Gazette an association specified in such proclamation which has been formed under the Co-operation Act, 1923-1945, the component societies of which are trading societies formed under Division 3 of Part, II of the Co-operation Act, 1923-1945, for the object of carrying on the industry of fishing, shall sell fish in any fish market established under Part XIII of the Sydney Corporation Act, 19321942.
(b) (i) by inserting at the end of subsection one of section $40_{\mathrm{B}}$ the Sec 40 B . words "or canned, smoked or cured fish";"
(ii) by inserting next, after subsection three of the same section the following new sulsections:-
(3A) Subsection one of this section shall not apply to and in respect of any sale of fish made by any person who, immediately before the seventeenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and forty-five, maintained and operated in the Metropolitan Fish Supply District any depot for the purpose of receiving, handing, storing, selling and distributing fish and who hoids a permit in writing granted by the Minister under this subsection, which permit the Minister is herebs authorised to grant. Any such permit shall be subject to such terms and conditions as the Minister thinks fit, including terms and conditions as to quantitics and species of fish to be sold or distributed from any such depot and the persons to whom such fish is to be so sold or distributed. so sold or distributed.
(33) The Minister may be notice in writing given to the holder of any consent or permit issued under this section-
(a) cancel or suspend ans such consent, or permit for ans breach of the terms or conditions thereof; or
(b) vary or amend any terms or conditions thereof.
(iii) by omitting from subsection four of the same section the word "fifty" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "threc hundred";

(6) This section shall not apply to and in respect of any fish (not being fish taken under the authority of a license issued under section twenty-three, section twenty-four or section twentyfive of this Act) which is delivered by any person otherwise than on sale.
(7) In any proceedings for an offence against this section or section 40 B of this Act the allegation in the information that-
(a) any fish have been delivered to any place other than the market for the district in or into which such fish were taken landed or brought or to any person other than a person authorised pursuant to section 40 of this Act to sell fish in the market in that district; or
(b) the delivery of any fish was accepted by any person; or
(c) any fish have not first been brought to and sold in the market in the district;
shall be prima facie evidence of the facts alleged.

(c) One of such members shall in and by the instrument Ohairman. by which he is appointed be the chairman of the Authority and another of such members shall in and by the instrument by which he is appointed be the deputy chairman of the Authority.
(d) (i) One of the members shall be an engineer having special knowledge of the generation, transmission and supply of electricity;
(ii) two of the members shall be members of 2 council;
(iii) one of the members shall be the manager, general manager, electrical engineer or person in charge of the electricity undertaking of a council; and
(iv) one of the members slall be a person appointed to represent the interests of employees engaged in the electrical industry.

Provided that of the two members appointed under subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph one shall be a member of a Council within the Conaty of Cumberland, and one a member of a Council outside the County of Cumberland.

(iv) one member shall be nominated by Councils whose areas are wholly within a zone to be defined by Regulations north of the County of Cumberland; and
(v) one member shall be nominated by Councils whose areas are wholly within a zone to be defined by Regulations south of the County of Cumberland.
(e) The method, of nomination shall be prescribed by Regulations but the nomination of a person other than a member of a Council shall not be precluded.
(f) Should the Councils within the several zones referred to, or in any of them, fail within a period to be specified by the Minister to nominate a member or members to represent them on the Authority, the Minister shall then have power to appoint a member or members to represent any or all of those zones so failing; provided, however, that any person or persons so appointed by the Minister shall be from the zone or zones which have failed to make nominations within the period specified by him for the making of such nominations."

(9) In any decision given by the Commission under subsection eight of this section the holder of the license or the owner or accupier of the intervening lands may within twenty-eight days of the notification of such decision lodge an objection in writing with the Commission setting out the grounds of such objection, and the Commission shall direct the local land board or a police magistrate to hold a public inquiry into the matter.

The holding of the inquiry shall be notified once in the Gazette and once in a newspaper published and circulating in the district where the work covered by the license or authority is situated.

The Commission and all persons whose interests appear to be affected by any matter the subject of the inquiry by the local land board or police magistrate shall be permitted to attend at the inquiry and be heard in support of, or in opposition to, the matter.

The local land board or police magistrate, as the case may be, holding the inquiry shall announce its or his decision in open court and shall thereupon report in writing upon the inquiry to the Commission.
(10) Where an inquiry is held under this section the Commission or the holder of the license or authority, or any person so interested as aforesaid may, within twenty-eight days from the announcement of the decision as provided for in subsection nine of this section appeal to the Land and Valuation Court against the decision of the local land board or police magistrate. The decision of the said Court shall be final.

The appeal shall be made as prescribed by rules of court of the Land and Valuation Court and be accompanied by a fee of five pounds and security for the costs of the appeal. Notice of appeal in the prescribed form shall be given by the appellant to the Commission upon the lodging of the appeal in the Iand and Valuation Court.

(b) Subject to this Act, every person who after the commencement of, this Act ceases to be a member of the Legislative Assembly and who has been a member of the Legislative Assembly in any three Parliaments but does not possess the qualification specified in paragraph (a) of this subsection shall be entitled to be paid out of the fund a pension at the rate of five pounds per week.

The three Parliaments referred to in this paragraph may include any Parliament or Parliaments held before the commencement of this Act as well as the current Parliament, and any future Parliament or Parliaments.

A person shall be deemed to have been a member of the Legislative Assembly in a Parliament if he has been a member of the Legislative Assembly during any portion of the term of that Parliament.
(2) (a) Where at any time before the dissolution of a Parliament or its expiration by effluxion of time, a person ceases to be a member of the Legislative Assembly otherwise than by death, and, at a by-election held to fill the vacancy so occasioned, he does not become a candidate for election, he shall not be entitled to receive any pension under paragraph (b) of, subsection one of this section unless the managing trustees or a majority of them in their absolute discretion, upon application made for the purpose, are satisfied that there were good and sufficient reasons for his failure to become a candidate at such by-election.
(b) Where a person-
(i) resigns his seat in the Legislative Assembly;
(ii) notifies the Speaker in the instrument of resignation addressed to the Speaker that his resignation is for the purpose of enabling him to seek election for the Parliament of the Commonwealth at an election which is to be held within three months after the date of such resignation; and
(iii) becomes a candidate for election for the Parliament of the Commonwealth at the election referred to in the last preceding sub-paragraph; and
(iv) is elected at such election
and such person would have been entitled if paragraph (a) of this subsection had not been enacted, and he had not been elected to the Parliament of the Commonwealth, to receive a pension under this section upon so resigning his seat in the Legisiative Assembly, he shall on and from the date upon which he ceases to be a member of the Parliament of the Commonwealth, but subject to the provisions of this section, be entitled to receive such pension.
(c) Where a person ceases to be a member of the Legislative Assembly by reason of the dissolution of Parliament or its expiry by effluxion of time and does not become a candidate for election at the general election next ensuing on such dissolution or expiry he shall not be entitled to receive any pension under paragraph (b) of subsection one of this section unless the managing trustees or a majority of them in their absolute discretion, upon application made for the purpose, are satisfied that there were good and sufficient reasons for his failure to become a candidate at such general election.
