Calling of hon. members by Mr. Speaker: Press statement by hon. member for Drummoynes: An hon. member having had a difference with the Chair, there are two courses open to him to pursue. He can adopt the orthodox method of submitting a motion with a view to correcting the supposed improper action of the Chair, or he can resort to the mean, despicable and cowardly method of making a statement to the press. The hon. member descended to the latter course. The facts prove that the insinuation that the Chair treated him unfairly by displaying favouritism to others in giving the call is completely without foundation. The hon. member for Drummoynes is not entitled, under the guise of a personal explanation dealing with the incident, to traduce the chair by making gross mis-statements. Should the hon. member consider that the Chair has treated him unfairly his remedy lies in moving a motion censuring the Chair, 7711, 7719-22, 7764.

Censure Motion: It is not desirable that an hon. member, when addressing Mr. Speaker, should discuss the actions of Mr. Speaker when he was Minister for Health, 7445.

The implication that the Minister for Transport used money collected for relief of unemployment for a trip around the world is offensive and must be withdrawn, 7452.

If, in division, an hon. member conducts himself noisily, the division will be called off and the offending hon. member removed, 7501.

Child Welfare Bill: It is not competent for an hon. member to move an amendment that would impose upon the Crown an additional burden not contemplated by the message, 4329.

Coal-Mining Dispute: When answering a Ministerial statement an hon. member may traverse only the principles enunciated by the Minister when making the statement, and may not revert to history, 7910.

Conveyancing (Amendment) Bill: The use of the word "cowardly" is both unparliamentary and objectionable, 6419.

Emergency Relief Work Regulation: When speaking to a motion relating to a regulation which prevents an unemployed person from receiving emergency relief work unless he has been employed on such work during the previous six months, an hon. member is not entitled to discuss the subject of immigration, 609.

Emergency Relief Work Regulation: A motion being directed to the alteration or withdrawal of a regulation which prevents an unemployed person from receiving emergency relief work unless he has been employed on emergency relief works during the previous six months, and the Minister having informed the House that during an adjournment of the debate the regulation had been amended as to period, further debate is out of order, 1286.

Fire Commissioners Employees, Working Hours, q, 5784.

Food Relief Scales: The "other causes" referred to in the motion having been debated on three previous occasions, Mr. Speaker ruled that only matters resulting entirely from war conditions should be discussed, 7972.

Hansard, Publication: It would be undesirable to delay the return of Thursday's *Hansard* proofs till the following Tuesday, as that would not permit of their publication until the following Wednesday, 6803, 6897.

Industrial Arbitration (Amendment) Bill: An hon. member may not suggest that another hon. member has deliberately deceived anybody. Obs. 4804.

Industrial Arbitration Bill: The bill being a consolidating measure, can be amended only if it is shown to be not a true or effective consolidation, 7542.

Standing Orders do not provide that, because the certificate or explanatory note to a bill may be considered by some hon. members to be inadequate, it shall not be acceptable to the Legislative Chamber. It is for the House to determine whether a certificate is satisfactory or not, 7548.

Justices (Amendment) Bill:

At the second reading stage of a bill it is not competent for a Minister or private member to discuss the measure clause by clause. At that stage its fundamental principles only may be debated, 7941.

Legislative Council, may not be referred to in debate, 6530.

Legislative Council Elections: The hon. member for Hornsby, being accused by the hon. member for Wagga Wagga of having made a statement to the press which, as reported, contained a reflection upon the honour of members of Parliament, and Mr. Speaker having been asked to invite the hon. member for Hornsby to substantiate his statement in the House, Mr. Speaker replied that the rules of Parliament permitted the making of such a statement, but he would be glad if the hon. member for Hornsby would choose to substantiate the remarks attributed to him, q, 6809, adj., 6882.

Life Assurance Companies; War Premiums: As the motion relates to a specific case a general debate on other questions cannot be permitted, 6333.

The regulations, having been nullified by the Legislative Council, were non-existent and Mr. Deputy Speaker had acted rightly in declining to accept an amendment to regulations that did not exist, 8272.

Milk Board (Member's Term of Office) Bill: When addressing himself to a bill relating specifically to one member of the Milk Board, an hon. member may not discuss the whole administration of that Board, 5301.

Prices of Bricks: Although a notice of motion for the introduction of legislation may not specifically refer to the subject of a motion by a private member, if the Premier or Minister has stated that the bill, when introduced, will give power to deal with that subject, the motion of urgency is out of order on the ground that it anticipates discussion on the motion for leave to bring in the bill, 3015.

Parliament, Conduct; Newspaper Statements: It was grossly untruthful and unworthy of the Press to state that hon. members, instead of attending to their legislative duties, were listening to broadcast race results. The action of the Press borders on breach of privilege. If such action is extended it may be necessary for the Speaker to exercise his prerogative in regard to liberty of the Press in the Legislative Assembly, q., 5833.

Personal Explanation; Disallowed Question: A question that has been asked and disallowed does not appear in the official report, therefore an hon. member may not make a personal explanation in respect of statements contained in such a question, 8262.

Public Works (Amendment) Bill: As the bill does not revoke any action in connection with any railway, but merely validates certain measures taken by the department of the resumption of land, it is not in order to review the rights or wrongs of the Public Works Committee, 5808, 5810.

Questions Without Notice: Shall be brief, concise and of an urgent nature. Questions not of specific urgency, and those

embodiment statistics and lengthy references shall be placed on the business paper, 4658, 5779, 5977.

When asking questions, hon. members may not quote newspaper articles as facts, obs. 4661, 4961, 7770.

Hon. members must remain silent while questions are being asked, obs., 5010.

An hon. member is not in order in reading from a circular when asking questions, obs., 5043.

An hon. member having disregarded the direction of the Chair, the Minister is asked to answer only that portion of the hon. member's utterance which may be regarded as a question, obs., 6089.

An hon. member must not impart information when asking a question, 6569, 6572.

A Minister, when answering questions, must be heard without interruption, 6760.

The fact that the premises of a question may be entirely wrong does not preclude an hon. member's asking it, 7765.

Questions virtually of a domestic character should not be asked in the House, but should be the subject of direct communication with the department concerned. This practice obtains also in Queensland and New Zealand, 7913.

Pairs, Official Recording of: In November, 1923, the Standing Orders Committee formed the opinion that it was not desirable to provide for the official recording of pairs. If hon. members so desire, the question may again be referred to the Standing Orders Committee, 6808, 6897.

Railway Employees, Annual Leave: It is not in order to propose an amendment to an earlier part of a question after an amendment has been proposed to a later part. Also, an amendment must be consistent with the subject matter of the motion, 4791-2.

Railway Retrenchments: Disorderly conduct leaves an hon. member open to two methods of correction, removal from the Chamber or naming, obs., 5935.

Regulations, Standing Committee: An hon. member may not speak more than once to the same question, 5757.

Revocation of State Forests: It would be laborious and unnecessary to put *seriatim* sixty-four items, many of them of minor importance, when dealing with one revocation of dedication resolution. Commonsense must prevail in such matters, obs., 4691.

Standing Orders, Reference to Committee: On a motion that the whole of the Standing Orders be referred to the Standing Orders Committee for consideration and report it is not open to an hon. member to debate all the Standing Orders individually, 354.

State Finances; Urgency Motion: An hon. member must confine his remarks to the matter of urgency, and may not discuss the merits of the case, 5904.

Acceptance of motion by the Premier as a motion of censure does not entitle an hon. member to range over the whole political gamut, 5656, 5659.

The Chair never has personal feelings and, in accepting an apology by an hon. member, is actuated only by a desire to maintain the dignity of Parliament, 5675.

The proceedings of an unfinished inquiry by a Parliamentary Select Committee are not *sub judice* and an hon. member who acquired information from listening to the evidence given before such a committee cannot properly be prevented from repeating what he heard or thinks he heard, 7509.
