## WINNING BETS TAXATION (MANAGEMENT) BILL:—

Clause 1 having been dealt with,—

Clause 2. In this Act, unless the context or subject-matter otherwise indicates or requires,— Interpretation.

“Backer” means any person who makes a bet with a bookmaker.

“Bet” means any stake, pledge, or wager in money made between a backer and a bookmaker upon any event or contingency of or relating to a horse race.

“Horse race” includes pony race and trotting contest.

“Bookmaker” includes any person who carries on the business of or acts as a bookmaker or turf commission agent, or who gains or endeavours to gain his livelihood wholly or partly by betting or making wagers.

“Winning bet” means a bet which is won by a backer, and “amount of each winning bet” includes the amount staked, pledged, or wagered by the backer, as well as the amount payable by the bookmaker in respect of the bet.

Motion made (*Mr. Pollack*) to leave out the words “the amount staked, pledged, or wagered by the backer, as well as” on lines 13-14, and add after the word “bet” on line 15, the words “but does not include the amount staked, pledged, or wagered by the backer.”

## MORATORIUM BILL:—

Clauses 1 and 2 having been dealt with,—

Clause 3. This Act shall not apply to any fluctuating advance exceeding three thousand pounds which is made by way of bank overdraft secured by a mortgage, unless the court, upon the application of the mortgagor, determines that, having regard to the matters mentioned in subsection four of section four of this Act, it is desirable that this Act should apply.

[Read.]

"(1.) This Act shall not bind the Crown, nor shall it bind any statutory body representing the Crown.

In this subsection the expression 'statutory body representing the Crown' includes the Sydney Harbour Trust Commissioners, the Railway Commissioners for New South Wales, the Commissioners of the Government Savings Bank of New South Wales, and any public body which the Governor may by Proclamation published in the *Gazette* declare to be a statutory body representing the Crown."

MORATORIUM BILL.—(continued):—

Limitation  
of rights of  
mortgagees.

Clause 4. (1.) A mortgagee shall not, without leave of the court—

- (a) call up or demand payment from any mortgagor of **the whole or any part** of the principal sum secured by the mortgage;
- (b) exercise any power of sale;
- (c) commence any action or proceeding, or continue any action or proceeding commenced after the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, for breach of any covenant, agreement, or condition expressed or implied in any mortgage other than a covenant, agreement, or condition for—
  - (i) the payment of interest; or
  - (ii) the insurance, maintenance, or cultivation of the mortgage property, or the payment of rates, taxes, and other charges, or the doing of any acts for the preservation of the security;
- (d) commence any action or proceeding, or continue any action or proceeding, commenced after the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, for interest at any rate higher than the rate provided in the mortgage or the rate payable under subsection five of this section as the case may be; or
- (e) take any steps for obtaining foreclosure or possession or occupation:

Provided that where interest is in arrear for not less than "twelve" months or the mortgagor fails to observe the provisions of any covenant, agreement, or condition expressed or implied in the mortgage for any of the matters specified in subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (c) of this subsection, nothing in this subsection shall preclude the mortgagee from entering into possession of the mortgaged property, but in any such case the mortgagor may at any time within three months after the mortgagee has entered into possession apply to the court for an order requiring the mortgagee to vacate the mortgaged property, and in the event of the application being granted by the court the mortgagee shall vacate the mortgaged property in accordance with the order of the court.

## STATE LOTTERIES BILL:—

Clauses 1 to 3 having been dealt with,—

Clause 4. (1.) The Colonial Treasurer shall cause a special deposits account to be opened in the Treasury, to which all moneys received from the sale of tickets in, or from the promotion and conduct of, any State lottery shall be paid.

In respect of each lottery an amount sufficient to meet payment of all prizes apportioned to that lottery shall be retained in the account and the balance carried to Consolidated Revenue Fund.

(2.) All other receipts under this Act shall be paid into the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

## WAYS AND MEANS (Unemployment Relief Tax):—

*Resolution:—*

(3.) *Resolved*.—That in lieu of the Unemployment Relief Tax imposed by the Unemployment Relief (Tax) Act, 1930, there shall be charged, levied, collected, and paid for the use of His Majesty and for credit of the Unemployment Relief Fund under the provisions of the Prevention and Relief of Unemployment Act, 1930, as amended by the Prevention and Relief of Unemployment (Amendment) Act, 1930, and the regulations made thereunder, and subject to the exemptions in that Act as so amended contained, Unemployment Relief Tax at the rates following, namely:—

(a) seven and one-half pence in the pound of the net assessable income derived by any person other than a company during the income year ending upon the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty (or such other period accepted by the Commissioner under the provisions of the Income Tax (Management) Act, 1928, as amended by subsequent Acts, in lieu thereof);

- (b) seven and one-half pence in the pound of the net assessable income derived by every company during the income year ending on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty (or such other period as may be accepted by the Commissioner under the provisions of the Income Tax (Management) Act, 1928, as amended by subsequent Acts, in lieu thereof);
- (c) threepence in the pound of the income from employment derived by every person other than a company during the income year commencing on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, if such income is derived prior to the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and one shilling in the pound of such income if derived on or after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one.

Further, that the expressions in this resolution shall have the meanings ascribed thereto in the Prevention and Relief of Unemployment Act, 1930, as amended by the Prevention and Relief of Unemployment (Amendment) Act, 1930.

Clause 1 having been agreed to,—

Clause 2. The Principal Act is amended as follows:—

- (b) (i) by omitting from subsection one of section five the words "a representative number (not being less than one hundred or one-half the number of producers when that number does not exceed one hundred and fifty) of the producers of any product" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "at least one hundred of the producers of a particular product or where the number of producers of that product does not exceed one hundred and fifty by at least one-half of the total number of producers of the product";
- (ii) (a) by omitting from subsection three of the same subsection the word "two-thirds" where firstly occurring and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "one-half";
- (b) by omitting from the same subsection the word "two-thirds" where secondly occurring and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "three-fifths";
- \* \* \* \* \*
- (vi) (a) by omitting from subsection twelve of the same section the words "a representative number (not less than one hundred or one-half the number of producers where that number does not exceed one hundred and fifty) of the producers producing the commodity within the area for which it has been declared a commodity" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "at least one hundred of the producers producing a particular commodity within the area for which it has been declared a commodity or where the number of producers of the commodity in that area does not exceed one hundred and fifty of at least one-half of such producers";
- (b) by omitting from the same subsection the word "two-thirds" and, by inserting in lieu thereof the word "three-fifths"; also by inserting in the same subsection after the word "proclamation" where firstly occurring the words "made at any time within twelve months after the date of the poll."

(1) Subject to this Act, the compensation to be paid for any flour <sup>Compensation for flour.</sup> acquired by or vested in His Majesty under this Act shall be the fair and reasonable price of flour of a similar grade or quality at the date of vesting or acquisition as fixed by a committee (in this Act referred to as "the Committee").

(2) The Committee shall consist of the Minister, together with a member appointed by the executive of the Flour Millers' Millowners' Association of New South Wales, a member appointed by the executive of the Master Bakers' Association, and two officers of the Department of Agriculture appointed by the Minister. The Minister shall be the chairman, and the decision of a majority, consisting of at least three, shall be deemed the decision of the committee.

If either of the executives of the said associations does not, within seven days after the commencement of this Act, notify to the Minister the name of the member elected by it to serve on the committee, the Governor may appoint a member of such association so failing to notify to so serve. Any vacancy occurring by death or resignation shall be filled in the prescribed manner.

~~The members of the committee elected by the executives of, or appointed from the members of, the said associations, shall be paid such fees as are prescribed.~~

Clause 5. In this Act, unless the context otherwise indicates:—

Definitions.

“Apprentice” means an employee under twenty-one years of age who is serving a period of training under an indenture or other written contract for the purpose of rendering him fit to be a qualified worker in an industry.

“Award” means award made or deemed to have been made under this Act, and includes a variation of such award.

“Calling” means craft or other occupation.

“Commission” means the Industrial Commission of New South Wales established by this Act.

“Commissioner” means the Industrial Commissioner appointed under this Act.

“Committee” means a conciliation committee established or deemed to have been established under this Act.

“Employee” means person employed in any industry, whether on salary or wages or piece-work rates, or as member of a butty gang, and shall include an outworker, an insurance agent, canvasser, or collector, and a commercial traveller.

“Employee” shall also include any person other than the employer who does any work of a similar nature to the work done by an employee, but shall not include a member of a family in the employment of a parent.

\* \* \* \* \*

“Industrial matters” means matters or things affecting or relating to work done or to be done, or the product of such work, or the privileges, rights, or duties of employers or employees, or of persons who intend or propose to be employers or employees in any industry, not involving questions which are or may be the subject of proceedings for an indictable offence; and shall include any matter which may be the subject of any agreement between employer and employee; and, without limiting the ordinary meaning of the above definition, includes also all or any matters relating to—

\* \* \* \* \*

(f) the times to be regarded as overtime, including any claim to restrict work before or after certain hours, or on certain days, whether such work is done by an employer, employee, or other person;

\* \* \* \* \*

(g) any other matter which the commission or a committee may determine to be an industrial matter.

\* \* \* \* \*



"Industry" means craft, occupation, or calling in which persons of either sex are employed for hire or award, and unless otherwise indicated by the context or any provisions of this Act any division of an industry or combination, arrangement, or grouping of industries.

Without in any way limiting the above definition, the term "industry" includes domestic service.

- (d) by inserting after subsection four of section nineteen the following new subsection:—
- (4A) No person shall within the district, except with the consent of the board, sell or attempt to sell or expose for sale or allow or cause to be sold or exposed for sale for human consumption any carcase or portion of a carcase which has been slaughtered within or brought into the district otherwise than in accordance with this Act.

(1) A company carrying on insurance business in the State at the commencement of this Act shall within three months after such commencement deposit with the Treasurer, in respect of each class of insurance business carried on by the company, the sum or sums of money determined in accordance with the Schedule to this Act, or shall within such period of three months cease to carry on insurance business in the State:

Provided that where the Treasurer is satisfied that compliance with the provisions of this subsection would press unduly upon the resources of a company carrying on insurance business in the State at the commencement of this Act, he may by writing permit the amount of the initial deposit required by the provisions of this Act, to be made by instalments by any such company, as follows:—

- (a) One quarter within three months of the commencement of this Act;
- (b) One quarter within nine months of the commencement of this Act;
- (c) One quarter within fifteen months of the commencement of this Act;
- (d) One quarter within twenty-four months of the commencement of this Act.

(2) A company not carrying on insurance business in the State at the commencement of this Act (whether formed before or after the commencement of this Act) shall, if it desires to carry on insurance business in the State, and before commencing to carry on any insurance business in the State, deposit with the Treasurer, in respect of each class of insurance business proposed to be carried on by the Company, a sum or sums of money determined in accordance with the Schedule to this Act.

[Read.]

“Notwithstanding anything in this Act, the obligation imposed by this Act upon a company to deposit with the Treasurer any specific sum of money may be satisfied in whole or in part by the deposit by the company of securities of equal value issued or guaranteed by the Government or the Parliament of the State or of the Commonwealth.”

## WAYS AND MEANS—EMERGENCY INCOME TAX BILL (Resolution):—

Message from Governor read,—

Resolution proposed,—

- (18) *Resolved*.—That towards raising the Supply to be granted to His Majesty there shall be charged, levied, collected, and paid for the use of His Majesty and for credit of the Consolidated Revenue Fund under the provisions of the Emergency Income Tax (Management) Act, 1931, and the regulations thereunder, and subject to the exemptions in that Act contained, Emergency Income Tax, as follows:—

  - (iii) any internal combustion engine or engines having an area of cylinder or combined area of cylinders not exceeding two hundred square inches;
  - (iv) any pump not capable of pumping more than six thousand gallons per hour;
  - (v) any appliance or device containing any gas for lighting or heating or motive power purposes and forming portion of any system of reticulation for such gas and includes any retort, holder, receiver, pipe or other part of a like kind used for such purposes.

Clause 9. (1) In determining the fair rent the court shall first ascertain the capital value of the building or part of building.

Determination of fair rent.

Such capital value shall be the unimproved value of the land, being the capital sum which the fee simple of the land might be expected to realise if offered for sale on such reasonable terms and conditions as a bona fide seller would require, assuming that the improvements, if any, thereon or appertaining thereto had not been made, plus the estimated cost of erecting a similar building or part of building thereon at the time of the receipt by the court of the application to fix the fair rent, less such fair and reasonable sum as may be estimated for any depreciation.

(2) The court shall determine the fair rent at a rate of not less than the rate of interest which is for the time being charged upon overdrafts by the Commonwealth Bank of Australia and not more than one and a half per centum above such last-mentioned rate, on the capital value of the building or part of building determined as aforesaid, plus the annual rates on the same, plus the amount estimated to be required annually for repairs (including painting), maintenance, and renewal, and plus the amount of any insurance premium, and plus an amount estimated to be the annual depreciation in value of the building or part of building if such depreciation diminishes its letting value.

11. (1) On complaint on oath being made to any justice that any person has disobeyed or not complied with an order made under this Act such justice may summon such person or issue his warrant for the apprehension of such person to answer such complaint. Disobedience  
of order.

(2) Any two justices may at any time in a summary way inquire into any such complaint, and may enforce compliance with the order by the committal of the offender to prison for a period of *one* day for every four shillings or part of four shillings found to be due, including the costs incidental to the hearing of the complaint, unless the said order be complied with; but no offender shall be detained for a longer period than *twelve* months, and the period of detention shall in every case be subject to the provisions of section ninety-four of the Justices Act, 1902.

Subject to the provisions of the ~~Deserted Wives and Children Amending Act, 1913~~, **section 16A of the Prisons Act, 1899**, the period of imprisonment served by an offender in accordance with the provisions of this subsection shall not be deemed to discharge the arrears for the non-payment of which he has been committed, but during such period the order for payment of maintenance shall be deemed to be suspended. **No offender shall be liable to be imprisoned a second time for any arrears for which he shall have actually suffered imprisonment as provided in this subsection, but such arrears shall thereafter be a civil debt only, recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction by the complainant to whom such arrears are due.**

Where it appears that the amount of arrears has been paid since the service of the summons or the issue of a warrant the justices may order the person summoned or apprehended to pay the costs of and incidental to the proceedings, and such costs may be recovered in a summary way under the provisions of the Justices Act, 1902.

**PUBLIC SERVICE SALARIES BILL (consideration of Legislative Council's amendments):—**

Motion made (*Mr. Lang*), That the Legislative Council's amendments be disagreed with.

Clause 3. In this Act, unless the context or subject-matter otherwise requires,—

\* \* \* \* \*

“Officer” means a person whose salary is provided for or paid out of any annual or special or permanent appropriation of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, the Special Deposits Account, the General Loan Account, or any trust or special fund or account constituted or established by any Act as payment for personal services rendered by any officer employed in the service of the Government of New South Wales.

\* \* \* \* \*

Definitions

But the term does not include—

His Excellency the Governor;

the Private Secretary to His Excellency the Governor;

or any person who by the terms of his employment is not required to give his whole time to the duties of his employment and whose salary for such employment does not exceed two-hundred-and-sixty pounds per annum or a rate of wages paid at hourly, daily, or weekly rates or by piecework equivalent to that amount.

Deduction  
from salaries.

Clause 4. (1) Subject to this section, during the period in which this Act is in force, the following provisions shall, notwithstanding any Act, have effect—

- (a) in the case of any officer whose salary exceeds two hundred and sixty pounds per annum but does not exceed five hundred pounds per annum, the salary shall be paid less a deduction at the rate of twenty per centum:

Provided that where by rationing of employment, reduction is made in the salary of any officer, the officer shall be given credit for the amount of such reduction as against the deduction to be made under this paragraph:

Provided further that no salary of an adult officer shall by operation of this section be reduced below a rate of five pounds per week or two hundred and sixty pounds per annum;

- (b) in the case of any officer whose salary exceeds five hundred pounds per annum—

- (i) the salary shall be paid less a reduction at the rate of twenty per centum or a deduction of the amount by which the salary exceeds five hundred pounds, whichever deduction is the greater; and

- (ii) where the salary of an officer exceeds six hundred and fifty pounds per annum the officer shall be liable to pay State income tax in respect of his income derived from his salary during the income year ending on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, as if his income derived from his salary did not exceed five hundred pounds; and the officer shall not be liable to Unemployment Relief Tax in respect of his salary:

Provided that where by rationing of employment, reduction is made in the salary of any officer, the officer shall be given credit for the amount of such reduction as against the deduction to be made under this paragraph.

**The salary of every officer shall be reduced as follows:—**

**By fifteen per centum on that part of the salary which does not exceed two hundred pounds per annum.**

**By seventeen and one-half per centum on that part of the salary which exceeds two hundred pounds per annum but does not exceed four hundred pounds per annum.**

**By twenty per centum on that part of the salary which exceeds four hundred pounds per annum but does not exceed six hundred pounds per annum.**

**By twenty-two and one-half per centum on that part of the salary which exceeds six hundred pounds per annum but does not exceed eight hundred pounds per annum.**

**By twenty-five per centum on that part of the salary which exceeds eight hundred pounds per annum and does not exceed one thousand pounds per annum.**

**By twenty-seven and one-half per centum on that part of the salary which exceeds one thousand pounds per annum and does not exceed one thousand five hundred pounds per annum.**

By thirty-two and one-half per centum on that part of the salary which exceeds one thousand five hundred pounds per annum.

Provided that by the operation of this Act—

- (1) Salaries of which the rate does not exceed two hundred and fifteen pounds per annum or four pounds two shillings and sixpence a week shall not be reduced by more than ten per centum.
- (2) Salaries of which the rate exceeds two hundred and fifteen pounds per annum shall not be reduced below one hundred and ninety-four pounds per annum.

Provided further that to every—

- (1) Married male officer,
  - (2) Widower with dependent child or children,
  - (3) Widow with dependent child or children,
- whose salary does not exceed the rate of three hundred pounds per annum, there may, with the approval of the Governor, be granted by way of marriage allowance a rebate at a rate not exceeding fifteen pounds per annum from the deduction above prescribed. Salaries of which the rate exceeds three hundred pounds per annum shall not be reduced below two hundred and sixty-eight pounds per annum.

Where by rationing of employment reduction is made in the salary of any officer, the officer shall be given credit for the amount of such reduction as against the reduction to be made under this Act.

(2) This section shall extend to the allowances and salaries reduced by the Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries Act, 1930, and the persons receiving such allowances or salaries shall be deemed to be officers within the meaning of this Act.

(3) This section shall apply in respect of a person notwithstanding that he is wholly or partially paid at hourly, daily, or weekly rates, or by piecework, which payments shall be included in the salary of such person for the purposes of this Act.

INSURANCE COMPANIES DEPOSITS BILL (*Consideration of Legislative Council's Amendments*):—

The amendment in clause 2 having been dealt with.

Amendment in clause 3.

Clause 3. (1) A company carrying on insurance business in the State at the commencement of this Act shall within three months after such commencement deposit with the Treasurer, in respect of each class of insurance business carried on by the company, the sum or sums of money determined in accordance with the Schedule to this Act, or shall within such period of three months cease to carry on insurance business in the State.

Deposit with Treasurer by insurance companies.

Provided that where the Treasurer is satisfied that compliance with the provisions of this subsection would press unduly upon the resources of a company carrying on insurance business in the State at the commencement of this Act, he may by writing permit the amount of the initial deposit required by the provisions of this Act, to be made by instalments by any such company as follows:—

- (a) One quarter within three months of the commencement of this Act;
- (b) One quarter within nine months of the commencement of this Act;
- (c) One quarter within fifteen months of the commencement of this Act;
- (d) One quarter within twenty-four months of the commencement of this Act.

(2) A company not carrying on insurance business in the State at the commencement of this Act (whether formed before or after the commencement of this Act) shall, if it desires to carry on insurance business in the State, and before commencing to carry on any insurance business in the State, deposit with the Treasurer, in respect of each class of insurance business proposed to be carried on by the company, a sum or sums of money determined in accordance with the Schedule to this Act.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in this Act, the obligation imposed by this Act upon a company carrying on insurance business to deposit with the Treasurer any specific sum of money may be satisfied in whole or in part by the deposit by the company of securities of equal value issued, or guaranteed by the Government or the Parliament of the State or of the Commonwealth.

Alternative method of giving security for general insurance companies.

(4) The value of any such securities shall, for the purposes of this section, be deemed to be the face value thereof: Provided that, if the market value of any securities deposited by a company under this section is at any time below par, the Treasurer may, at his discretion, and from time to time, require the company to deposit further securities to such an amount that the total market value of all the securities deposited by the company equals the total amount of the deposit required to be made by the company under this Act.

(5) Every security deposited with the Treasurer under this section shall (unless it is negotiable) bear or be accompanied by an assignment in blank executed by the company making the deposit.

(6) Every reference in this Act to the sum of money required to be deposited with the Treasurer shall be deemed to include, *mutatis mutandis*, a reference to any securities substituted in whole or in part therefor under the authority of this section, and the Treasurer may, if he thinks fit, convert any such securities into money by sale, hypothecation or otherwise for the purpose of satisfying any final judgment against the company making the deposit prescribed by this Act.

(7) All interest accruing due on securities deposited shall be paid to the company depositing such securities as and when received by the Treasurer.

(8) If it is proved to the satisfaction of the Treasurer that any company has acquired the share capital or the business of any other company a deposit as required by this Act by the acquiring company shall, if the Treasurer so certifies, be a sufficient compliance with the requirements of the Act.

(9) For the purpose of computing the deposit required to be lodged by the acquiring company the premium income of that company shall be deemed to be the sum of the premium incomes of the acquiring company and of the company whose share capital or business has been acquired.

(10) Any company, person, or association of persons (hereinafter called brokers) granting cover or receiving premiums, proposals, or requests in respect of general insurance business on behalf of or for transmission to any company, person, or association of persons outside the State (hereinafter called the insurers) shall be deemed for the purposes of this Act to be a company carrying on in the State the insurance business to which the cover proposals, requests, or premiums relate, and such broker shall make deposits of cash or securities under this Act accordingly. If several brokers act in respect of the granting of such cover or in the doing of any of the Acts aforesaid for one insurer or group or groups of insurers the business deemed to be carried on by them under this section shall be regarded as a single insurance business, and the amount of any deposit required to be made under this Act shall be calculated accordingly.

(1) The Railway Commissioners for New South Wales, the Metropolitan Transport Trust, and the Tramways Management Board shall make such adjustments in the rank, position, or grade, the seniority and the rates of pay of their officers as will enable them to place as soon as practicable but not later than three months from the commencement of this Act those officers who were affected by the Government Railways Amendment (Officers) Act, 1929, in the rank, position, or grade with the seniority and rates of pay they would at the date the adjustment takes effect have had if the Government Railways Amendment (Officers) Act, 1929, had not been enacted.

(2.) (3) The first meeting of the commissioners so appointed shall be held on the date of the commencement of this Act, and at that meeting or an adjournment thereof the order of retirement of the commissioners shall be determined.

(4) As soon as is reasonably practicable after the commencement of this Act the commissioners so appointed shall proceed to elect by a majority of votes one of their number to be president, and another to be vice-president.

[Read.]

(1) This Part of this Act shall be read and construed subject to the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, and so as not to exceed the legislative power of the State to the intent that where any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid the remainder of this Act and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected.

77. (1) No person shall sell any goods to which this section applies unless there is conspicuously appended to the goods themselves, or if so prescribed, to any covering, label, reel, or thing used, or any placard required by the regulations to be used, in connection therewith, in such manner as is prescribed, the full name and complete address of the manufacturer and the State, country, or place of origin of the goods and a trade description of such character, and relating to such matters as is prescribed, and a trade description of such character and relating to such matters as is prescribed, and, if the goods were manufactured within the Commonwealth, the State or Territory of origin of the goods, and, if the goods were not manufactured within the Commonwealth, the country or place of origin of the goods.

The Governor may in like manner revoke, amend, alter, or vary any such proclamation.

(4) The regulations shall not prescribe a trade description which discloses trade secrets of manufacture or preparation, except in any case where, on the ground that the disclosure is necessary for the protection of the health or well-being of the public, the Board of Health so recommends.

Clauses 1 to 5 having been dealt with,—

Clause 6. (1) This Act shall apply to every producing district and to every milk distributing district established under this Act. Application of Act.

(2) The areas set out in the First Part of the Schedule to this Act shall be the producing district for the metropolitan milk distributing district.

(3) The areas set out in the Second Part of the Schedule to this Act together with the Port of Sydney as defined in the Sydney Harbour Trust Act, 1900-1930, shall be the metropolitan milk distributing district.

(4) The Governor may from time to time by proclamation published in the Gazette establish any new milk distributing district, and define the producing district for such milk distributing district.

Every such proclamation shall amend the Schedule to this Act—

(a) by adding to the Second Part thereof the name of the milk distributing district and the names of the areas or parts of areas included in such district;

(b) by adding to the First Part thereof the name of the producing district for such milk distributing district and the names of the areas or parts of areas included in such producing district.

(5) The Governor may from time to time by proclamation published in the Gazette amend the Schedule to this Act or any addition made thereto pursuant to subsection four of this section by adding thereto or excluding therefrom the names of any areas or parts of areas.

Clause 7. (1) There shall be constituted a Board to be called the Milk Board, Milk Board, which shall, subject to the control of the Minister, be charged with the administration of this Act.

(2) The Board shall consist of three members, one of whom shall be appointed as the chairman of the Board; one other shall be representative of dairymen; and the third shall be representative of the consumers of milk.

*Point of Order*:—*Mr. Cahill* submitted that the amendment was out of order, as it would increase the expenditure necessary to set up the Board. If the number of members were increased it certainly would increase the cost of administration.

The Chairman said that the allowance to be made to the members of the Board had not yet been decided upon. It would be competent for the Governor to fix any figure he liked by way of remuneration, and if a larger number of members were appointed he might reduce it slightly; he ruled the amendment in order.

## MILK BILL:—

Clauses 8 to 25 having been dealt with,—

All milk supplied for consumption or use in any milk distributing district to vest in the Board.

Clause 26. (1) From and after a day to be appointed by the Governor and notified by proclamation published in the Gazette, milk supplied for consumption or use within the metropolitan milk distributing district or milk distributing sub-district thereof specified in the proclamation shall become absolutely vested in and be the property of the Board.

(2) The Governor may also by a proclamation as aforesaid appoint a day from and after which milk supplied for consumption or use within any milk distributing district or any milk distributing sub-district thereof, notified in accordance with this Act, shall become absolutely vested in and be the property of the Board.

(3) From and after the day so appointed such milk shall become the absolute property of the Board, freed from all mortgages, charges, liens, pledges, interests, and trusts affecting the same, and the rights and interests of every person in such milk shall thereupon be taken to be converted into a claim for payment therefor.

(4) Any proclamation may be made in respect only of milk produced in or supplied or to be supplied to certain milk distributing sub-districts, and may provide for the vesting of milk subject to the fulfilment of such conditions as are specified, and may be amended or revoked by a subsequent proclamation.

(5) No such proclamation shall apply to milk produced and retailed directly by a dairyman on his own behalf. [*Read.*]

Hire-purchase agreements.

20. (1) Neither section six nor section sixteen of this Act shall apply to a hire-purchase agreement.

(2) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to preclude the person to whom an instalment is, by the terms of a hire-purchase agreement, due, from taking action to recover the same, but such action shall not be taken except with the leave of the court granted under section four of this Act.

The court may upon an application for such leave grant leave to sue for one or more instalments on or after the dates on which by the agreement the instalments have become or will become due.

\* \* \* \* \*

(3) Where at the date of the commencement of the Moratorium (Amendment) Act, 1931, the vendor under a hire-purchase agreement has in pursuance of the powers contained in the agreement retaken possession of the goods the subject-matter of the agreement, and where such agreement is one to which the provisions of this Act, as amended by the Moratorium (Amendment) Act, 1931, would have applied if such Act as amended had been in operation at the time possession of such goods was retaken, then in any such case, upon the application of the hirer made within three months from the date of the commencement of the Moratorium (Amendment) Act, 1931, the court may, if in all the circumstances it thinks it desirable so to do, order that such goods be returned to the hirer upon the terms that he hold the same subject to the terms and conditions of the hire-purchase agreement to which they relate, and subject also to any further terms or conditions as to the payment of costs or otherwise that the court may impose, or where the goods are not in the possession or within the control of the vendor, the court may make such order as to payment of compensation by the vendor to the hirer as to it seems fit.

(7) The provisions of subsection two of section 21a shall apply, mutatis mutandis, to an order made under subsection six.

(7) In this section—

“Vendor” means a person who has disposed of goods under a hire-purchase agreement whether such person is described as vendor, owner, lessor, or otherwise; and includes any person deriving title under or through a vendor to his interest under such agreement;

“Hirer” means a purchaser or lessee of goods under a hire-purchase agreement, whether such purchaser or lessee is described as hirer, purchaser, lessee, or otherwise; and includes any person deriving title under or through a hirer.

## MORATORIUM (AMENDMENT) BILL:—

Clause 5. The Principal Act is further amended—

(a) by inserting after section twenty-four the following new Part:—

## PART IV.

## LIABILITY OF MORTGAGORS.

25. (1) After the commencement of the Moratorium (Amendment) Act, 1931, no action, *suit*, or proceeding shall be commenced, nor shall any action or proceeding already commenced be continued for breach of any covenant, agreement, or condition expressed or implied in any mortgage of real property, except as hereinafter provided.

(2) In the case of the breach of any covenant for the insurance, maintenance, or cultivation of the mortgaged real property or the payment of moneys due to the Crown in the case of lands held under the Crown Lands Consolidation Act, 1913, or the doing of any act for the preservation of the security, leave to commence or continue an action or proceeding may be granted if the court is satisfied that the mortgagor is able to comply with the covenant without hardship to himself or his dependants.

(3) This section shall apply to all mortgages of real property whether executed before or after the commencement of this Act, and notwithstanding any stipulation to the contrary.

(4) Nothing contained in this section shall alter or abridge any of the rights or remedies of a mortgagee to sell the mortgaged real property or any easement, right, or privilege of any kind over or in relation thereto, or to obtain foreclosure or possession or to appoint a receiver of the income of the mortgaged real property or of any part thereof, or to sever and sell fixtures, or to cut and sell timber.

(5) Paragraphs (c) and (d) of subsection one of section four shall be construed subject to this section, and shall not, after the commencement of the Moratorium (Amendment) Act, 1931, extend to actions or proceedings for breach of any covenant, agreement or condition expressed or implied in any mortgage of real property, or to any action or proceeding for interest at a rate provided in a mortgage of real property.

(6) This section shall extend to a contract of sale of real property.

26. Where an agreement for the sale and purchase of land (including exchange) was made before the commencement of the Moratorium (Amendment) Act, 1931, the purchaser may at any time within three months after such commencement by notice in writing to the vendor rescind the agreement, and thereupon all moneys paid to the vendor in respect of such agreement whether as deposit, instalments, interest, or otherwise, shall be retained by him, but the purchaser shall not be liable to any claim either for damages for breach of the agreement or for any damages or expenses whatsoever incurred by the vendor in or about the agreement.

(1) Where an obligation to pay interest is affected by the provisions of section five of this Act, the creditor may at any time within three months after the commencement of this Act make application in accordance with this section to a court for an order modifying or excluding the operation of the said provisions in relation to such obligation.

(2) The application may be made to a judge of the Supreme Court or where the amount in respect of which interest is payable does not exceed one thousand pounds may be made to a court of petty sessions holden before a stipendiary magistrate or a police magistrate within the police district in which the creditor resides, or in which the interest is payable.

\* \* \* \* \*

(6) Upon the hearing of the application the court may make such order as it deems just modifying or excluding the operation of the provisions of section five of this Act in relation to any obligation to pay interest if the creditor satisfies the court that—

(a) the interest has already been reduced; or

(b) the rate of interest was fixed subsequently to the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and such rate was by reason of the anticipation of a general reduction of interest rates by legislative action or otherwise fixed at a lower rate than would otherwise have been provided; or

~~(c) there are good and sufficient reasons relating to the transaction for modifying or excluding the operation of such provisions.~~

(7) The court may direct the summons to be served upon any person it thinks fit, and such person shall be entitled to appear and be heard.

(8) Any order made by a court under this section shall be final and conclusive.

(9) The court may make such order for the payment of costs as it deems just. The amount of any costs so ordered to be paid may be recovered by the person entitled thereto as a debt in any court of competent jurisdiction. [Read.]

## FAMILY ENDOWMENT (AMENDMENT) BILL:—

(a) (i) by omitting from section three the definition of "employee" and by inserting in lieu thereof the following definition:—

"Employee" means person employed, whether on salary or wages or piece-work rates, or as member of a butty gang, and includes any such person who is employed by or on behalf of the Crown in right of the State of New South Wales, or by or on behalf of a statutory authority representing the Crown in such right, and the fact that a person is working under a contract for labour only, or substantially for labour only, or as lessee of any tools or other implements of production, or any vehicle used in the delivery of goods, shall not in itself prevent such person being held to be an employee.

"Employee" also includes insurance and time-payment canvassers or collectors paid wholly or in part by commission, and timber-getters, whether paid by wages or at piece-work rates.

The term "employee" does not include—

- (a) any person whose wages are paid by the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia;
  - (b) a member of a family in the employment of a parent;
  - (c) any person employed in domestic service otherwise than in connection with his employer's trade or business;
  - (d) any person whose employment is casual or intermittent and who is employed otherwise than for the purposes of his employer's trade or business.
- (ii) by omitting from the same section the definition of "employer" and by inserting in lieu thereof the following definition:—

"Employer" means person, firm, company, or corporation (including the Crown in right of the State of New South Wales and any statutory authority representing the Crown in such right) employing persons, whether on behalf of himself or itself or any other person.

Where an employer is resident out of the State the term shall be deemed to include a person to whom the management of the affairs of the employer relating to his employes within the State is for the time being committed.

## FAMILY ENDOWMENT (AMENDMENT) BILL:—

Clause 2. (1) The Principal Act is amended—

(a) (i) by omitting from section three the definition of "employee" and by inserting in lieu thereof the following definition:—

"Employee" means person employed, whether on salary or wages or piece-work rates, or as member of a butty gang, and includes any such person who is employed by or on behalf of the Crown in right of the State of New South Wales, by or on behalf of a statutory authority representing the Crown in such right, and the fact that a person is working under contract for labour only, or substantially for labour only, or as lessee of any tools or other implements of production, or any vehicle used in the delivery of goods, shall not in itself prevent such person being held to be an employee.

Amendment of Act No. 30, 1927, s. 3. (Interpretation.)



"Employee" also includes insurance and time-payment canvassers or collectors paid wholly or in part by commission, and timber-getters, whether paid by wages or at piece-work rates.

The term "employee" does not include—

- (a) any person whose wages are paid by the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia;

### "Constitution of New Municipality.

"(1) The boundaries of the shires of Bulli and Wollondilly as constituted immediately before the commencement of this Act shall be altered by taking from the respective areas the parts of such areas which are within the county of Cumberland, and the parts so taken away shall be united and shall be constituted as a new municipality for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1919.

The representative of the owners of mines shall be nominated for appointment in the manner directed by the Governor by proclamation published in the Gazette. The representative of the employees shall be selected by ballot of the employees, and the certificate of the returning officer who conducted the ballot that the person named therein has been so selected shall be deemed a nomination of such person for appointment as the representative of the employees; and the Governor may, by proclamation published in the Gazette, issue such directions as are necessary or convenient in respect of the selection and nomination of such representative. Such representatives shall be nominated for appointment in the manner directed by the Governor by proclamation published in the Gazette.

(3) The members of the Board shall be appointed by the Governor for a term of seven years, and any member shall be eligible for reappointment.

(4) The members of the Board shall be paid out of the fund such Salary salary as the Governor may determine.

(5) In the case of the illness or absence from New South Wales illness or of any member of the Board, the Governor may appoint any person to absence. perform all or any of the duties imposed upon the member by or under this Act.

(5) Any acquisition or agreement shall be reported to Parliament forthwith if Parliament be then sitting, or if Parliament is not in session, then within fourteen sitting days of the commencement of the next session.

## MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT BILL:—

Clauses 1 to 6 having been dealt with,—

Board of  
Commissioners.

Clause 7. (1.) There shall be a Board of Commissioners which shall be a body corporate by the name of "The Transport Commissioners of New South Wales," and by that name shall have perpetual succession and a common seal and may sue and be sued in its corporate name, and shall, for the purposes and subject to the provisions of this or any other Act, be capable of purchasing, holding, granting, demising, disposing of, or otherwise dealing with real and personal property, and of doing and suffering all such other acts and things as bodies corporate may by law do and suffer.

(2) For the purposes of any Act, the Board of Commissioners shall be deemed a statutory body representing the Crown.

(3) The Board of Commissioners shall comprise a Chief Transport Commissioner and seven Transport Commissioners appointed by the Governor, together with the person for the time being holding the office of Commissioner of Police or acting in that office. Before the appointment of a Transport Commissioner the Chief Transport Commissioner shall be invited to report to the Governor with regard to the appointment, and full consideration shall be given to the representations, if any, made by the Chief Transport Commissioner.

(4) Each of the seven Transport Commissioners shall be appointed to the charges of one of the branches of the Department of Transport referred to in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), and (g) of subsection two of section six of this Act with such duties as are allotted by the Chief Transport Commissioner.

(5) The Board of Commissioners shall, subject to the control of the Minister, carry into effect the objects and purposes of this Act and have and discharge the powers, functions, and duties thereby conferred and imposed upon it.

(6) Each of the seven Transport Commissioners shall be the head of the branch of the Department of Transport to which he is appointed and will be responsible to the Chief Transport Commissioner for the efficient control and administration of his branch.

MORTGAGES TAXATION BILL (*Ways and Means*) (*Resolution*):—

(28) Resolved,—That towards raising the Supply to be granted to His Majesty there shall be charged, levied, collected, and paid for the use of His Majesty, and to form part of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, upon every mortgage existing at the date of the commencement of the Act to be passed in pursuance of this Resolution (hereinafter called “the said date”), a mortgage tax at the rate of ten per centum of the amount secured by the mortgage:



And that in this Resolution the expression "mortgage" shall mean--

- (a) any deed, memorandum of mortgage, agreement, or instrument whatever, whereby security for payment of money is granted over; or
- (b) any equitable mortgage by deposit of title deeds or other instruments or papers of; or
- (c) any charge for the securing of money (howsoever created) upon,

land or any estate or interest therein or any mortgage of or charge upon land or any estate or interest therein, whether land or estate or interest therein or such mortgage or charge forms the whole or part of the security, and notwithstanding the absence from New South Wales at any time of any speciality constituting or relating in any way to any debt.

And that for the purposes of this Resolution the amount secured by a mortgage shall mean the total amount of all the moneys secured by the mortgage at the said date on any account whatever other than interest which at that date has not been or is not liable to be capitalised or to have interest charged upon it in any other way:

(2) Provided that where a mortgage at the said date comprises other property in addition to land or any estate or interest therein, or any mortgage of or charge upon land or any estate or interest therein, for the purposes of this Resolution, the amount secured by the mortgage shall not exceed such sum as in the opinion of the Commissioner of Taxation represents the total value as at the said date of all the land and estates and interests in land and mortgages of and charges upon land or estates or interests therein subject to the mortgage:

(3) Provided further that where a mortgage at the said date is subject to a mortgage, for the purposes of this Resolution, the amount secured by the mortgage first mentioned in this proviso shall not exceed the sum by which the amount secured by that mortgage ascertained as hereinbefore provided exceeds the amount secured by the mortgage that is a mortgage of that mortgage ascertained as provided as aforesaid.

And that a mortgage owned by—

- (a) the Crown; or
- (b) any hospital which is an incorporated hospital or a separate institution within the meaning of the Public Hospitals Act, 1929; or
- (c) any friendly society or branch registered under the Friendly Societies Act, 1912, or any amendment thereof; or
- (d) any trade union registered under the Trades Unions Act, 1881, or any amendment thereof; or
- (e) the Workers' Compensation Commission of New South Wales, as an investment of compensation money paid or payable on death or disability under any Act relating to compensation to workers or workmen,

shall be exempt from the said mortgage tax, provided that this exemption shall not extend to a mortgage of any such mortgage unless that sub-mortgage is itself within the exemption.

- (e) the interpretation of an industrial agreement or award;
- (f) any shop, factory, craft, or industry dispute or any matter which may be a contributory cause of such a dispute.

(6) When any trade union registered as an industrial union has changed its name, or when two or more trade unions, one of which is registered as an industrial union, have amalgamated, the registrar may, upon application in the prescribed manner by any industrial union or industrial unions, and upon the production of the prescribed particulars, record any such change of name or amalgamation in the register of industrial unions, and vary any rule or rules of the applicant union to permit such amalgamation being fully effective and to enable the applicant industrial union to protect the interests of the trade union. Any such record shall be deemed to be a re-registration of the applicant union or unions in such changed name or as so amalgamated, as the case may be:



Provided that any such change of name or amalgamation shall not affect any rights or liabilities of any such union or unions: Provided also that the registrar may at his discretion, upon any such application, require the applicant union or unions to follow the procedure hereinbefore set out in respect of applications for the registration of industrial unions.
