### Amendments to the Greater Sydney Parklands Trust Bill 2021

1. Page 2, line 9, insert new Object (a) and re-letter others:

“More than any other objective, to maximise public use of parklands, featuring active recreation facilities for children and young people, family friendly amenities and community and commercial use that the public finds convenient and inviting.”

2. Page 2, after line 32, insert new (h):

“to deliver new parklands for South-West Sydney which, as at November 2021, had no State-run and funded parklands.”

3. Page 3, line 27, insert new (a) and re-letter all others:

“maximising public use of public facilities.”

4. Page 4, line 17, delete words “Blue-Green grid” and insert “Public Use.”

5. Page 6, line 5, insert new (a) and re-letter all others:

“to maximise public use of parklands, justifying the large public investment in these facilities,”

6. Page 8, after line 35, insert new subsection (8):

“The Trust, by agreement with local councils, may take over the ownership and/or management of local government parklands.”

7. Page 10, after line 12, insert new subsection (6):

“The Trust, in cooperation with the Minister, the Royal Botanical Garden Trust and through community consultation in South-West Sydney, by 1 December 2022, must conduct a review and make recommendations about the need and feasibility of transferring the ownership and management of the Mount Annan Botanic Gardens to the Trust.”

8. Page 14, line 9, delete “cultural” after “and” and insert “and socio-economic”

9. Page 14, line 21, after “parkland” insert “to maximise public use.”

10. Page 16, after line 37, insert new (c):

“there is no financial cross-subsidisation of parklands in other parts of Sydney by Western and South-Western Sydney, with the Trust including in its Annual Reports independent accounting verification of this financial outcome.”

11. Page 37, lines 23 to 37, delete Section **18AA Parking Offences**, and replace with new section:

**18AA Preservation of Moore Park Car Parking:**

“Existing user rights and arrangements for car parking at Moore Park, servicing the Sydney Cricket Ground and Sydney Football Stadium, shall be preserved by the Trust, with parking fees capped at \$30 per day.”

**12.** Pages 40 to 44, delete:

- 12.1** Schedule 3 Maps of non-parking green areas in Moore Park Estate;
- 12.2** Section 5.3 Centennial Park and Moore Park Trust Regulation 2014, parts 1 and 2; and
- 12.3** Schedule 2 Map of non-parking areas.
