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- He would not rule the motion "That this House regards as a grave breach of privilege the action of the Royal Commissioner inquiring into the adequacy of Members' and Ministers' salaries, in issuing to Members of this House subpoenas requiring their attendance before the Commission under threat of penalties for contempt of court," out of order on the ground that it sought to throw upon Members the duty of creating privileges, as while it was the duty of the Speaker to decide whether a matter was one of privilege it was the duty of the House to decide whether the privileges of the House had been invaded or not, 141.
