ADVANCES TO SETTLERS AMENDMENT ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 106)—

An Act to amend the Advances to Settlers Acts. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Crick, 2 December, 1902. Assented to, 22 December, 1902.]

AGREEMENTS VALIDATING ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 58)—

An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to the validity of agreements made elsewhere for personal service in New South Wales. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. B. R. Wise, 25 June, 1902. Assented to, 4 September, 1902.]

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 45)—

*An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to the vesting of certain land in the Agricultural Society of New South Wales, subject to certain conditions, and the suspension of all rights of common in respect of such land. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. B. R. Wise, 25 June, 1902. Assented to, 21 August, 1902.]

APPRAISEMENT ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 109)—

An Act to amend the Acts relating to Crown lands; to provide for the appraisal of conditional purchases and conditional leases and homestead selections, and for the payments to be made and conditions to be performed in respect thereof; and for other purposes incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Crick, 5 December, 1902. Assented to, 22 December, 1902.]

APPROPRIATION ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 105)—

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1902, to the 30th day of June, 1903, inclusive of both dates, and to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1901-1902," for supplementary charges during the period from 1st July, 1901, to 30th June, 1902, inclusive of both dates; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Waddell, 16 December, 1902. Assented to, 20 December, 1902.]

ARBITRATION ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 29)—

An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to arbitration. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. B. R. Wise, 25 June, 1902. Assented to, 16 August, 1902.]

ARREST ON MESNE PROCESS ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 24)—

An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to arrest on mesne process. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. B. R. Wise, 25 June, 1902. Assented to, 31 July, 1902.]

AUDIT ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 26)—

An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the collection and payment of the public moneys, the audit of the public accounts, and the protection and recovery of public property; and for other purposes connected with the control and management of the public finances of the State of New South Wales. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Waddell, 19 June, 1902. Assented to, 14 August, 1902.]

AUSTRALIAN MUSEUM ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 61)—

An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to the incorporation and endowment of the Australian Museum. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. B. R. Wise, 25 June, 1902. Assented to, 4 September, 1902.]

BALRANALD IRRIGATION ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 78)—

An Act to consolidate enactments relating to the conservation and utilisation of water for irrigation for the municipality of Balranald. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. B. R. Wise, 25 June, 1902. Assented to, 15 September, 1902.]

BENEVOLENT SOCIETY OF NEW SOUTH WALES ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 97)—

An Act to incorporate and otherwise promote the objects of the Benevolent Society of New South Wales. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. Sir Arthur Renwick, 11 June, 1902. Assented to, 12 December, 1902.]

BILLIARDS AND BAGATELLE ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 38)—

An Act to consolidate the enactments for regulating the keeping of billiard tables and bagatelle boards. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. B. R. Wise, 25 June, 1902. Assented to, 20 August, 1902.]

BOGAN GATE TO BULBODNEY RAILWAY ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 88)—

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Bogan Gate to Bulbodney; to amend the Public Works Act, 1900, so far as it relates to the duty of the constructing authority to make and maintain fences along the said line; to authorise the construction of the said line on public roads; to provide for the imposition of a tax on certain lands in connection with such line; and for other purposes. CITY OF SYDNEY STREETS LOAN ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 113)—

An Act to enable the municipal council of Sydney to raise by debentures a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate one hundred thousand pounds, for the woodblocking of public ways within the city of Sydney; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Sir John See, 18 December, 1902. Assented to, 24 December, 1902.]

COAL-MINES REGULATION ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 73)—

An Act to consolidate enactments relating to the regulation of coal-mines and collieries. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. B. R. Wise, 25 June, 1902. Assented to, 9 September, 1902.]

COBAR TO WILCANNIA RAILWAY ACT (2 ED. VII NO. 85)—
