Omit "zones". Insert instead "projects".

[2B] Section 24, heading

Omit "zone". Insert instead "project".

Page 3, Schedule 1. Insert after line 37—

[2C] Section 24(1) and (2)

Omit the subsections. Insert instead—

- (1) The Minister must, by order published in the Gazette, declare the access scheme that applies—
  - in a renewable energy zone or part of a renewable energy zone, and
  - (b) in relation to each renewable energy project that—
    - (i) has been declared State significant development under the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*, section 4.36, and
    - (ii) is not in a renewable energy zone.
- (2) An access scheme is a scheme that authorises or prohibits access to, and use of, the following by network operators and operators of generation and storage infrastructure—
  - (a) specified network infrastructure in the renewable energy zone, or the part of the renewable energy zone, to which the scheme applies,

(b) specified network infrastructure constructed or operated under the renewable energy project in relation to which the scheme applies.

*community purpose* means a purpose that benefits the community in a council area that, at any time after the declaration of the access scheme, is or has been wholly or partly within—

- (a) the geographic area that forms the renewable energy zone to which the access scheme applies, or
- (b) the geographic area of the renewable energy project in relation to which the access scheme applies.

- (b) the geographic area of the renewable energy project in relation to which the access scheme applies.

Page 14, Schedule 2[4], proposed Part 4, Division 5. Insert after line 13—

### 43l Solar costs protection for non-solar small customers

A retailer or exempt seller must not charge or pass any of the following costs or amounts on to a customer who does not have a grid-connected solar energy system—

- (a) costs to, or incurred by, the retailer or exempt seller in complying with section 43G or 43H, or
- (b) all or part of the amount of a deficit between the costs incurred by the retailer or exempt seller in accepting solar-generated electricity.

**Example of a deficit**— when the National Energy Market wholesale price is negative or the cost of transmission for solar-generated electricity from a customer is greater than the National Energy Market wholesale price offered
