Motor Accidents Compensation Further Amendment (Terrorism) Bill 2002

Act No , 2002

An Act to amend the *Motor Accidents Compensation Act 1999* to extend for 12 months until 1 January 2004 the temporary exclusion of acts of terrorism from the compulsory third-party insurance coverage provided under that Act.

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts:

1 Name of Act

This Act is the *Motor Accidents Compensation Further Amendment (Terrorism) Act 2002*.

2 Commencement

This Act commences on the date of assent.

3 Amendment of Motor Accidents Compensation Act 1999 No 41

The *Motor Accidents Compensation Act 1999* is amended by omitting “1 January 2003” wherever occurring from sections 15A (3) and 35A (3) and by inserting instead “1 January 2004”.
