GRANT OF LAND.

THE description of the following portion of Land is published for general information, in order that the parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

At the expiration of one month from this date, if no caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty appear, a Deed of Grant of the same will be executed accordingly, viz. :—

4. DUNDEE (NEW ENGLAND), 1a., One acre, county unnamed, parish unnamed; commencing at a stake on Hogue's Creek, about 4 chains southerly from Kirkwood's steam mill, and bounded on the north by a line bearing east 5 degrees north 3 chains 90 links; on the east by a line bearing south 4 chains 95 links; on the south by a line bearing west 1 chain 70 links to Hogue's Creek; and on the west by that creek to the aforesaid stake.

ELECTORAL LISTS.

It may, perhaps, be proper to remind the different Benches, that Collectors for the preparation of the Electoral Lists are to be appointed not later than the first June next, and that the Lists are to be completed between the first and the twenty-eighth day of June in all Electoral Districts, except the City of Sydney, wherein they are to be prepared by the twenty-fifth of June.

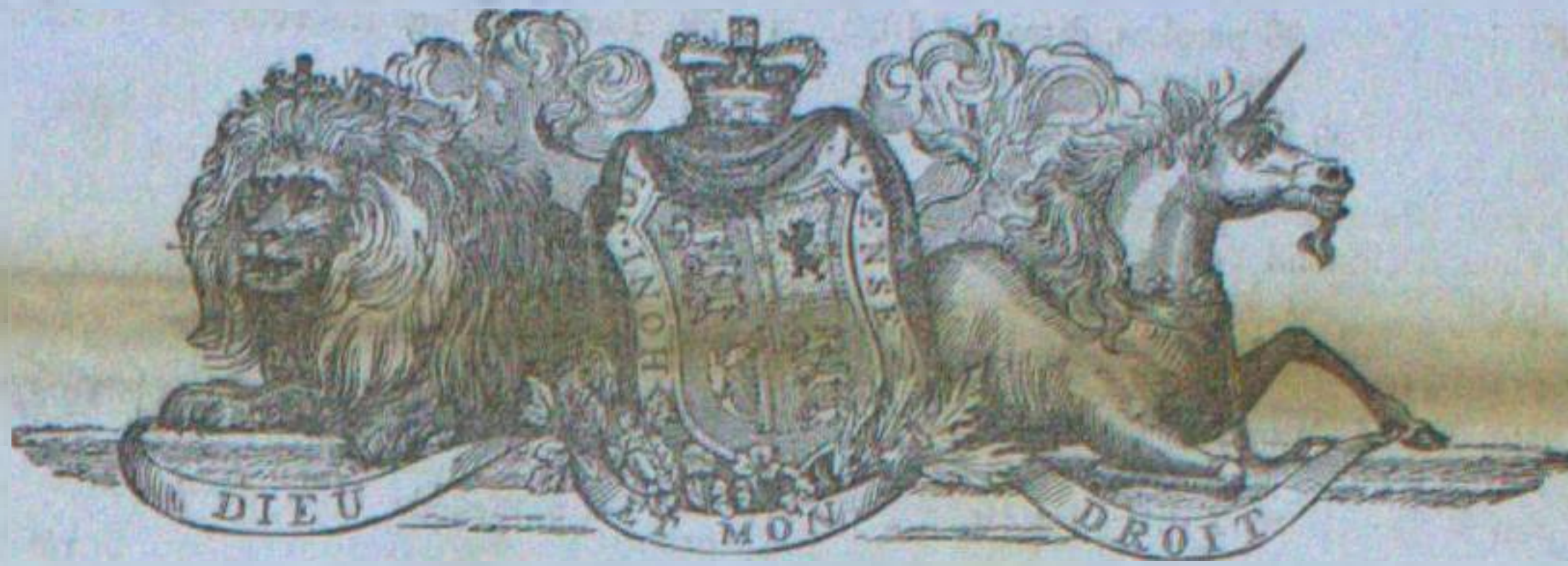

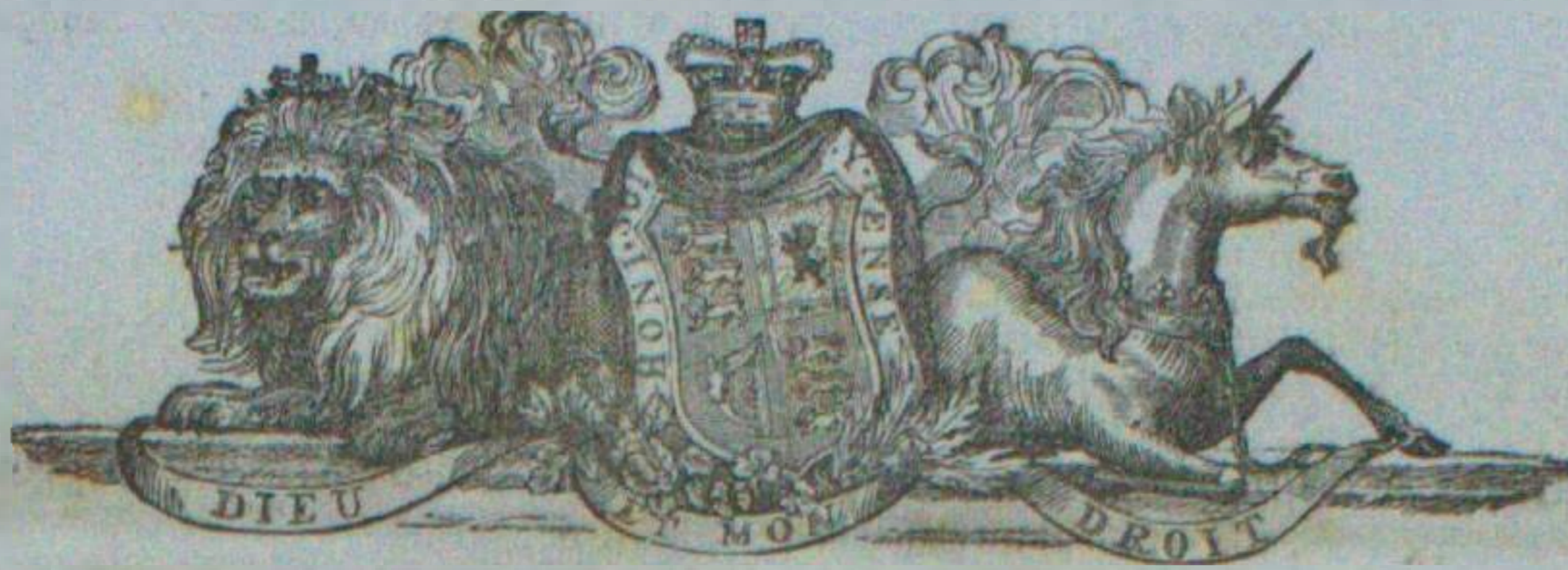

By His Excellency Sir CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, passed in the second year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and numbered two, for regulating the Police in certain towns and for removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions, and for the better alignment of streets therein, it was amongst other things enacted, that whenever the Governor or Acting Governor for the time being, of New South Wales, should deem it expedient to extend the said Act to any Towns in the said Colony, in addition to those specially named therein, it should and might be lawful for the said Governor or Acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me, by the said recited Act, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby direct that the provisions of the said Act, as amended by a certain other Act of Council, passed in the eleventh year of Her said Majesty's said Majesty, and numbered forty-four, be extended to the town of Orange, in the County of Wallington.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-ninth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and in the seventeenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
