WHEAT MARKETING BILL (*Further considered*):—

Clause 2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires:—

Definitions

"Board" means State Wheat Board appointed under this Act.

"Minister" means Minister of Agriculture.

"Mortgage" includes pledge, charge, trust, lien (including any lien on crops under the Liens on Crops and Wool and Stock Mortgages Act, 1898), or other incumbrance affecting wheat, and any contract entered into by the owner of wheat in derogation of his title thereto.

"Prescribed" means prescribed by this Act or by any regulation made thereunder.

"Wheat" means—

- (a) wheat which is or shall be harvested in New South Wales during the season 1921-1922, and is not the subject of inter-state trade, commerce, or intercourse; and
- (b) wheat, and the gristing products of wheat not harvested in New South Wales during the season 1921-1922, which is or shall be in New South Wales, and is not the subject of inter-state trade, commerce, or intercourse, and is not subject to the control of the customs. [*Read.*]

## SAME BILL.

Clause 3. (1) (a) The Governor shall, as soon as practicable after the passing of this Act, appoint a board of five persons, three of whom shall be wheat-growers and one of whom shall be the Minister, who shall be chairman of the board.

(b) The board shall be called the State Wheat Board and, subject to the approval of the Minister, shall have the powers and perform the duties conferred and imposed upon it by this Act. The members of such board shall be paid such remuneration as the Governor shall think fit.

(c) Upon the appointment of the board the State Wheat Board appointed under the Wheat Marketing Act, 1920, shall be dissolved, and the assets, rights, liabilities, powers, and functions of the said board shall be vested in the board appointed under this Act.

(d) Any three members of the board shall be a quorum, and, subject to this section, shall have all the powers and authority conferred upon the board by this Act.

(e) In case of the illness or absence of any member of the board, the Governor may appoint a deputy to act for such member during his illness or absence; and every such deputy shall, while so acting, have all the powers and carry out all the duties of such member.

(f) If at any meeting of the board from which the Minister is absent the members present differ in opinion upon any matter, and are equally divided thereon, such difference of opinion shall be forthwith reported to the Minister, who may postpone the determination of such matter to a meeting at which he is present.

(g) The board shall cause minutes of its proceedings and decisions to be kept, and a copy of the minutes of any meeting from which the Minister is absent shall be forwarded to him forthwith after the close of such meeting.

(2) The board may appoint such officers and agents as it may think necessary for the purposes of this Act, and such officers and agents shall be paid such salaries, commission, and allowances as are fixed by the board, and shall not be subject to the provisions of the Public Service Acts. [*Read.*]

Clause 3. General rule forty-three of section fifty-four of the Principal Act is omitted and the following general rules are inserted in lieu thereof:

*Rule 43.* Suitable sanitary conveniences shall be provided underground in every mine wherever a group of four or more persons is employed; and the pattern, situation, and mode of cleansing such conveniences shall be to the satisfaction of an inspector and every such convenience shall be kept in a sanitary condition, and shall be removed and emptied not less than twice in each week. The position of every place of convenience shall be agreed upon by "the" inspector of the district and the check inspector and shall be indicated by having the roof and sides regularly coated with lime-washing.

*Rule 44.* (a) The owner, agent, or manager shall provide above ground and near to the principal entrance of the mine (but not in the engine-house or boiler-house) sufficient change houses and baths to enable the persons employed in or about the mine to change and dry their clothes and wash themselves, and so that there shall be one bath for every four persons ordinarily employed at the mine, with separate accommodation for youths under the age of nineteen years.

COAL-MINES REGULATION (AMENDMENT) BILL (*continues*):—

(b) The plans and specifications of the change-houses and baths to be erected shall be furnished by the owner, agent, or manager for the approval of the inspector of the district and of a check inspector appointed by the persons employed in or about the mine to act with the said inspector: Provided that if the inspector and the check inspector, or either of them, give notice of approval subject to certain conditions, or disapproval for reasons indicated, and the owner, agent, or manager, declines to remedy the matter complained of in such notice, reference shall be made to the chief inspector, whose decision shall be binding on the owner, agent, or manager.

(c) Such change-houses shall be supplied with hot and cold water, and while in use the temperature in every such house shall be maintained at not less than seventy-six degrees Fahrenheit, and suitable apparatus to be approved as aforesaid shall be provided for drying clothes.

(d) If it is proved to the satisfaction of the chief inspector (before whom both the employers and employees shall be entitled to appear) that an adequate water supply cannot be obtained, or that owing to the configuration of the land in the vicinity of any mine a suitable site for a change-house cannot be found except at a prohibitive cost provided, however, that where it is mutually agreed between the owner, agent, or manager and the representative of the union of the employees, the Minister may grant exemption from the operation of this rule, in respect of such mine. [*Read.*]
