Proclamation by His Excellency the Right Honorable Charles Robert, Baron Carrington, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

Whereas the Parliament of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the eighth day of April proximo: Now, I, Charles Robert, Baron Carrington, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Parliament to Tuesday, the twenty-ninth day of April next; and I do hereby further announce and proclaim that the said Parliament shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid twenty-ninth day of April next, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the buildings known as the Council Chambers, situate in Macquarie-street, in the city of Sydney; and the members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and scal, at Government House, Sydney, this twentyfifth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and in the fifty-third year of her Majesty's reign.

#### PUBLIC STATUTES OF THE SESSION.

#### FOURTEENTH PARLIAMENT.—THIRD SESSION.

APPROPRIATION ACT (54 VIC. No. 32)-

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the Year 1891, and for the Year 1890 and previous Years. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. McMillan, 19 December, 1890. Assented to, 20 December, 1890.]

Berry Municipal District Naming Act (54 Vic. No. 23)—
An Act to alter the name of the Municipal District of Broughton Creek and Bomaderry.
[Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Morton, 13 August, 1890. Assented to, 4 December, 1890.]

BOARD OF WATER SUPPLY AND SEWERAGE OFFICES ERECTION ACT (54 VIC. No. 22)-

An Act to sanction the erection of Offices for the accommodation of the Board of Water Supply and Sewerage. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Bruce Smith, 9 October, 1890. Assented to, 26 November, 1890.]

BOOK PURCHASERS PROTECTION ACT (54 VIC. No. 12)-

An Act to protect the purchasers of certain Books and other Publications. [Initiated in the Council by Mr. Creed, 18 June, 1890. Assented to, 25 September, 1890.]

CENSUS AND INDUSTRIAL RETURNS ACT (54 VIC. No. 31)-

An Act to make provision for taking the Census of New South Wales in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and for obtaining certain Industrial, Commercial, and other Statistics, and certain particulars relating to the Live Stock, Crops, and Occupation of Land in and for the said Colony, and for other purposes in connection with the aforesaid objects. [Initiated in the Assembly by Sir Henry Parkes, 4 December, 1890. Assented to, 20 December, 1890.]

CIRCULAR QUAY LAND ACT (54 VIC. No. 24)-

An Act to declare certain portions of land fronting the Circular Quay to be vested in the Colonial Treasurer for the time-being, to provide for the dedication of such lands or any portion thereof to wharfage and other public purposes, and for the formation of a street in lieu of the street now known as Queen-street. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. McMillan, 8 October, 1890. Assented to, 10 December, 1890.]

Consolidated Revenue Fund Act (54 Vic. No. 19)-

An Act to apply certain Sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales, for Services to be hereafter provided for by Loan. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. McMillan, 26 September, 1890. Assented to, 7 October, 1890.]

CONSTITUTION ACT AMENDMENT ACT (54 Vic. No. 1)-

An Act to reduce the proportion of members of the Legislative Council required to form a quorum. [Initiated in the Council by Mr. W. H. Suttor, 15 May, 1890. Assented to, 10 July, 1890.]

COOTAMUNDRA TO TEMORA RAILWAY ACT (54 VIC. No. 14)-

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Cootamundra to Temora. [Ini in the Assembly by Mr. Bruce Smith, 9 July, 1890. Assented to, 25 September, 1890.] [Initiated

COWRA BRIDGE ACT (54 VIC. No. 6)-

An Act to sanction the erection of a bridge over the Lachlan River at Cowra. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Bruce Smith, 9 July, 1890. Assented to, 26 August, 1890.]

CROWN RENTS ACT (54 Vic. No. 11)-

An Act to give certainty as to the proper amounts payable to the Crown as rents and license fees under the Crown Lands Act of 1884; to permit the determination thereof to be made by the Land Court in certain cases; to provide for the adjustment of accounts and for staying and limiting the effect of litigation in connection with the rents and license fees under the said act; and to further amend the law in respect thereof. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Brunker, 31 July, 1890. Assented to, 19 September, 1890.]

CULCAIRN TO COROWA RAILWAY (54 VIC. No. 3)-

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Culcairn to Corowa. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Bruce Smith, 3 July, 1890. Assented to, 6 August, 1890.]




