Parliamentary Committees Legislation Amendment Bill 1999

Explanatory note

This explanatory note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament.

Overview of Bill

The objects of this Bill are:

- (a) to decrease by 4 the number of members of the Legislative Assembly on the following Joint Parliamentary Committees:
 - the Committee on the Health Care Complaints Commission,
 - the Committee on the Office of the Ombudsman and the Police Integrity Commission, and
- (b) to decrease by 2 the number of members of the Legislative Assembly on the Regulation Review Committee, and
- (c) to make consequential amendments relating to the quorum requirements for those Committees.

As a result of the proposed amendments, the membership of each of the Committees referred to in paragraph (a) will decrease from 11 to 7 members, and

the membership of the Regulation Review Committee will decrease from 9 to 7 members. For the Committees referred to in paragraph (a), 4 members will be from the Legislative Assembly and 3 members will be from the Legislative Council. For the Regulation Review Committee, 5 members will be from the Legislative Assembly and 2 members will be from the Legislative Council.

The quorum for each of the Committees will be 4 members.

Outline of provisions

Clause 1 sets out the name (also called the short title) of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides for the commencement of the proposed Act on the date of assent to the proposed Act.

Clause 3 is a formal provision giving effect to the amendments set out in Schedule 1.


