Parliamentary Remuneration Amendment (Basic Salary) Bill 2025

An Act to amend the *Parliamentary Remuneration Act 1989* to provide for the amount of the basic salary for members of both Houses of Parliament for the 2025–26 financial year.

I have examined this bill and find it to correspond in all respects with the bill as finally passed by both Houses.

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts—

1 Name of Act

This Act is the *Parliamentary Remuneration Amendment (Basic Salary) Act 2025*.

2 Commencement

This Act is taken to have commenced on 1 July 2025.

Schedule 1 Amendment of Parliamentary Remuneration Act 1989 No 160

Section 4A

Insert after section 4—

4A Temporary arrangements for basic salary for 2025–26 financial year

- (1) For the relevant financial year, the basic salary is the amount equal to the total of the following—
 - (a) the basic salary in effect on 30 June 2025,
 - (b) the amount that is 3.5% of the basic salary in effect on 30 June 2025.
- (2) Subsection (1) applies despite—
 - (a) section 4, or
 - (b) a determination made under section 4, whether made before or after the commencement of this section.
- (3) In this section—

relevant financial year means the period—

 - (a) starting on 1 July 2025, and
 - (b) ending on 30 June 2026.

Note— The Tribunal, in the “Annual Determination Report and Determination of additional entitlements for Members of the Parliament of New South Wales pursuant to the *Parliamentary Remuneration Act 1989*” dated 22 July 2025, determined that, under this Act, section 4, a member’s basic salary was to be increased by 4% for the 2025–26 financial year. The effect of this section is to limit the increase in a member’s basic salary to 3.5% for the 2025–26 financial year, despite the Tribunal’s determination.
