NURSES' REGISTRATION (AMENDMENT) BILL:—

Clause 1 having been dealt with,—

Clause 2. (1) The Principal Act is amended by inserting at the end of sub-section one of section seventeen the following words:—

Such general expenses may include a fee of two guineas per meeting attended to each of the members of the board appointed in pursuance of paragraphs (c), (d), and (e) of subsection one of section three, or to fill an extraordinary vacancy on the board, but no member shall receive by way of fees more than one hundred pounds in any one financial year. (Fees and expenses.)

(2) Any moneys paid by way of fees to members of the Nurses' Registration Board for meetings since the commencement of this Act out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund shall be recouped to that fund out of the funds of the said board. [Read.]

PROVISIONS RELATING TO UNEMPLOYMENT RELIEF TAX AT THE RATES DECLARED BY THE UNEMPLOYMENT RELIEF TAX ACT, 1932.

24B. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act unemployment relief tax at the rates declared by the Unemployment Relief Tax Act, 1932, shall be paid to the Commissioner in respect of—

- (a) the net assessable income derived by any person other than a company during the income year ending upon the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two (or such other period as may be accepted by the Commissioner under the provisions of the Income Tax Management Act, 1928, as amended by subsequent Acts, in lieu thereof);
- (b) the net assessable income derived by every company during the income year ending on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two (or such other period as may be accepted by the Commissioner under the provisions of the Income Tax Management Act, 1928, as amended by subsequent Acts, in lieu thereof);

Further amendment Act No. 34, 1930
New Part IVb.

Incidence of tax.

- (c) income from employment derived by every person other than a company during the income year commencing on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

- (b) one shilling in the pound of the net assessable income derived by every company during the income year ending on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two (or such other period as may be accepted by the Commissioner under the provisions of the Income Tax Management Act, 1928, as amended by subsequent Acts, in lieu thereof);
- (c) one shilling in the pound of the income from employment derived by every person other than a company during the income year commencing on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.
