rate of forty shillings for every one hundred pounds and forty shillings for any remaining fraction of one hundred pounds upon the amount of notes stated to be in circulation in the return made by such Bank pursuant to the Banks and Bank Holidays Act, 1898.
- (b) Contracts of sale and conveyances on sale or exchange (sub-sales and conveyances by direction).

Where property is sold, but not conveyed, to any person, and is subsequently subsold to another person or other persons in succession as sub-purchasers, the instrument whereby each sale or subsale is effected shall be liable to ad valorem stamp duty as if it were a conveyance on sale to the purchaser and each sub-purchaser from his immediate vendor, and if the said duty is not paid on any of such instruments the amount of such unpaid duty, together with any fine or penalty payable in respect thereof, shall be paid as an additional duty on the conveyance to the ultimate purchaser.

Where a vendor of any property conveys the same by direction, whether written or oral, to any person other than the original purchaser, such conveyance shall set forth the consideration for any contract whether written or oral leading thereto, and shall be liable to additional duty equal in amount to the ad valorem duty which would have been payable if each of such contracts had been an actual conveyance on sale or voluntary disposition, as the case may be. This provision shall not apply to cases where each of such contracts has been duly stamped as hereinbefore provided.

(f) When on any division of profits made by any banking company the banker carries to the credit of any depositor or shareholder therein the amount payable to him on such division of profits, such transaction shall be considered a receipt liable to the duty on receipts under the Stamp Duties Acts.

(g) Schedule Two (exemptions) of the Stamp Duties Act, 1898, shall be amended by omitting the exemption as to acknowledgments or receipts for wages and inserting the following exemption :—“Any acknowledgment or receipt given for or on account of any salary or wages at a rate of less than £4 per week.”

(h) Ad valorem duty shall be paid on the value of any property the subject of a settlement, including deed of gift, voluntary conveyance, declaration of trust, or appointment under power, operating as a voluntary disposition *inter vivos*, together with all other property the subject of any other such instruments made at the same time or within twelve months prior thereto by the same settlor or donor in favour of the same beneficiary.

(i) Any conveyance operating as a voluntary disposition *inter vivos* shall be chargeable with stamp duty as if it were a conveyance on sale, with the substitution in each case of the value of the property conveyed for the amount or value of the consideration for the sale.

(j) Any disposition of property for partial consideration in money or money's worth shall, for the purposes of the Stamp Duties Acts, be deemed to be a voluntary disposition to the extent by which the full value of the property exceeds the partial consideration.

(k) Where any settlement or gift of any property is made in consideration or with the reservation of any benefit or advantage to or in favour of the settlor or donor, whether by way of any estate or interest in the same or any other property, or by way of mortgage or charge, or by way of any annuity or other payment, whether periodical or not, or by way of any contract, for the benefit of the settlor or donor, or by way of any condition or power of revocation or other disposition, or in any other manner whatsoever, whether that benefit or advantage is charged upon or otherwise affects the property comprised in the settlement or gift or not, no deduction or allowance shall be made in respect of that benefit or advantage in computing the value of the property settled or given, and such property shall be valued and duty shall be paid as if the settlement or gift had been made without any such consideration or reservation.

(l) The exemption contained in the Second Schedule to the Stamp Duties Act, 1898, as to any instrument of appointment shall be omitted.

(m) A share certificate shall be liable to the same duty as a scrip certificate under Schedule One to the Stamp Duties (Amendment) Act, 1914.

(n) That a fixed duty of £1 be paid on the written consent by an executor or administrator to a transmission application by a devisee or person entitled on intestacy.

Duties on estates of deceased persons.

(9.) Resolved,—

That towards raising the Supply to be granted to His Majesty,—

(a) In the case of a person dying hereafter and at the time of his death domiciled without New South Wales, where the final balance of his estate does not exceed £1,000, duty shall be payable thereon at the rate of £2 per centum.

(b) For the purposes of the assessment and payment of duty under the Stamp Duties Acts, the estate of a person dying hereafter shall be deemed to include and consist of the following classes of property :—

(i) (a) All property of the deceased which is situate in New South Wales at his death ; and

(b) all property of the deceased mentioned in section fifty-one of the Stamp Duties Act, 1898, but subject as in paragraph (e) of these resolutions mentioned.

to which any person becomes entitled under the will or upon the intestacy of the deceased, except property held by the deceased as trustee for another person under a disposition not made by the deceased.

(ii) All property which the deceased has disposed of, whether heretofore or hereafter, by will or by a settlement containing any trust in respect of that property, to take effect after his death, including a will or settlement made in the exercise of any general or special power of appointment, whether exercisable by the deceased alone or jointly with another person.

(iii) Any property comprised in any settlement or gift made by the deceased within three years before his death, and whether made heretofore or hereafter.

(iv) Any property passing under any settlement or gift made by the deceased whether heretofore or hereafter—

(a) by which an interest in or benefit out of or connected with that property, or in the proceeds of the sale thereof, is reserved either expressly or by implication to the deceased for his life or for the life of any other person, or for any period determined by reference to the death of the deceased or of any other person ; or

(b) which is accompanied by the reservation or assurance of, or a contract for, any benefit to the deceased for the term of his life or of the life of any other person, or for any period determined by reference to the death of the deceased or of any other person ; or

(c) by which the deceased has reserved to himself the right, by the exercise of any power, to restore to himself or to reclaim that property or the proceeds of the sale thereof.

(v) Any property comprised in any settlement or gift made by the deceased at any time, of which *bona fide* possession and enjoyment has not been assumed by the donee immediately upon the gift and thenceforth retained to the entire exclusion of the deceased, or of any benefit to him of whatsoever kind or in any way whatsoever.

(vi) Any property comprised in a *donatio mortis causa* made by the deceased at any time.

(vii)

- (vii) Any property which the deceased has at any time caused to be conveyed to or vested in himself and any other person jointly, so that the beneficial interest therein passes or accrues by survivorship to any person on the death of the deceased.
- (viii) Any property as to which the deceased has, whether heretofore or hereafter, given a power of appointment, unless it is proved that—
- (i) the person to whom the power has been given has received the rents, dividends, interest, or other income of such estate *bona fide* as his own from the date when such power was given; or
 - (ii) the said person has exercised such power at least three years before the death of the deceased.
- (ix) Any property which the deceased has three years before his death and whether heretofore or hereafter transferred to, or vested in, or caused to be transferred to or vested in a private company or some person in trust for any such company, in consideration of any shares or other interest including any office or place of profit therein.
- (x) Any money payable under a policy of assurance effected by the deceased on his life, whether heretofore or hereafter, where the policy is wholly kept up by him for the benefit of a beneficiary (whether nominee or assignee), or a part of that money in proportion to the premiums paid by him where the policy is partially kept up by him for such benefit.
- (xi) Any annuity or other interest purchased or provided by the deceased, whether heretofore or hereafter, either by himself alone or in concert or by arrangement with any other person, to the extent of the beneficial interest accruing or arising by survivorship or otherwise on the death of the deceased.
- (xii) Any property over or in respect of which the deceased had at the time of his death a general power of appointment.
- (xiii) Any property over or in respect of which the deceased had a special power of appointment, which property passed on his death as unappointed under the power to any other person.
- (xiv) Any property which on the death of the deceased passes to any other person under or by virtue of any agreement made by the deceased (whether heretofore or hereafter), to the extent by which the value of such property exceeds any consideration in money or money's worth receivable by the estate of the deceased under such agreement.
- (c) In computing the final balance of the estate of a person dying hereafter, no allowance shall be made—
- (i) for debts incurred by the deceased otherwise than for full consideration in money or money's worth wholly for his own use and benefit; or
 - (ii) for debts in respect whereof there is a right of reimbursement from any other estate or person, except to the extent to which reimbursement cannot be obtained; or
 - (iii) more than once for the same debt charged upon different portions of the estate; or
 - (iv) for contingent debts or any other debts the amount of which is in the opinion of the Commissioner incapable of estimation.
- (d) The allowance so to be made for debts shall extend to all debts whether incurred or payable in New South Wales or elsewhere, save that, where there are foreign assets, such portion only of the unsecured debts shall be allowed as bears the same ratio to the total unsecured debts as the value of the dutiable estate available for the payment of such debts of the deceased bears to the value of the total assets wherever situate, so available.
- (e) The estate of a person dying hereafter shall be deemed to include—
- (i) every share and all stock held by such person at the time of his death in any corporation, company, or society, whether registered or incorporated within or out of New South Wales, and carrying on the business of mining for gold or other minerals as defined in the Mining Act, 1906, in New South Wales, or of pastoral or agricultural production or timber-getting in New South Wales; and
 - (ii) every share held by such person in any corporation, company, or society having a share-register in New South Wales for any purpose whatever.
- (f) Where a member of any such company as is mentioned in section ten of the Companies (Death Duties) Act, 1901, dies hereafter, the exemption contained in paragraph (a) of the provisos to that section shall not be allowed, and that paragraph shall be omitted.
- (g) Duty at one-half the prescribed rate in favour of the widow and children of a person dying hereafter shall only be allowed where the final balance of the estate of the deceased, or the value of any part of his dutiable estate separately assessed, does not exceed £5,000 instead of £10,000 as provided by section 37 of the Stamp Duties (Amendment) Act, 1914.

Clause 10. (1) Any "three" or more persons who are qualified to make and to hold settlement purchases and who desire to purchase from the same owner any private lands may, upon entering into an agreement for that purpose with such owner, apply to the Minister to acquire the said lands under and subject to the provisions of this section: Provided that the Minister may authorise any one or more discharged soldiers or sailors, if duly qualified, to make any such application: ~~Provided also that an application shall not be allowed where the owner of the land and the person or persons desiring to purchase are members of the one family.~~ Applications to Minister to acquire private lands.

The land which any one of such persons so desires to purchase shall not exceed in value two thousand five hundred pounds, unless there are useful improvements on the land, in which case the value shall not exceed three thousand pounds. Not more than three hundred pounds shall be allowed as the value of any dwelling-house on the land.

(2) Such agreements and applications shall be in the prescribed form, and shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

(3) Provided that for the purposes of this section the provisions of paragraph (b) of section twenty-six of the Closer Settlement Act, 1904, shall not operate to disqualify an applicant merely on the ground that the land he desires to purchase is held by him as a tenant with a right to purchase. [*Read.*]

Clause 99. (1) The provisions of this section shall apply to town or shire clerks, engineers, health inspectors, ~~and overseers, and such other servants as may be prescribed.~~

(2) Where the council proposes to terminate the employment of any such servant it shall either order an inquiry hereunder or suspend him.

(3) Where any such servant is suspended the council shall state the reasons for the suspension.

(4) Within one week after suspension the servant may (if an inquiry hereunder has not already been held) apply to the council for an inquiry. Thereupon the council shall order an inquiry. If the servant does not apply for an inquiry the council may proceed to determine the matter.

(2) The power to trade in any article or commodity (including the supply of power) shall include the power to purchase, generate, manufacture, or obtain the article or commodity for the purpose of sale or hire.

(3) The Governor may, by ordinance, prescribe—

- (a) what shall be deemed to be a separate trading undertaking; and
- (b) that any undertaking of the council within the powers granted by this Act shall be a trading undertaking.

(4) The council may extend any of its trading undertakings mentioned in paragraphs (a) (b) (c) (d) (e) and (f) of subsection one of this section, into any other area, if the consent of the council of that area is obtained to such extension and subject to such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon.

(iii) By adding at the end of subsection four the following words:—"and on such occasions five members, including the president, shall form a quorum"; and

(iv) By the addition of the following subsections:—

(5) When the Board of Trade is exercising the powers and functions conferred upon it by this Act other than those specified in sections seventy-nine and eighty, it may sit in two divisions, and on such occasions three members, of whom the president or deputy-president shall be one, shall form a quorum.

(6) The Governor may appoint any judge to act as president during the illness or absence from duty of the president. Any judge so appointed shall, during the term of his appointment, have all the powers and perform all the duties of the president. [Considered.] In case of illness, &c., of president.

Clause 4. (1) Every person suffering from any venereal disease, or suspecting that he is so suffering, shall within three days of becoming aware of his condition, consult a medical practitioner thereon, "furnish his correct name, occupation, and address to such practitioner," and place himself under treatment by such practitioner, or shall attend at some hospital or other place prescribed for the purpose and place himself under treatment thereat.

(2) Any person contravening this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty one hundred pounds or imprisonment for a period not exceeding three months.

(3) Any medical practitioner who otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Act communicates to any person or in any other way makes known the name or address of any such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds, and shall be deemed to be guilty of professionally infamous conduct.

Clause 3. PART II of the Principal Act is amended as follows:—

(i) By inserting immediately before section four the following section:—

3A. (1) The members of the Legislative Assembly shall, at the next and subsequent general elections and in the case of any seat in such assembly becoming vacant after any such general election, be elected in accordance with the principles of proportional representation.

(2) The Governor may make regulations prescribing the method of voting and of counting the votes of any such election.

Such regulations shall be laid before the Legislative Assembly within seven days after the meeting thereof if Parliament is sitting, and if Parliament is not sitting then within seven days after the next meeting of Parliament, and upon the carrying of a resolution by such Assembly in approval thereof, and upon their publication in the Gazette, they shall have the force of law.

(iv) Section twelve, by omitting the words "ninth" and "fourth," and inserting in lieu thereof respectively the words "eleventh" and "sixth."

13. It shall be the duty of the commissioners, and they are hereby directed, to distribute New South Wales into electoral districts for the purposes of this Act, whenever directed by the Governor by proclamation in the Gazette; "and in the event of the Governor not so directing, then such distribution shall take place after the expiration of nine years from the date of the last redistribution."

"Provided that the first distribution under this Act shall be completed not later than the thirtieth day of June one thousand nine hundred and nineteen."
