AMBULANCE TRANSPORT SERVICE ACT (GEO. V. No. 5, 1919) -

An Act to make better provision for rendering first aid to, and for the transport of sick and injured persons, and for that purpose to establish a board with certain powers and duties; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. D. Storey, 10 September, 1919. Assented to, 10 November, 1919.]

APPROPRIATION ACT (GEO. V, No. '2, '1919)-
