Liquor (Rugby League Grand Final Special Provisions) Bill 2001

Act No , 2001

An Act to modify the application of the *Liquor Act 1982* to enable hotel trading until midnight on the night of the 2001 Rugby League Grand Final.

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts:**1 Name of Act**

This Act is the *Liquor (Rugby League Grand Final Special Provisions) Act 2001*.

2 Commencement

This Act commences on the date of assent.

3 Relationship with Liquor Act 1982

- (1) This Act is to be construed with and as if it formed part of the *Liquor Act 1982*.
- (2) In the event of an inconsistency between this Act and the *Liquor Act 1982*, this Act prevails to the extent of the inconsistency.

4 Hotel trading on night of 2001 Rugby League Grand Final

- (1) Liquor may be sold, supplied or consumed on premises to which a hotelier's licence relates and the premises may be kept open for the sale, supply or consumption of liquor on Sunday 30 September 2001:
 - (a) from 10 am to 10 pm, and
 - (b) from 10 pm to midnight on that day but only when the liquor is sold or supplied for consumption on the licensed premises.
- (2) This section does not authorise the sale, supply or consumption of liquor on any licensed premises contrary to a restriction or prohibition imposed, otherwise than under section 24 of the *Liquor Act 1982*, in respect of the trading hours for the licensed premises.
- (3) Nothing in this section enables a person (including a lodger, an inmate or an employee of a licensee) to use or operate an approved gaming device at premises to which a hotelier's licence relates at a time other than a time permitted by this section.
