This explanatory note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament.

Overview of Bill

The object of this Bill is to authorise the use of the terms State Senate as a reference to the Legislative Council and State Senator as a reference to a Member of the Legislative Council.

Outline of provisions

Clause 1 sets out the name (also called the short title) of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides for the commencement of the proposed Act on the date of assent to the proposed Act.

Clause 3 gives effect to the object described above.

This Act is the <i>State Senate Act 2012</i> .	3
2 Commencement	4
This Act commences on the date of assent to this Act.	5
3 The State Senate and Senators	6
(1) The Legislative Council may also be called the State Senate, and the use of that name has the same effect for all purposes as the use of its other name.	7 8 9
(2) Accordingly, a Member of the Legislative Council may also be called a State Senator.	10 11
