(c)	The views and needs of carers and the views, needs and best interests of the persons for whom they care must be taken into account in the assessment, planning, delivery and review of services provided to persons who are cared for.	7 8 9 10		
(d)	Carers should be referred to, and made aware of, appropriate services to assist carers in their caring role. Such referrals should be made after an assessment of the needs of carers or as part of the assessment or provision of services to the person being cared for.	11 12 13 14

(f)	Carers are to be acknowledged and recognised as having their own individual needs within and beyond their caring role. Support for carers should be timely, responsive, appropriate and accessible. (1)

Carers' unique knowledge and experience should be acknowledged and recognised. (m)

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
