# Crimes Legislation Amendment (War Memorial Offences) Bill 2025

### **Explanatory note**

This explanatory note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament.

#### Overview of Bill

The object of this Bill is to amend the Crimes Act 1900 and the Summary Offences Act 1988 regarding offences committed in relation to war memorials.

## Outline of provisions

Clause 1 sets out the name, also called the short title, of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides for the commencement of the proposed Act.

#### Schedule 1 Amendment of Crimes Act 1900 No 40

**Schedule 1[1]** makes it an offence to intentionally or recklessly destroy or damage property that is a war memorial with a maximum penalty of imprisonment for 7 years. **Schedule 1[2]** makes a consequential amendment.

# Schedule 2 Amendment of Summary Offences Act 1988 No 25

**Schedule 2** authorises the court to order a person convicted of an offence of damaging or defacing a protected place that is a war memorial to pay compensation to the person who has control or management of the war memorial. The compensation that may be ordered—

- (a) is for the damage or defacement caused by, or a loss incurred as a result of, the offence, and
- (b) cannot be more than \$4,400, and

(c)	is in addition to any fine or other penalty imposed for the offence.
