(4) An acting chairman or an acting member, as the case may be, shall have and may exercise and discharge all the powers, authorities, duties and functions of the chairman or member in whose place he acts.

(5) Where the exercise or performance of a power, authority, duty or function is dependent upon the opinion, belief or state of mind of the Board and that power, authority, duty or function has been delegated under this section the power, authority, duty or function so delegated may be exercised or performed under the delegation upon the opinion, belief or state of mind (as the case may require) of the delegate
(6) Notwithstanding any delegation made under this section the Board may continue to excrcise or perform all or any of the powers, authorities, duties or functions delegated.
