AIR NAVIGATION BILL:—

Clauses 1 to 3 having been dealt with,—

Clause 4. The regulations from time to time in force applicable to and in relation to air navigation within the Territories shall (except so far as those regulations are by virtue of the Commonwealth Act and the regulations applicable to and in relation to air navigation within New South Wales) apply, mutatis mutandis, to and in relation to air navigation within New South Wales as if those regulations as so applied were incorporated in this Act and for the purposes of this Act those regulations shall be read and construed and take effect accordingly.

Application of Commonwealth Air Navigation Regulations to air navigation within New South Wales.

[Read.]

Question proposed,—That the clause, as read, stand part of the Bill.

Motion made (Mr. Lang) to add after line 21, the following paragraph, to stand as paragraph (2):—

(2) All regulations made or to be made in relation to air navigation within the Territories shall be laid upon the table of both Houses of Parliament of New South Wales.

Such regulations shall—

- (a) be published in the Gazette;
- (b) take effect from the date of such publication or from a later date to be specified in the regulations;
- (c) be laid before both Houses of Parliament within fourteen sitting days after publication if Parliament is in session, and if not, then within fourteen sitting days after the commencement of the next session.

If either House of Parliament passes a resolution of which notice has been given at any time within fifteen sitting days after the regulations have been laid before such House disallowing any regulation or part thereof, such regulation or part shall thereupon cease to have effect.

Clause 2. In this Act unless the context or subject matter otherwise indicates or requires—

“Assurance company” means the company incorporated under the name of “The Producers & Citizens’ Assurance Company of Australia Limited” or the company incorporated under the name of “Commonwealth General Assurance Corporation Limited” each of which companies has been incorporated since the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, as a company limited by shares which carries on the business of granting policies upon lives or entering into contracts for future endowments by way of annuity or otherwise.

This subsection shall not apply to or in respect of any such advertisement which is published exclusively to or amongst persons who are medical practitioners, registered pharmacists, registered dentists, registered veterinary surgeons, or are engaged in the business of selling by wholesale any foods or drugs whatsoever or any appliances, preparations, products, treatments or courses of treatment for the prevention, alleviation or cure of any human ailment or physical defect, whether such advertisement is contained in any journal the circulation of which is limited to such persons or is contained in any other document published exclusively to or amongst such persons.

(3) Where any person is charged with an offence against this section in respect of the publication, ~~within one year after the commencement of this Act,~~ of an advertisement to promote the sale of a food, drug or ~~appliance,~~ **appliance, preparation, product, treatment or course of treatment**, it shall be a sufficient defence if such person proves that the

- (a) be published in the Gazette;
- (b) take effect from the date of publication or from a later date to be specified in the regulations; and
- (c) be laid before both Houses of Parliament within fourteen sitting days after publication if Parliament is in session, and if not, then within fourteen sitting days after the commencement of the next session.

If either House of Parliament passes a resolution of which notice has been given at any time within fifteen sitting days after such regulations have been laid before such House disallowing any regulation or part thereof, such regulation or part shall thereupon cease to have effect.

Clause 176. The Public Instruction (Amendment) Act, 1916, is amended—

(a) by omitting from subsection one of section two the definition of "The Court" and by inserting in lieu thereof the following definition:—

"The Court" means a children's court established under the Child Welfare Act, 1938, and includes a stipendiary or police magistrate or justices exercising the jurisdiction of a children's court.

(b) (i) by omitting from subsection one of section four the word "seven" and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "six";

(ii) by omitting from subsection two of the same section the word "seven" and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "six";

(iii) by omitting paragraph (a) of subsection four of the same section;

(iv) by inserting in paragraph (c) of the same subsection after the word "Minister" the words "or any officer authorised by him";

Point of Order:—It was submitted that the amendment would, in effect, make a charge upon the revenue not contemplated by the Message—upheld by the Chairman, who accepted the assurance of the Minister in charge of the Bill that the amendment would involve a considerable extra charge upon the Consolidated Revenue, and ruled the amendment out of order.

(iii) by inserting at the end of the same subsection the following proviso:—

"Provided that the Governor-in-Council may progressively from time to time increase to fifteen years the maximum age for compulsory attendance at school, provided for in subsection one and subsection two of this section. Such increases shall be notified in the Government Gazette."

Point of Order:—That the amendment involved an additional cost to the Crown. The Chairman accepted the assurance of the Minister in charge of the Bill that the field of benefits would be widened if the amendment were agreed to and thus place on the Crown an increased burden not anticipated by the Bill, and ruled the amendment out of order.

SCHEDULE SEVEN.

CLASSES OF RESIDENTIAL FLAT BUILDINGS.

* * * * *

Class D.

The residential flat building shall not occupy more than fifty per centum of the area of the allotment upon which the building stands. The total floor plan area shall not exceed one and one-half times the total area of the site.

The minimum distance of the external walls of the first and second storeys from the side boundaries of the allotment on which the building stands shall be five feet; and the minimum distance of the external walls of any particular storey (other than the first and second) from the side boundaries of such allotment shall be ascertained by adding to five feet a distance of one foot six inches in respect of each storey additional to the second up to and including that particular storey.

CHAPTER XIV—MOTIONS.

DISALLOWANCE OF RULES, REGULATIONS, ORDINANCES, BY-LAWS, OR INSTRUMENTS.

113A. (a) Notice of a Motion to disallow any regulation, rule, ordinance, by-law, or instrument to which objection may be taken within a time specified shall, when given, be forthwith set down to be considered upon the next sitting day ~~upon which General Business has precedence of Government Business.~~

(b) Such motions—

- (i) shall have priority on such day in the order in which notice was given;
- (ii) shall, except as provided in Standing Order No. 108, take precedence over all other business on such day;
- (iii) If not moved on that day shall lapse.

(c) Mr. Speaker shall be entitled to put the Question when debate on any such Motion shall have exceeded thirty minutes, and no Member shall, without concurrence, speak to such Motion for more than ten minutes.

CHAPTER XVIII—RULES OF DEBATE.

* * * * *

INTERRUPTIONS NOT ALLOWED.—EXCEPTIONS.

*156. No Member shall interrupt another Member whilst speaking, unless ~~(1) to request that his words be taken down~~ (2) (1) to call attention to a Point of Order; or (3) (2) to call attention to the want of a Quorum, or (4) (3) as provided by Rule 142.

* * * * *

WORDS OBJECTED TO IN THE HOUSE TO BE TAKEN DOWN WHEN USED.

163. When a member objects to words used in debate, and desires them to be taken down, the Speaker may direct them to be taken down by the Clerk accordingly. Every such objection must be taken at the time when such words are used, and not after any other Member has spoken.

WORDS TAKEN DOWN IN COMMITTEE.

164. In a Committee of the Whole House, the Chairman shall direct words objected to to be taken down, if so ordered by the Committee (no debate being allowed) in order that the same may be reported to the House.

* * * * *

NO NOISE OR INTERRUPTION ALLOWED IN DEBATE.

166. No Member shall converse aloud, or make any noise or disturbance whilst any Member is debating, or whilst any Bill, Order, or other matter is being read or opened; and in case of such noise or disturbance being persisted in after the Speaker has called to Order, ~~the Speaker shall name the Member as guilty of a wilful and vexatious breach of the Standing Orders~~ such Member shall be deemed guilty of disorderly conduct.

* * * * *

MEMBER NAMED TO WITHDRAW AFTER EXPLANATION.

167. When, in consequence of disorderly conduct, the Speaker shall call upon any Member by name, such Member shall withdraw as soon as he has been heard in explanation; and after such Member's withdrawal the House shall at once take the case into consideration.

CHARGE MADE AGAINST A MEMBER.

168. In the case of a charge against a Member, for any breach of the Orders of the House, or for any matter that has arisen in debate, the charge shall be stated, and the Question moved, before the Member accused shall withdraw; he shall then be allowed the opportunity of explaining to the House the motives of his conduct in the matter alleged against him; and, after having so done, he shall withdraw, when the House shall at once take the case into consideration.

CHAPTER XXV—PUBLIC BILLS.

* * * * *

Initiation.

HOW INITIATED.

244. A Public Bill (unless sent from the Council) shall be initiated by a motion for leave to bring in the Bill, except Taxation, Temporary Supply, Loan, or Appropriation Bills, which shall be initiated by resolution reported from Committee of Ways and Means, and agreed to by the House, upon which a Motion, without Notice, specifying the intended title of the Bill shall be founded.

No member shall speak for more than ten minutes to any such motion for leave to bring in a Bill, however initiated.

An explanatory note shall be prefixed to the Bill when presented in pursuance of leave granted.

* * * * *

CHAPTER XXX—CONTEMPT AND PUNISHMENT.**MEMBER CALLED TO ORDER NOT TO LEAVE THE CHAMBER.**

387. A Member having been called to order for a breach of the foregoing rules, or for disorderly conduct, shall be guilty of contempt if he attempts to leave the Chamber before his conduct has been dealt with, except in cases where a Member has been called upon to withdraw, pending consideration of his conduct.

WHAT DEEMED CONTEMPT.

388. A Member who shall wilfully disobey an order of the House, and a Member who shall wilfully or vexatiously obstruct or interrupt the orderly conduct of the business of the House shall be guilty of contempt.

MEMBER NAMED BY SPEAKER AS GUILTY OF BREACH OF STANDING ORDERS, ETC.

389. A Member named by the Speaker as guilty of a wilful or vexatious breach of any of the Standing Orders, or as interrupting the orderly conduct of the business of the House, may be adjudged by the House on Motion, without Notice, guilty of contempt, no debate being allowed on such Motion except an explanation by the Member named.

PUNISHMENT OF MEMBERS FOR CONTEMPT.

390. A Member adjudged by the House, for any of the causes hereinbefore mentioned, guilty of contempt, shall be suspended from the service of the House for such time as the House shall by resolution declare.

Chapter XXX—DISORDER AND SUSPENSION.**Disorder.**

397. If any Member has—

- (a) persistently and wilfully obstructed the business of the House; or
- (b) been guilty of disorderly conduct; or
- (c) used objectionable words, which he has refused to withdraw; or
- (d) persistently and wilfully refused to conform to the Standing Orders or any one or more of them; or
- (e) persistently and wilfully disregarded the authority of the Chair,

he may be named by the Speaker, or, if any of the abovementioned offences has been committed by a Member in Committee, by the Chairman.

(1.) If the offence has been committed in the House, the Premier, or the Minister in charge of the House, shall forthwith move, "That such Member be suspended from the service of the House," no amendment, adjournment or debate being allowed upon such motion. After the Member named has been allowed an opportunity of making an explanation of his conduct, limited to five minutes, the Speaker shall put the Question, "That such Member be suspended from the service of the House."

(2.) If the offence has been committed in Committee the Chairman shall forthwith suspend the proceedings of the Committee and report the circumstance to the House; and the same procedure shall thereupon be adopted as if the offence had been committed in the House itself. The matter having been disposed of, the proceedings in Committee shall be resumed where they were interrupted.

If any Member be suspended under this Standing Order his suspension on the first occasion shall be for two sitting days, and on the second occasion during the same Session for four sitting days, and on any subsequent occasion during the same Session, for eight sitting days. In this Standing Order "sitting days" shall mean days upon which the House actually sits, and the uncompleted portion of the sitting during which the Member was suspended shall count as one sitting day.

CHAPTER XXXIII—SESSIONAL COMMITTEES.

412. The members of the Standing Orders Committee, the Library Committee, the Printing Committee, and the House Committee shall hold office until the appointment of their successors, and such Committees shall have power to sit during any adjournment or prorogation of the House.

IN THE MATTER OF THE GORDON ELECTION PETITION.

JUDGMENT.

HIS HONOR: This is a petition under the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912-1935, to the Supreme Court, which is constituted under that Act the Court of Disputed Returns, seeking substantially a declaration that the election was void.

On the 28th February, 1938, a writ was issued under the provisions of the Act directed to the Returning Officer for the Electoral District of Gordon for the election of a member to the Legislative Assembly. On the 11th April, 1938, the Returning Officer announced as the result of the election held that Mr. Henry Basil Turner was elected for the district by a majority of nine votes over Mr. William Cassie Milne, the only other candidate.

The grounds upon which this petition is based relate to—

- (a) Postal votes;
- (b) Absent votes;
- (c) A section vote, and
- (d) A specified number of ballot papers.

The challenges to the postal, absent and section votes, have, for the purpose of the hearing before this Court, been grouped into four classes. It was agreed that in certain events the inquiry as to the specified ballot papers, 53 in number, would become unnecessary.

Postal Votes: An elector is entitled to vote by post on three grounds, all relative to his or her inability to attend or difficulty in attending a polling booth—section 114A (1). In order so to vote certain conditions are laid down by the Act—

- (a) He must make an application for a postal vote certificate and postal ballot paper section 114A (1);
- (b) The application must contain a declaration in or to the effect of the form prescribed and must be signed in the presence of an authorised witness—section 114A (2);
- (c) The authorised witnesses are set out in detail in section 114B (1) (a) and by reference in section 114B (1) (b).
- (d) An authorised witness is obliged to be satisfied as to the applicant's identity, to have seen the applicant sign the application, and to be satisfied as to the truth of the statements contained in the application.
- (e) An authorised witness must sign his name, add the title, by virtue of which he witnesses, and the date—section 114c.

Thereafter it is for the Returning Officer, if satisfied that the application is properly signed and witnessed, and if it is received in time, to forward a postal vote certificate, printed on an envelope, and one postal ballot paper, forms both for certificates and for ballot paper are prescribed—section 114d.

Directions for regulating postal voting are contained in section 114h, and are to be substantially observed. Section 114i provides for the preliminary scrutiny of postal ballot papers. Thereunder the scrutineers are to be allowed to inspect the signature of the elector on the application and on the certificate—this, of course, for comparison. If satisfied that these two signatures are of the same person and that the one on the certificate purports to be witnessed by an authorised witness, and that the elector is on the roll, the Returning Officer must accept the ballot paper for further scrutiny.

In the present case 57 postal vote applications are challenged on the grounds that they are as to some not properly witnessed, as to some not properly signed, and as to others not dated, the grounds not stated, or not in the proper form. That some at any rate of these applications are properly challenged is not disputed. It is not necessary that one should deal with each individual application; I propose to deal with them generally.

Of the postal vote certificates, 24 in all are challenged. Here again it is not disputed that at any rate some are properly challenged. Here, too, it is unnecessary to deal further with them in detail.

Absent Votes: An elector who is absent from the subdivision for which he is enrolled may vote elsewhere subject to certain conditions. Some of these only are relevant to this petition, amongst which is the obligation upon the elector to make a declaration in the form prescribed by the Act. The form of declaration may be printed or written on an envelope addressed to the Returning Officer for the district for which the elector is enrolled, and must be signed by the elector in the presence of the Returning Officer or Deputy and completed and attested by him—section 115 (c) (d). In the present case 44 declarations are challenged for various reasons, for example not signed at all, not witnessed at all, a rubber stamp used for witness' signature, and incomplete or no declaration. As to these it is not disputed that some at any rate are properly challenged. It is unnecessary to deal with each of the 44; they will be dealt with generally later.

Section Vote: Persons otherwise entitled to vote, whose names are not on the roll (to put it shortly), may vote subject, *inter alia*, to making a declaration in the prescribed form—section 106 (1) and (2). Those are known as section votes. To give effect to those provisions certain conditions must be complied with. The form of declaration which may be printed or written on an envelope addressed to the Returning Officer must after being filled in be signed by the voter in the presence of the Returning Officer or Deputy and completed and attested by him. In the present petition one declaration only is challenged; it was not signed by the Returning Officer or his Deputy.

In all, the applications, certificates, and declarations objected to total 125. If the objections are valid there are sufficient in number to affect the election, subject always to the discretion vested in the Court.

The first question for consideration is as to the effect of non-compliance with the conditions as to postal, absent, or section votes. Prima facie an elector is entitled, and indeed bound, to record his or her vote by attendance at a polling booth in the appropriate subdivision; but the Legislature has recognised that under some circumstances it may be impossible, and in others inconvenient, for the elector so to exercise his vote. In such cases the obligation so to attend at the proper booth is relaxed, and, subject to conditions, the elector is allowed to vote by post or at other booths. In addition a person whose name is not on the roll is allowed to vote, again subject to conditions. In most of the 125 cases challenged, these conditions have not been complied with in some instances at all, in others in part. They are requirements of the Act itself and the effect of non-compliance depends upon whether these requirements are mandatory or merely directory.

"The scope and object of a Statute are the only guides in determining whether its provisions are directory or imperative"—*Marwell on the Interpretation of Statutes*, 1st edn. at 330 and 331, cited in *Beale's Cardinal Rules of Interpretation*, 3rd edn. 491.

"Where a Statute creates public duties and confers private rights, in general the former provisions are directory, the latter imperative, and in the absence of an express provision the intention of the Legislature is to be ascertained by weighing the consequences of holding a Statute to be directory or imperative"—*Beale* at 491.

So far as concerns voting, as already indicated, the scheme of the Act is that the elector shall so far as practicable vote at the polling booth for which he is enrolled. Provisions to vote otherwise, either as to manner or as to place, are all based on conditions.

"I think it is a clear rule that where a privilege is granted subject to a condition, the performance of that condition is necessary before the right to exercise the privilege arises"—per *Griffiths C.J.*, *Maloney v. McEachern*, 1 C.L.R. at 83.

In that case the Court was considering the validity of postal votes given upon certificates and ballot papers issued to electors pursuant to applications not attested by a person of one of the classes specified. It was held that they were invalid.

" I am, I confess, compelled to come to the conclusion that the attestation of the application by one of the persons specified is an essential condition to the granting of the application. In coming to the conclusion I am influenced to a great extent by the apparent scope of this part of the Act. If the

application could be made without attestation means of personation would be offered to any person who was willing to take advantage of them. There would be no check or means of obtaining evidence against the personator. If a man were merely required to sign the name of an elector and give the particulars mentioned in the form, all of which he could ascertain from the roll, and then to send in the application, the Returning Officer would have no more to do than to issue the certificate and ballot paper. Anyone would be enabled to get a postal ballot paper. If the application were merely required to be attested by another signature the means of evading the Act would be almost as easy, because it would only need two persons to concur, one to sign the name of an elector as the applicant, and another to sign a fictitious name as attesting witness. But if the application is required to be attested by some known and identifiable person of one of the classes specified, there would be this safeguard that if he improperly attested a ballot paper he would be liable to lose an official position if the fact were made known on a prosecution for personation or otherwise. There would be at any rate some safeguard added. It is true it is an imperfect safeguard, just as the attestation of an affidavit by a Commissioner is an imperfect safeguard as to the identity of the deponent, for the Commissioner seldom knows the deponent. But a person who signs an affidavit in the presence of a Commissioner runs the risk of being identified and prosecuted if he swears falsely. So in this case, if a man signs an application of this sort, not being the person whose name is signed, he is guilty of a criminal offence, rendering him liable to imprisonment for two years. If the construction which we favour is adopted he cannot effectively do so except in the presence of a person easily identifiable, a person holding a public office and who is likely to be a credible witness on a prosecution. Therefore, the provision is a substantial though an imperfect safeguard. This reasoning and the authority of *McIntosh v. Simphins* (1901 1 K.B. 487) compel me to the conclusion that attestation by some one of the persons specified is an imperative condition."—*Griffiths, C.J., at pp. 86-7.*

Moreover, so far as concerns section 114H, which provides that "the following directions for regulating voting by means of postal ballot papers are to be substantially observed" followed by provisions in subsection (c) for the authorised witness signing his name on the postal vote certificate and adding the title and the date, it is to be observed that notwithstanding the provision therein contained for "substantial observance" the addition of the title is essential. "Some postal ballot papers were held invalid because 'the title' of the witness of his occupation and place of living, as directed by section 118 (a) had not been added to the witness' signature. Omission of this necessary precaution for authentication could not be cured by the words of section 118 (a) that its provisions need only be substantially observed"—per *Barton J., Blandell v. Barden, 4 C.L.R., at 1475.*

Certain sections of the present Act specifically provide for "substantial performance," e.g., sections 114M and 122A. I am of the opinion that at all events as to those sections which do not contain such a provision, the presumption is that complete performance is obligatory.

In the present case I am satisfied that the requirements, non-compliance with which is alleged, are mandatory, and that a failure to observe, renders the objections in each instance a valid one.

It is quite impossible to indicate all of the matters the subject of objection with a statement of the extent to which compliance fails, or the respect in which it fails. It is sufficient for the purposes of this decision to indicate shortly that where, for instance, a postal vote application is not signed, is not witnessed, or if witnessed is by a person not authorised; if the title of the authorised witness is not added nor the date, or where postal vote certificates are not properly witnessed by reason of the authorised witness failing to add the title under which he witnesses—or the date—or as to absent voters' declarations where an absent voter's declaration is not signed by the voter, is not witnessed, or where a rubber stamp is used by the Returning Officer for the attesting by him; or where as to a section vote the declaration is not signed by the Returning Officer or his Deputy, in each case this is a breach of a mandatory provision of the Act and is fatal.

On behalf of the respondent, Mr. Roberts, the Returning Officer, was called as a witness, and his clerk, in support of the evidence given by him. In effect, Mr. Roberts' evidence established that all routine matters were faithfully and accurately carried out, but the really important portions of his testimony related to the circumstances under which he accepted the 125 papers, the subject of the contest. Speaking generally, he said that he was "satisfied" that they were in order, that as to some the scrutineers being present and invited to object if occasion arose, he, the Returning Officer, considered it his duty not to raise any objection if they raised none, although in some cases he rejected on his own motion. He stated his position to be that he adopted what he termed a sympathetic attitude to the elector, erring, if he did err, on the side rather of enfranchising than of disfranchising. An illustration is afforded in cases of authorised witnesses in respect of postal votes. As to these he accepted certificates from people known to be reputable though not within the list of authorised witnesses in the section. There were a few cases where he very fairly said he would not have passed them on the closer scrutiny that presented itself in the witness-box.

The fact is that before these votes were taken into account the petitioner had a majority of 100 votes over the respondent. In the circumstances outlined, the position taken up by Mr. Maughan is this: he frankly states that in fact the petitioner has established the case he set out to make as to the invalidity of sufficient of these 125 instances to render the election a nullity, but he claims that in the circumstances the

Court should exercise its discretion, should, as he puts it, allow the election to stand. The facts upon which he asks that this course should be adopted are shortly that there is nothing throughout the case to suggest that any person not entitled to vote did vote by post or as an absentee, that the Returning Officer, carrying out his duties bona fide, was satisfied in each instance that the scrutineers present to look after the interests of the candidates although invited took no exception to any of the cases now relied upon. He has argued that the Court has the widest powers under section 161, which, so far as it is relevant, is in these terms:—

“Subsection (1). The Court of Disputed Returns shall sit as an open Court and its powers shall include the following:—

(viii) To dismiss or uphold the petition in whole or in part.

Subsection (2). The Court may exercise all or any of its powers under this section on such grounds as the Court in its discretion thinks just and sufficient,” and is bound by section 166 to be—

“guided by the substantial merits and good conscience of each case without regard to legal forms or technicalities or whether the evidence before it is in accordance with the law of evidence or not.”

He further has asked me not, in effect, to be constrained to follow the principles enunciated in the cases cited by Mr. Monahan. I may say at once that I agree that I am not bound, as I should be sitting in another jurisdiction of the Supreme Court, by these decisions, but they are the pronouncements on practically identical sections of judges whose opinions must carry the greatest weight, this not alone from their eminence as jurists but as from as well their experience of elections. Moreover, I should add with respect, that I agree entirely with their reasons.

That the Court has the widest powers is obvious from the mere reading of section 161, whilst it is no less clear that section 166 demands that the real substance, free from any shadow of form or technicality, is to be sought and given effect to. A definition of substantial merit and good conscience is difficult if not impossible, though particular instances are easy of recognition.

The respondent, through his counsel, has claimed that the defects in the subject cases are really matters of form and not of substance, and that to act upon them would be relying upon technicalities. I do not agree. In my opinion, speaking generally with regard to the cases that have been presented, I am satisfied that the vital provisions of the Act have been disregarded, and that so far from their being technicalities the irregularities are of such a nature that if they were overlooked it would be riding through the provisions of the Act. It is quite clear that the Legislature, being of opinion that opportunities for voting other than by personal attendance at the booth for which the elector is enrolled should be provided, have gone farther and set up safeguards against any violation of what are really privileges in the exercise of the vote. Those safeguards are very important, though, in the nature of things, not perfect. It seems to me that if I were to treat them as technicalities, or to overlook them, I should, as Mr. Monahan claims, be giving the go-bye entirely to the detailed safeguards that the Legislature has seen fit to set up.

In the circumstances, I am of the opinion therefore that, guided by the substantial merits of the case and by good conscience and paying no regard at all to legal forms or technicalities, this petition should succeed.

I find that the cases in the first four groups have been made out with very few exceptions and in sufficient numbers—as is agreed—to affect the election. It becomes unnecessary therefore to consider what is called group 5, that is 53 ballot papers alleged to be informal.

There remains an aspect of the matter to be dealt with in fairness to the Returning Officer. In evidence he admitted that he passed a few cases which upon reflection he would have rejected. I think it proper to state that he impressed me as a witness and as having a keen sense of his responsibility as a returning officer. There is not the slightest ground for suggesting that he carried out his duties other than in good faith. As to the majority of the instances challenged, the error into which he fell was in failing to detect mistakes and omissions made by electors and by witnesses who had full instructions for their guidance and, so far as it appears, ample time to study them. It is to be observed that the Returning Officer handled some 22,000 votes, including 750 postal votes and 1,500 absent votes, with the busile and unavoidable haste associated with the natural desire to provide the candidates and the public with reliable figures as early as reasonably possible, and it is not surprising that he should in a relatively limited number of cases fall into error.

The not unimportant question of costs remains for consideration. It is true that the respondent is in a sense an unsuccessful party, but Mr. Monahan has already announced that he does not ask for costs against him, the matters of complaint being, as he puts it, departmental. Counsel for both parties have requested me to act under section 172. In a case very comparable to the present, *Blundell v. Barden, Barton, J.*, in the course of his reasons, said that had he the power he should consider whether it was not his duty to order an official contribution to costs. Section 172 provides that the Court may award costs against an unsuccessful party to the petition, and may, in its discretion, recommend that costs be paid by the Crown. In my opinion this is a case where I should exercise my discretion to recommend that the costs of both parties be paid by the Crown, and this I accordingly do.
