- (1) If a person employed within the general government sector performs 2
work of any kind for the purposes of, or associated with, the Olympic 3
Games, the authority or agency that pays the person's salary or 4
remuneration immediately before the commencement of the work may 5
continue to pay the person's salary or remuneration for the period in 6
which the work is undertaken from money appropriated by an 7
Appropriation Act (including this Act) for the recurrent services of the 8
authority or agency. 9

- general government sector* has the same meaning as in the *General 11
Government Debt Elimination Act 1995*. 12
- Olympic Games* means the Games of the XXVII Olympiad to be held 13
principally in Sydney in the year 2000, and includes: 14
- (a) the Paralympic Games, being the games for athletes with a 15
disability that are to be held principally in Sydney in the year 16
2000, and 17
- (b) a test event, being an event conducted at a venue or facility at 18
which Olympic Games and Paralympic Games sporting events 19
are to be conducted before those Games are held in order to test 20
the capacity and operational functions of the venue or facility 21
to provide for those sporting events. 22
