An Act to sanction the carrying out of a scheme of sewerage for the Municipality of Albury ; and for purposes consequent thereupon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, 16 December, 1910. Assented to, 22 December, 1910.]

APPROPRIATION ACT (1 GEO. V No. 44)—
