And each such grant of any of the said portions of land to any such persons or corporation shall be in full satisfaction and compensation for any losses whatsoever sustained by such persons whether in their own right or derivatively by reason of the reclamation of the land or any portion thereof described in the Schedule to the "Woolloomooloo Bay Land Reclamation Act of 1862" and shall operate as an extinguishment of any right title claim easement or interest of or belonging to the owners and of any persons claiming through or in trust for them or any of them of any land so severed from contact with the waters of Port Jackson as aforesaid and as compensation for which severances the aforesaid portions of land are hereby authorized to be granted respectively. COMMISSIONERS FOR AFFIDAVITS BILL.

(Recommitted for re-consideration of Clauses 1 and 2.)

Chief Justice to have power to appoint Com-missioners for taking Affidavits in New South Wates.

Persona wilfully swearing falsely in affidavits guilty of per-jury.

Provision as to existing Com-missions.

Clause 1. "All Justices of the Peace for the Territory shall have power to take and receive affidavits in all matters pending in the Supreme Court or in any Court or Courts and" the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court for the time being shall have power by one or more Commission or Commissions under the seal of the said Court to authorize as many persons as he may think commissions under the seal of the said Court to authorize as many persons as he may think necessary to take and receive affidavits concerning any matter within the jurisdiction of any Court or Courts. And every person wilfully swearing or affirming falsely in any affidavit to be made before any person who shall be so authorized to take affidavits shall be deemed guilty of perjury and shall incur and be liable to the same pains and penalties as if such person had wilfully sworn or affirmed falsely in open Court in any judicial proceeding in the Supreme Court. Provided that nothing herein shall be held to invalidate or require the renewal of any Commission already issued by any Chief Justice for taking Affidavits but the same are hereby confirmed and declared to be and to have been valid. (Read.)

Amendment proposed,—To omit the words "All Justices of the Peace for the Territory shall

have power to take and receive affidavits in all matters pending in the Supreme Court or in any Court or Courts and," lines I and 2. (Mr. Allen.)

MUNICIPALITIES ACT OF 1867 AMENDMENT BILL OF 1874.

Clause 3. Notwitstanding the provisions of the Principal Act every person now or hereafter to be elected mayor of a Borough or Municipal District shall (although his term of office as alderman shall have expired) continue to hold office as mayor until the election of his successor and shall preside at all meetings of the Council holden in pursuance of the said Act for the election of such successor and shall have power to adjourn any meeting in the absence of a quorum—And for the purposes of such election the mayor shall if he shall have ecased to be an alderman have and exercise (in cases where an equal number of votes shall be given in favour of any two or more candidates) a easting but not an original vote-but-if-ho shall then held office as alderman he shall be entitled to an original as well as a casting vote Provided that in case any person on elected or to be elected mayor as aforesaid chall-die or become subject to any of the disqualifications mentioned in the thirty seventh section of the Principal Act and his office as mayor be thereby vacated it shall be lawful for such person as the Governor may appoint to act us roturning officer for the purpose of holding any such election-with power to pacting vote only and to adjourn any meeting at which a quorum chall not be precent And for the purposes of such election the mayor shall (if he shall have ceased to be an alderman) have a casting vote only but if his term of office as alderman shall not have expired such mayor shall have and exercise an original but not a casting vote And in case the mayor of any Municipality shall die or become subject to any of the disqualifications mentioned in the thirty-seventh section of the Principal Act and his office as mayor be thereby vacated it shall be lawful for the Governor (if he shall think it expedient so to do) to appoint any one of the aldermen of such Municipality or such other person as he may think fit to preside as chairman at any meeting of the Council for the election of a mayor called in pursuance of the provisions of the Principal Act And such chairman (if he shall not be an alderman) shall have and exercise a casting vote only but if he shall hold office as alderman he shall be entitled to an original but not to a casting vote and shall have power in either case to adjourn any meeting at which a quorum shall not be present Provided that where an equal number of votes shall before the passing of this Act have been or be hereafter given for any two or more candidates it shall be determined by lot which of such candidates shall be declared to have been elected as mayor. (Read.)

"(1.) That this House "approves of" the following Conditions of Agreement for the construction of a Telegraph Cable hetween New Zealand and New South Wales, and one between Normantown, in Queensland, and Singapore, as agreed upon by the Representatives of the Colonies of New Zealand, Queensland, and New South Wales, in Sydney, on the 14th February, 1873; and "empowers the Government to enter into a Contract in conjunction with the other Governments "remed upon the terms therein stated for the purpose of corrying out this undertaking." " named, upon the terms therein stated, for the purpose of carrying out this undertaking :-

' Agreement. 'THE following Conditions for the construction of a Telegraph Cable between New Zealand and New South Wales, and one between Normantown, in Queensland, and Singapore, are those which the Representatives of New South Wales, New Zealand, and Queensland agree to recommend their Governments to submit for the approval of their respective Parliaments:

'1. The three Colonies shall jointly enter into an arrangement for the construction of an electric cable to be laid between some point in New Zealand and some point in ' New South Wales, and also a cable to be laid from Normantown, in Queensland, to Singapore, the latter to be a through cable touching only at such points as may be agreed on, "and to be entirely distinct the whole distance from the line between Port Darwin and Singapore."

"2. The arrangement to be for a guarantee of five per cent. for a term not exceeding thirty-five years," upon a sum not exceeding one million pounds for the cost of the two lines. £1,000,000.

3. Twelve thousand pounds per annum to be allowed, to cover in full all expenses. £12,000.

All receipts above twelve thousand pounds to pass in reduction of the guarantee. The £12,000 contractors to retain receipts in excess of the guarantee; but if the profits are more than 10 per cent. the Governments may require that the rates shall be lowered to amounts calculated to reduce the profits to the per cent.

calculated to reduce the profits to ten per cent.

'4. The guarantee to be paid only whilst the lines are in working order: Provided that four weeks in each year will be allowed for repairs. If the New Zealand line only be in order, one-third of the guarantee to be paid; if the Singapore line only be in order, two-thirds of the guarantee to be paid. If the lines are not kept in order with due diligence, or if communication should permanently fail, the guarantee to cease.

5. The two lines to be commenced and constructed simultaneously.

'6. The cost per message of twenty words, from New Zealand to New South Wales, 15s. 'not to exceed fifteen shillings; the charge for each word above twenty being nine-pence. 40s. 'And the cost for twenty words from Normantown to Singapore not to exceed forty shillings sage for the first two years, and thirty-five shillings afterwards; the charge for each word above 2s.

'7. Queensland to undertake to keep the land line to Normantown open for the use 7s. of the other contributing Colonies at rates not to exceed at any time seven shillings for twenty 20. 'words.

'8. The three Governments to act in unison, and to jointly arrange the details.

'9. This Agreement, after being approved of by the respective Governments, to be subject to ratification by the respective Parliaments; and the details to be arranged in

'London by representatives appointed by the three Colonies.

'10. The Governments will require to be satisfied that the contractors have made proper provision for the use of a through line of communication between Singapore and London.


