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*Forty-four Hours Week Bill*: It was not necessary, in the case of amendments of which notice had been given in writing by a Minister under standing order 175*b*, for such amendments to be proposed by the Minister, 3176.

*Industrial Arbitration (Amendment) Bill*: An amendment to alter the title to the "Industrial Conscription Act" would clearly make the bill unintelligible and was out of order, 1750; with a view to effectively carrying out standing order 175*b* all amendments circulated by the Minister within the terms of the standing order would be put as one question; all the remaining clauses and schedules would also be put as one question. This procedure would be in accordance with the practice in the House of Representatives under a similar standing order, 1838, 1869. If an amendment was consequential upon amendments made by the Council it could be admitted when such amendments were being considered, 4390; an amendment to rectify an obvious omission and not necessarily consequential upon amendments made by the Legislative Council could be accepted under standing order, 284, 4394.

*Legislative Councillors Bill*: The question of conserving titles was not within the scope of the bill which conserved parliamentary privileges. Parliament could not confer a title on anyone, 4311.

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*Widows' Pensions Bill*: An amendment to change the title of the bill to Mothers' Pensions Bill was moved in a spirit of mockery and could not be accepted, 2797; an amendment which would increase the area of expenditure under the bill was clearly out of order, 2807, 2907.

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*Arbitration Court Administration* : *Obs.*, 1869.  
*Attempt to Corrupt Labour Members* : Once the Estimates were placed on the table practically anything could be discussed on them. The "Attempt to corrupt Labour members," which was proposed to be made the subject of a motion of adjournment, could be so discussed on the Estimates, 3038 ; a motion of privilege could not be entertained ; the question of privilege should be raised only in cases of extreme urgency or when there was no opportunity of giving notice, 3042 ; see *Questions*, 3284.
