FOURTEENTH PARLIAMENT—FOURTH SESSION.

(Gazette, No. 252.)

Proclamation by His Excellency the Right Honorable VICTOR ALBERT GEORGE, EARL OF JERSEY, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

WHEREAS the Parliament of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the twenty-eighth day of April instant: Now, I, VICTOR ALBERT GEORGE, EARL OF JERSEY, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Parliament to Tuesday, the nineteenth day of May now next ensuing; and I do hereby further announce and proclaim that the said Parliament shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid nineteenth day of May next, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the buildings known as the Council Chambers, situate in Macquarie-street, in the city of Sydney; and the members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal, at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-first day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and in the fifty-fourth year of her Majesty's reign.
