

Standard Time Amendment Bill 1999

Explanatory note

This explanatory note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament.

Overview of Bill

The object of this Bill is to provide that, in the year in which the Olympic Games and the Paralympic Games are held in Sydney, daylight saving will begin on Sunday 27 August 2000 rather than on the last Sunday in October (Sunday 29 October 2000).

Outline of provisions

Clause 1 sets out the name (also called the short title) of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides for the commencement of the proposed Act on the date of assent.

Clause 3 provides that the Standard Time Act 1987 is taken to be amended to give effect to the object of the proposed Act.

Clause 4 provides that the proposed Act ceases to have effect on 26 March 2001.

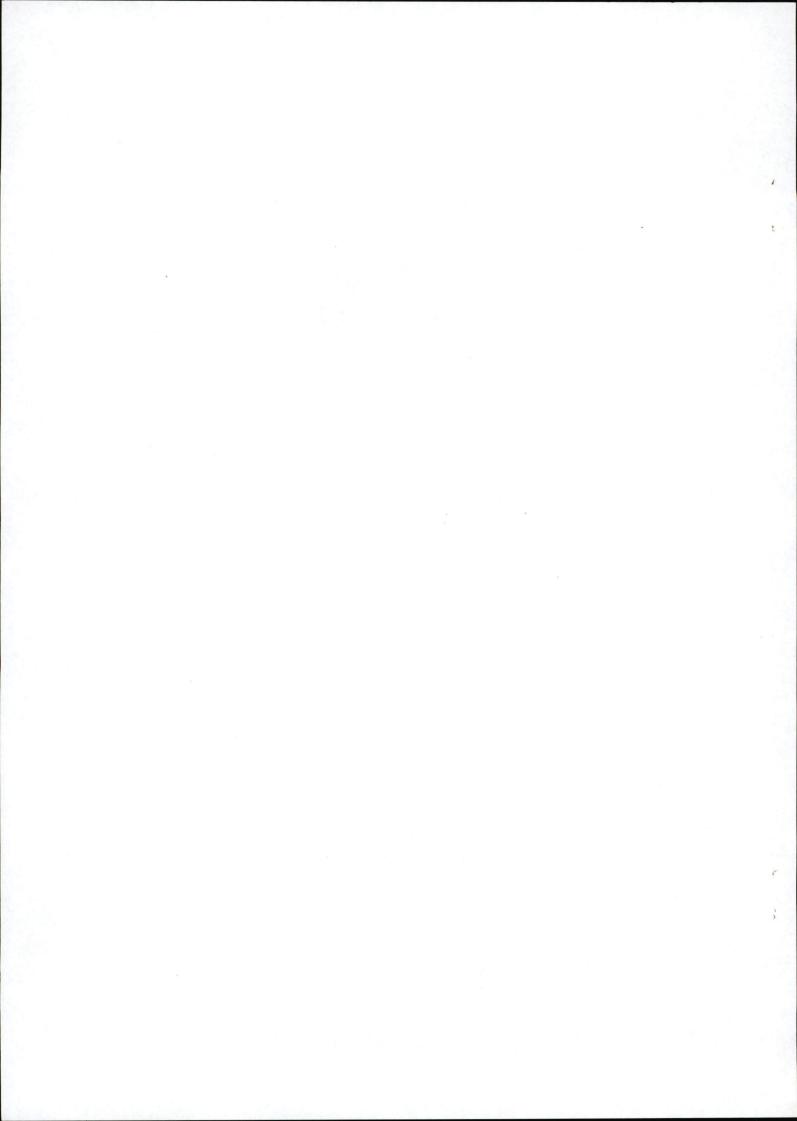
