(2) While a member of the governing body of a registered club, or the secretary of a registered club, knows that another person is a former key official, the club must not:

- (c) employ the former key official in any capacity; or
- (d) knowingly have, directly or indirectly, any business or financial association with, or any business or financial interest in any matter in conjunction with, the former key official. 5

- (f) call for and consider submissions from the public on the draft report; and
- (g) oversee the production of and referee the final report produced by the Director under subsection (3) and the recommendations in the report for an expanded reserve system in the region.

(3) The final report prepared by the Director in connection with sections 4 and 5 shall be made public in June 1995.

Commencement of Division

38FA. This Division does not have effect until:

- (a) 31 July 1994; or
- (b) the date on which the Federal Court, the Trade Practices Commission and the Trade Practices Tribunal are, by a Commonwealth law, permitted to exercise the jurisdiction, powers and functions conferred on them under the restrictive trade practices laws for the purposes of this Division,

whichever is the later.

Definitions

38FB. In this Division:

“conduct” has the same meaning as in the restrictive trade practices laws;

“professional association” means the Bar Association, the Bar Council, the Law Society, the Law Society Council or any other association of legal practitioners;

“restrictive trade practices laws”—see section 38FC.

Application of restrictive trade practices laws

38FC. (1) The restrictive trade practices laws apply as a law of the State to the conduct of legal practitioners and of any professional association in connection with the provision of legal services.

(2) For the purposes of this Division, the restrictive trade practices laws are the provisions of the Trade Practices Act 1974 of the Commonwealth (and the regulations made under that Act), as amended and in force from time to time and as modified by this section.

(3) The provisions referred to in subsection (2) are modified for the purposes of this Division as follows:

- (a) references to corporations include legal practitioners and professional associations (whether incorporated or not);

- (b) references to interstate trade or commerce include the provision of legal services by legal practitioners (including legal services supplied only within the State);
- (c) section 51 (1) (Exceptions) does not apply to acts or things specifically authorised or approved by barristers rules, solicitors rules, joint rules or the conditions of practising certificates;
- (d) the provisions of Part 5 and any provisions relating only to goods do not apply.

The regulations under this Act may make other modifications of those provisions.

(4) The Acts Interpretation Act 1901 of the Commonwealth applies to the interpretation of the restrictive trade practices laws.

Exercise of jurisdiction and powers by Federal Court and by Trade Practices Commission and Tribunal

38FD. (1) The Federal Court has, for the purposes of this Division only, the jurisdiction and powers conferred on it by the restrictive trade practices laws.

(2) The Trade Practices Commission and the Trade Practices Tribunal may, for the purposes of this Division only, exercise the powers and functions conferred on them by the restrictive trade practices laws.

(3) This section has effect to the extent that the Federal Court, the Trade Practices Commission and the Trade Practices Tribunal are permitted by Commonwealth law to exercise that jurisdiction and those powers and functions for the purposes of this Division.

Exceptions

38FE. (1) This Division does not apply to any conduct exempted from this Division by the regulations.

(2) Before any such regulation is made, the Attorney General must certify to the Governor that:

- (a) he or she has consulted with the Trade Practices Commission, the Advisory Council, the Bar Council and the Law Society Council on the proposed regulation; and
- (b) the public benefit of any conduct proposed to be exempted outweighs the detriment to the public constituted by any lessening of competition that would result from the proposed conduct.

(3) Nothing in this Division affects:

- (a) practice as a barrister as the holder of a statutory office under the Crown (whether in right of New South Wales or in another right); or
- (b) practice as parliamentary counsel under a contract of service, or contract for service, with the Crown (whether in right of New South Wales or in another right).

PART 3—CONSEQUENCES OF RESTRUCTURING SCHEME

Other relief

14. (1) Claims against the Crown and others extinguished. The Crown, FANMAC, the FANMAC trustee and a co-operative housing society, including any persons acting on their behalf, are not subject to any action, liability, claim or demand (and a determination may not be made) in respect of: 30

- (a) any HomeFund mortgage; or 35
- (b) any transaction relating to, preliminary to or arising from any HomeFund mortgage; or
- (c) the promotion, origination or management of any HomeFund mortgage or HomeFund scheme.

(2) Restricted determinations may be made. The HomeFund Commissioner may however make a determination under the HomeFund Commissioner Act 1993 about a complaint or part of a complaint by a HomeFund borrower who is eligible to participate in the restructuring scheme, or a former HomeFund borrower who has refinanced a HomeFund mortgage, but may do so only if the determination relates to a complaint or part of a complaint listed in Schedule 2 or specified in the regulations.

(3) **Limit on type of relief.** The Commissioner may not, in making such a determination, make a determination referred to in section 25 (3) (a), (b) or (c) of the HomeFund Commissioner Act 1993, which relate to altering mortgages and entering into new mortgages.

(4) **Statutory remedies.** Subsection (1) extends to, but is not limited to, claims under the Contracts Review Act 1980, the Consumer Claims Tribunals Act 1987 or the Fair Trading Act 1987.

HOMEFUND RESTRUCTURING BILL:

Consideration of Legislative Council amendments.

With the leave of the Committee the Chairman proposed the amendments in two groups.

Motion made (*Ms Machin*) and Question put,—That the Legislative Council amendments Nos 4, 8, 17 and 18 be agreed to.

The amendments—

No. 4 Page 6, clause 15. After line 15, insert:

(5) Rights of protected borrowers (other than rights to determinations). This section does not affect the rights (other than the right to have a determination made) of a person:

- (a) who is categorised as Category C or D, as set out in Schedule 1, unless and until the person receives assistance of a kind set out in Category B or C; or
- (b) who has ceased to be a HomeFund borrower (otherwise than by means of refinancing) and has not been granted assistance under the restructuring scheme.

(6) Rights of protected borrowers to determinations. This section does not affect the rights to have a determination made under the HomeFund Commissioner Act 1993 of a person who is categorised as Category B, C or D as set out in Schedule 1, unless and until the person receives assistance of a kind set out in Category B.

(7) Rights of protected borrowers who have left the HomeFund scheme to determinations. This section does not affect the rights to have a determination made under the HomeFund Commissioner Act 1993 of a person who has ceased to be a HomeFund borrower (otherwise than by means of refinancing) and has not been granted assistance under the restructuring scheme.

(8) Payment of money payable under a determinations. The HomeFund Commissioner may, in making a determination that an amount of money is payable to a person who is categorised as Category B, as set out in Schedule 1, require that the money is paid in reduction of the debt under the HomeFund mortgage.

(9) Other relief to be taken into account. Any determination made by the HomeFund Commissioner in favour of a HomeFund borrower must have due regard to any assistance that has been granted to the person, or to which the person is entitled or for which the person is eligible, under the restructuring scheme.
