By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS on the 13th day of March now last past a Writ was issued by the Honorable the Speaker of the Legislative Council in Her Majesty's name, addressed to David Cannon M'Connel, Esquire, Returning Officer for the Electoral District of Stanley, commanding the said Returning Officer to cause an Election to be held for the return of a Member to serve in the said Legislative Council for the said Electoral District in the room of John Richardson, Esq., who had before then resigned his seat in the said Council; and that he, the said Returning Officer, should cause the nomination for such Election to be held at North Brisbane on the 24th day of April then next, and that in the event of such Election being contested, he should cause the Poll at the different Polling-places for the said District to be taken on the 28th day of the said month of April, and that he should certify under his hand by endorsement on the said Writ the name of the Member who should be so elected, and that he should cause the said Writ, so endorsed, to be returned to the Honorable the Speaker of the Legislative Council on the 25th day of May then next.

And whereas, in consequence of the absence from the Colony of the said Returning Officer, disabling him from acting at the said election, I, the Governor aforesaid, did appoint Thomas Prior, Esquire, to act in the stead of such Returning Officer at such election: And whereas on the said twenty-fourth day of April in the said Writ mentioned, the Rev. John Dunmore Lang and Arthur Hodgson, Esquire, were duly nominated as candidates for election, in pursuance of the said Writ: Whereupon, and upon a show of hands having been made in favour of one of such candidates, a poll was demanded by the other of such candidates: And whereas on

the Twenty-eighth day of April in the said Writ mentioned, a poll was taken at two of the polling places for the said electoral district, but no poll was taken at Drayton, the remaining polling place for such district on the said day, by reason of the absence therefrom of the Deputy Returning Officer appointed for that place; And whereas the poll was taken under the said Writ at Drayton aforesaid on a subsequent day, that is to say, on the Twenty-third day of May now last: And whereas the said Thomas Prior, as such Acting Returning Officer as aforesaid, after the taking of the last mentioned poll, found the votes to be equal for the said two candidates, and thereupon decided by his casting vote that the said Arthur Hodgson should be the candidate elected to serve in the Legislative Council in the room of the said John Richardson: And whereas the said Thomas Prior has returned the said Writ to the said Speaker of the Legislative Council with the name of the said Arthur Hodgson endorsed thereon as the name of the person duly elected under the said writ, but such return was not made until the seventeenth day of this present month of June; and whereas the said several matters above mentioned have been brought under my consideration and that of my Executive Council. Now I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, the Governor General and Governor aforesaid, do in pursuance of the authority in that behalf vested in me by "The Electoral Act of 1851," in so far as the said authority or any other authority in me vested may extend, by this my Proclamation declare the said Election of the said Arthur Hodgson to be a valid Election under the said writ.

POSTAGE ON LETTERS AND PACKETS
TO AND FROM VICTORIA.

WHEREAS it was enacted by the 14th clause of the Act of Council 15th of Victoria, No. 12, that arrangements might be made between the Government of this Colony and that of Victoria, for the mutual exemption from further postage of all Letters or Packets upon which the established rates had been prepaid in either Colony, provided that the postage chargeable in Victoria on Letters and Packets addressed to towns and places within this Colony should not exceed the rates established in New South Wales: And whereas by a recent Act of the Legislature of Victoria the rates of postage chargeable in that Colony have been considerably augmented; Notice is hereby given, that the arrangements made in pursuance of the first recited enactment is necessarily no longer in force.

Ship Letters or Packets, therefore, to or from Victoria, will, from and after the 1st of July next, be chargeable with the usual Ship Rates.

Letters or Packets to or from Victoria, transmitted overland, will bear the usual Inland Postage to or from the boundary of the Colony, but in order to be forwarded by that Route, they must be marked "Per Overland Mail."

All Letters or Packets posted for the Colony of Victoria, which may be insufficiently stamped, will in consequence, from and after the 1st of July next, be opened and returned to the writers in accordance with the Postage Act 15th Victoria, No. 12.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by my Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, the crossing of the river Murray or Hume, at the Town of Albury, where the road from Sydney to Melbourne meets that river, is appointed to be a place at which a Ferry should be established, and at which Tolls should be collected to the amount and under the Regulations, Restrictions, and Provisions of an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for repealing so much of an Act intituled 'An Act to continue, until further provision shall be made, certain Duties, Tolls, Rates, Fees, or other sums of Money imposed by the Governor of New South Wales, and for other purposes as relates to the levying of Tolls in New South Wales, and for raising a fund towards making, repairing, and upholding Public Roads, Bridges, and Ferries, and for regulating the collection of Tolls thereon:" And whereas by another Act of the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen

Victoria, intituled, "An Act to authorise the leasing of Tolls and Dues demandable at Turnpike Gates and Ferries, and on Parish Roads, for extended terms," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by any Proclamation to be issued by him, to raise, diminish, alter, or vary any Tolls imposed at any Ferry established in pursuance of the provisions of the first recited Act: Now, therefore, I, the Governor General do, with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony, hereby order and direct that the charge to be levied for the passage over the said Ferry at Albury of oxen, shall be at the rate of one shilling each, instead of sixpence, the present price; the several other items in the scale fixed for that Ferry by my Proclamation of the 18th October, 1853, remaining unchanged.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for repealing so much of an Act intituled, " "An Act to continue until further provision shall be made, certain Duties, Tolls, Rates, Fees, or other sums of money imposed by the Governor of New South Wales, and for other purposes as relates to the levying of Tolls in New South Wales, and for raising a fund towards making, repairing, and upholding Public Roads, Bridges, and Ferries, and for regulating the collection of Tolls thereon," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, for the time being, by any Proclamation or Proclamations under his hand, from time to time to appoint places at which Tolls shall be collected, and to cause the same to be collected upon any line of road, which has been, or shall be wholly and partly made, and which is repaired at the public expense; and to cause Toll to be collected at any Bridge built, purchased, or repaired at the public expense, and at any Ferry, constructed, or upheld at the same, and to cause such gates, bars, chains, rails, and fences, to be built and set up, as shall be deemed necessary for preventing, passengers, beasts, and carriages from passing, unless there shall be then paid such Toll as shall be due or demandable under the authority of the said recited Act: And whereas it has become necessary to appoint a place on the road from Morpeth passing through E. Close's 2000 acres, the Maitland Town Reserve, and John Smith's 640 acres, to the high road from Maitland to Newcastle, for the purposes of the said recited Act: Now, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me, by the said recited Law or Ordinance, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby appoint a site at or near the boundary of Mr. E. Close's land, to be a place at which a Turnpike Gate shall be established, and at which Tolls shall be collected, to the amount, and under the regulations, restrictions, and provisions of the said recited Act, or Ordinance, of which Turnpike Gate all persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice.

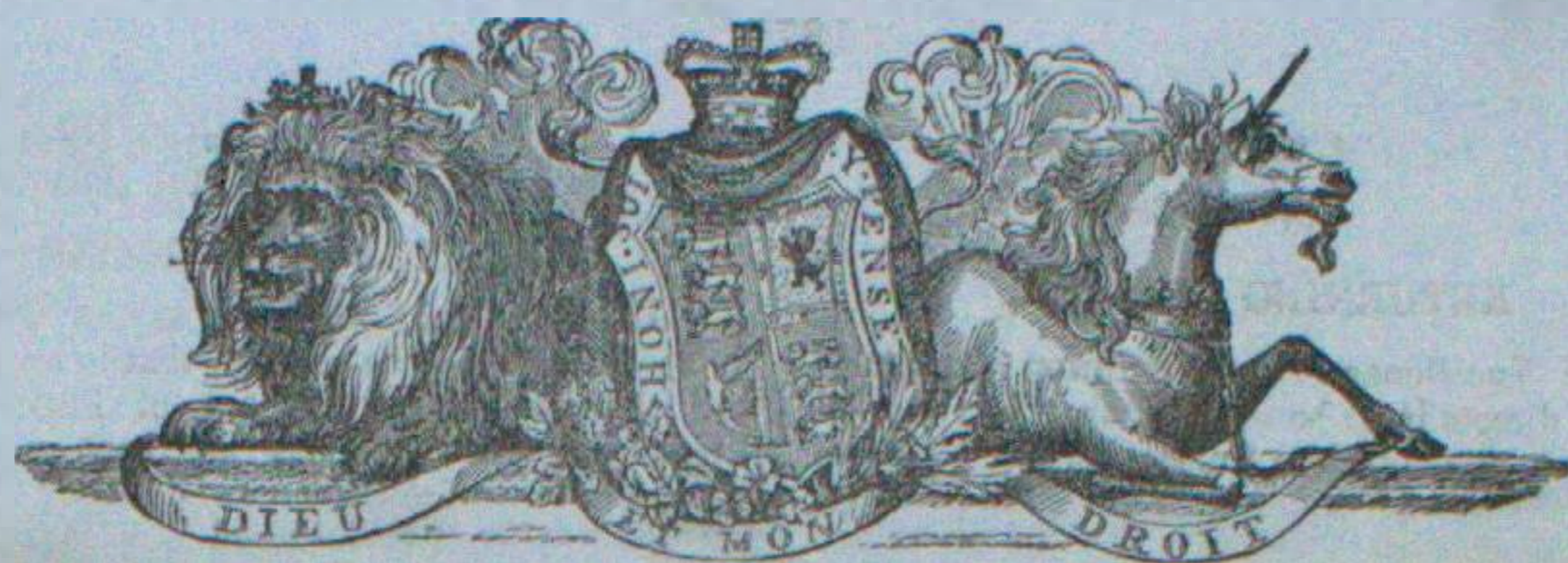
