- (d) four persons, of whom one has been so elected by each faculty that the Council has, not less than one month before the closing of nominations for the election of those persons, determined to be one of the four principal faculties within the University.

For the purposes of this subsection "graduate" means person whose name appears on the list, prepared in accordance with the by-laws, of graduate electors.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection one of this section a Court or justices shall have jurisdiction in any proceedings referred to in that subsection notwithstanding that a statutory declaration has not been filed as referred to in that subsection and that a notice referred to in that subsection has not been served where the person taking the proceedings alleged in the notice to quit or demand of possession that—

- (a) the rent has remained unpaid in respect of a period of not less than twenty-eight days; or
- (b) the tenant has failed to perform or observe some term or condition of the lease and the performance or observance of that term or condition has not been waived or excused by the landlord,

but the Court or justices shall not adjudge the landlord entitled to possession of the land unless it is or they are satisfied that the ground specified in the allegation has been established.

2F. In this Act, "excluded premises" means any premises that—

- (a) immediately before the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine, were prescribed premises within the meaning of the Landlord and Tenant (Amendment) Act, 1948, as subsequently amended, and were subject to the provisions of Part III of that Act, as so amended; and
- (b) ceased on that day to be prescribed premises within the meaning of that Act, as so amended and as amended by the Landlord and Tenant (Amendment) Act, 1968.

218F. (1) The chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Meetings Grants Commission and in addition to a deliberative vote and shall, in the event of an equality of votes, have a second or procedure. casting vote.

(2) The chairman and two other members of the Grants Commission shall form a quorum.

(3) The procedure for the calling of meetings of the Grants Commission and for the conduct of business thereat shall, except as may be from time to time prescribed, be as determined by the Grants Commission.

218G. (1) The Grants Commission-

- (a) shall consider the needs of areas for assistance from for assistance. moneys available in the Assistance Fund; and
- (b) may consider the desirability of making any grant or contribution from moneys available in the Assistance Fund to any body of persons, incorporate or unincor-porate (in this Part referred to as a "body"), for such purposes, beneficial to local government generally, as the Grants Commission thinks fit.

- (a) at such times as the Minister directs ; and

but in any case it shall meet at least once in each year.

(3) The Grants Commission may require the production by the council of any area of any information which may, in the opinion of the Grants Commission, assist it in any consideration referred to in subsection one of this section.

(4) At least once in each year, or at such times as the Minister directs, the Grants Commission shall, after completion of such considerations referred to in subsection one of this section as it thinks necessary or desirable, submit to the Minister proposals for the disbursement of moneys available in the Assistance Fund.

(5) The Minister may-

*

- (a) approve of any proposal referred to in subsection four of this section; or
- (b) refer any such proposal back to the Grants Commission for further consideration.

218H. (1) As soon as practicable after the Minister approves Determina-any proposal under section 218g of this Act, the Grants Com- tion of mission shall determine the amounts to be paid to individual amounts to councils or bodies. councils or bodies.

(3) Any power, authority, duty or function, the exercise or performance of which has been delegated under this section to a member of the Board or an officer may while the delegation remains unrevoked be exercised or performed from time to time in accordance with the terms of the delegation by that member or officer or the person for the time being acting in the place of that member or officer.

(4) A delegation made under this section may be made subject to such conditions or such limitations as to the exercise or performance of any of the specified powers, authorities, duties or functions delegated or as to time or circumstances as may be specified in the instrument of delegation.

(5) Where the exercise or performance of a power, authority, duty or function is dependent upon the opinion, belief or state of mind of the Board and that power, authority, duty or function has been delegated under this section the power, authority, duty or function so delegated may be exercised or performed under the delegation upon the opinion, belief or state of mind (as the case may require) of the delegate.

(6) Notwithstanding any delegation made under this section the Board may continue to exercise or perform all or any of the powers, authorities, duties or functions delegated.

(7) Any act or thing done or suffered by the delegate when acting in the exercise of the delegation and within the terms of the delegation shall have the like force and effect as if the act or thing had been done or suffered by the Board.
