PUBLIC STATUTES OF THE SESSION.

TWENTY-SIXTH PARLIAMENT—SECOND SESSION.

APPROPRIATION ACT (GEO. V, No. 17, 1922)-

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1922, to the 30th day of June, 1923 (inclusive of both dates); to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer," 1921-22, Consolidated Revenue Fund, for supplementary charges during the period from the 1st day of July, 1921, to the 30th day of June, 1922 (inclusive of both dates); to cover payments "Unauthorised in Suspense," Consolidated Revenue Fund, for urgent claims on account of services of the year 1921-22; to provide for Public Works and other services out of the Public Works Fund; and to provide for services out of the Closer Settlement Fund; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Cocks, 14 September, 1922. Assented to 2 November, 1922.]

ARMIDALE WATER SUPPLY ACT (GEO. V, No. 32, 1922)-

An Act to sanction the carrying out of certain works to augment the water supply of the Municipality of Armidale; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Ball, 7 September, 1922. Assented to 24 November, 1922.]

BIRDS AND ANIMALS PROTECTION (AMENDMENT) ACT (No. 2) (GEO. V, No. 37, 1922)—

An Act to amend the Birds and Animals Protection Act, 1918, in certain respects. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Oakes, 16 November, 1922. Assented to 28 November, 1922.]

BORDER RAILWAYS ACT (GEO. V, No. 16, 1922)-

An Act to ratify and provide for carrying out an agreement between the States of New South Wales and Victoria respecting the construction, maintenance, and operation of certain lines of railway from the State of Victoria into the State of New South Wales, the construction and maintenance of certain bridges over the River Murray, and other Works; to amend the Public Works Act, 1912, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Ball, 27 September, 1922. Assented to 26 October, 1922.]

BOTANY ROAD TRUST (CONSTITUTION) ACT (GEO. V, No. 41, 1922)-

An Act to establish a Botany Road Trust for the purpose of the reconstruction and maintenance of the Botany-road; to amend the Local Government Act, 1919, and certain other Acts; to make certain grants from the Consolidated Revenue Fund in aid of the Botany Road Trust, and to confer certain powers thereupon; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Fitzpatrick, I November, 1922. Assented to 29 November, 1922.]

CABRAMATTA PARK ACT (GEO. V, No. 35, 1922)-

An Act to authorise the Registrar-General to register a certain transfer from the Public Trustee to the Council of the Municipality of Cabramatta and Canley Vale of certain land for a public park; to declare the powers and duties of the council with regard thereto; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. Sir Joseph Carruthers, 9 November, 1922. Assented to 28 November, 1922.]

COAL-MINES REGULATION (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 11, 1922)-

An Act to amend the Coal-mines Regulation Act, 1912, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Fitzpatrick, 3 August, 1922. Assented to 28 September, 1922.]

COUNTRY TOWNS WATER SUPPLY AND SEWERAGE (REDUCTION OF DEBTS) ACT (GEO. V, No. 27, 1922)—

An Act to reduce the debts of the councils of certain municipalities in respect of works of water supply or sewerage; to vest certain waterworks in the Minister for Public Works, and to authorise him to carry on such works or to sell same; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Ball, 24 October, 1922.]

DAVID MORRIS REVESTING ACT (GEO. V. No. 38, 1922)-

An Act to declare certain land resumed for an irrigation settlement at Penrith to be vested in David Morris notwithstanding a certain notification of resumption; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Wearne, 15 November, 1922. Assented to 28 November, 1922.]

EIGHT HOURS (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 8, 1922) --

Real Estate and Stock Agents Bill: An amendment to amend the order of leave to include all commission agents in the City of Sydney could not be accepted, as the Governor's message referred to all real estate agents in the State, 645.

South Coast Towns Transmission Line Bill: An amendment to alter the route of line was out of order, because it would increase the burden on the Crown, 1075.

Casual Vacancies, Filling of: The matter referred to in a motion for adjournment to discuss the filling of casual vacancies might fairly be said to be embraced in a notice of motion for leave to introduce a bill to provide for the filling of casual vacancies; but under new Standing Order 110A, in determining the question of anticipation the Speaker was required to have regard to the probability of the matter anticipated being brought before the House within a reasonable time. the assurance of the Premier that there was a probability of the notice of motion coming before the House within a reasonable time the Speaker was bound to rule the motion for adjournment out of order, 3684.

Eight Hours (Amendment) Bill: A motion that the Minister, who was speaking in reply, "be not further heard" could not be accepted in view of the fact that the House had a few minutes before negatived a similar motion, 863, 864. A point of order that the bill was beyond the order of leave could not be entertained at the stage of the motion for the adoption of the report of the Committee upon the consideration of the Legislative Council's amendments, 1561; motion of dissent from foregoing ruling, obs. 1641.

Female Employees' Basic Wage: A motion for adjournment to discuss the lowering of the basic wage for woman workers was out of order, seeing that the Estimates were before the House, and the matter might be discussed within a reasonable time, 2404. A motion for adjournment to discuss the same matter after the Estimates had been disposed of could not be permitted to be moved because an opportunity had been afforded to discuss it on the Estimates, 2934.

High School Fees: The question of urgency and public importance in connection with a motion for adjournment under standing order 49 was not a matter for the Speaker; the fact of five hon, members rising in their places alone decided the question, 1256.

Immigration and Land Settlement: A motion for adjournment to discuss immigration and land settlement was out of order, because such motions must be restricted to a single specific matter of recent occurrence, and the motion did not comply with this requirement,

Newcastle Tramway Electrification: motion for adjournment to discuss the loss sustained owing to the failure of the Government to proceed with the electrification of the Newcastle tramways, was not out of order on the ground that the question could be discussed when the Estimates were before the House; the Estimates had not yet been laid on the table of the House, 1643; the debate must be restricted to the subject of the motion, which was a specific matter of recent occurrence, and could not be allowed to range over the loss sustained by the State for a long time, owing to the tramways not having been electrified, 1645.

New Northern State: On a motion for the creating of a new State in the northern portion of New South Wales, it was not competent to move an amendment striking out the original proposition and substituting one for the remodelling of the Commonwealth Constitution to enable the Federal Parliament to delegate certain powers of government, 1610. The objection that the amendment was not relevant to the original motion also applied to an amendment affirming the desirability of
